FYI - Michigan has passed new laws, effective next spring, regarding personal water craft (wave runners). Minimum age to operate a runner will be 14, those under 19 will be required to pass safety courses and be licensed before hitting the water. Reckless riding will be not be permitted. Those over 19 who are caught operating personal water craft recklessly, under the influence or ignore other bill provisions will be required to go through the education program and be certified for future rides. Reckless operation carries misdemeanor penalties of 30 days in jail and up to a \$1000 fine on the first offense. Three or more violations in a five year period carries a 90 day jail sentence and up to \$2000 in fines. For additional information, see article published in the Elkhart Truth, June 13.

BLYC Regatta Kidz⁸⁸


The presesson culminates with another Regatta for kids - Sunday June 28th. We will have a pre-race gathering at 1:00 pm (rules & refreshments), then hit the water for a 2:00 pm start. The course will be set short for the race(s). Everyone is welcome, any boat class with one request -- you've gatta have a kid on board. Last year there were several kids who took the initiative to talk a sailor into dragging his boat off the shore to come out & sail. If you have a boat, find a kid (ask them to help you get your boat in the water). If you are a kid looking for a ride, pester someone who has a boat to enter & help them rig their boat.

The rules are few, but let's be careful out there & have the right life saving devices on board. I love the way the Scott Troeger family refers to a PFD as a "boat coat", kind of makes a life jacket sound more fun! Another item of note is the change in rules pertaining to Sunfish Registration. The prior rules left the Sunfish in the class which did not require Registration (by size & method of propulsion). Per the new Michigan Boating Guide, page 2, a sailboat of any size must be registered. Let's send the state \$16.75 (3 year, 12-16 foot) & comply with the new rules ...

A bit of boating history:



In 1945, Alex Bryan & Cortland Heyniger, boyhood friends & World War II vets, founded the Alcort Company to build iceboats for their native New England lakes. In pursuit of summer business, they installed a sail on what became known as a boardboat to create the Sailfish, which was featured in a 1948 *Life* magazine spread. In the early '50s, with a broader beam (for stability) & the addition of a cockpit (for comfort), the craft became the Sunfish, one of the worlds most popular sailboats. The original wooden Sunfish could be purchased as a kit, or pre-built. No one can remember when, but the boat soon was made of fiberglass, an out-of-the-box boat that could be rigged & ready in an hour. With an estimated 250,000 sold over the last four decades, the Sunfish has introduced several generations to the pure joy of sailing. Drag those hulls down to the shore & come out on the water!



Mildred (Wentworth) Gollatz, formerly of the Cove, died May 23rd of this year. Mildred and her husband Starr Wentworth began coming to Birch Lake in 1946 when there were only a handful of cottages in the Cove. They loved spending their summers here, and didn't sell their cottage until 1984 when Starr's failing health made it necessary for them to do so. Mildred was the mother of Shirley (Wentworth) Blue (Birch Lake E. Side), and Dennis Wentworth of Las Vegas, as well as the grandmother of Dawn (Blue) Troyer (Birch Lake E. Side), and Lisa (Blue) Sychowski of Palatine, Il.

HISTORY OF BIRCH LAKE

Long ages ago, millions of years in the past, the region where Pirch Lake now lies was deep under a tropical sea. After the sea receaed, the land which emerges was the home of the reptilian and mammal age. Some 2500 years or more ago, great sheets of ice, a mile in thickness, swept down from the northeast, prowing and gouging the surface of the land.

Polably primitive man lived here before the ice came. He may have been the Polable man as Folsom points, believed to be spearheads, have been picked up in Cass County. Shortly after the ice left, man came again, the forefathers of the Indians.

The first Indians in this section, as found by the early French explorers. were Miamis. Through a war council treaty, the Miami Indians, who were not a war like tribe, was replaced by the Chippewas, Potawatomies and the Ottowas, closely related, who with the exception of occasional wars lived in relative peace.

The crea around Birch Lake was held by the Potawatomie Indians, who were headed by rig Cr. of Pokagon and sub-chiefs Weesaw and Shavehead. The section of Birch Lake was under the rule of Chief Shavehead. While Pokagon was a very brilliant man, making friends of the white man, accepting his ways and teachings, Shavehead was the opposite. He was a large man for an Indian, very ugly and very mean, gaining his name by keeping his head shaved, which in no way improved his appearance. Shavehead's winter quarters were around Shavehead Lake and in the summer, he immigrated to what is now Mottsville where there was a ford across the St. Joe River. This ford was on the Sauk trail which is now modern U. S. Highway #112. Shavehead would camp at the ford and extract a fee from the white settlers for the use of the crossing. It is reported that he discontinued this practice only after a young burly settler had taken his ox whip and thrashed Shavehead within an inch of his life.

Shavehead was responsible for the deaths of many wnite settlers. He would promise to secure game for the white man but no one returned from the hunting trips but Chief Shavehead. Strangely enough Shavehead met his death the same= way. He was in the trading post which is now Cassopolis, drunk, and making his brags about participating in the Fort Dearborn massacre. He was overheard by a young trapper who had lost his wife and child in this debauchery. The young trapper was then living on the island in Diamond Lake. He asked Shavehead to go home with him. A shot was heard and Shavehead was never seen again.

The Indians under Chief Weesaw, whose winter quarters were in the vicinity of Newton's Woods joined Chief Shavehead's band in the early spring around Birch Lake where they bathed in the lake and drank the water of the lake, claiming the water had great healing power. It is recorded that Chief Pokagon who was ill made the journey from his home near Summerville for this purpose.

Settlement in Cass County was very slow; in 1840 the population was only 5710. Early settlers around the Birch Lake area were the Harveys, Merritts and O'Dells.

The decade previous to the Civil War was very exciting in the Birch Lake area. Sections of land in South Cass County had been purchased by Quakers for the purpose of setting up small farms for runaway slaves brought up through the underground railroad. Periodically, there would be a raid by southern slave owners to recover their property.

As the pure, clear water of Birch Lake was known to the Indians, it was destined to be known to the whites - before having any cottages, it was a popular fishing and camping lake. The quality of the fish caught in its waters was superb. The scenery was magnificent and as roads became passable, cottages began to be built on its shore. One of the first cottages, if not the first, was the Smith cottage. Today the lake has over 200 cottages with a summer population of over 650 people enjoying its sky-blue waters.

The people in charge of the selection of a site for the summer camp of South Bend Campfire Girls, after looking over many locations, chose Birch Lake as did the Elkhart YMCA for their summer camps. These camps are Camp Ki-Lo-Qu'a and Taumadoona.

People who have traveled near and far return with the statement that although there are many beauty spots in these United States, none surpass the charm and setting of our own beautiful Birch Lake.


