


FLEET NEWS






Year round - every season - your B.L.Y.C. Water Quality Committee has an on-going water quality maintenance program. Part of that program includes Septic System Maintenance. Before the summer season ends, please consider a recommendation from a Health Department Environmentalist to summer people: "Pump your septic tank at the end of every summer to give the system relief". Michigan Lakes & Streams Association recommends: "Initiate your own septic tank pumping program for pumping every 2 years".

Pumping prevents sludge from rising and going into the final disposal. It needs to be removed before it is allowed to fill the tank. If allowed to fill the tank, it will overflow into the disposal and cause a mal-functioning system which means that toilets and drains will back up, overflow and contaminate the area in the house.

The small cost for hiring a septic tank cleaning service is an insurance policy against an unwanted problem. It is a policy which you can renew at the end of every summer season or renew every 2 years. Which ever you choose will maintain an efficient septic system for YOU.
