HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION NEWS

A Complaint was filed with the MI Dept of Agriculture relating to the odor from fields above the landing hill. Subsequently, a meeting was held at Dean Davis home with Wayne Whitman, Program Manager, Lansing. Numerous residents were in attendance. Mr. Whitman examined the fields, met with the property owner and a number of corrective measures were prescribed. First, the "application" of hog barn manure will cease for the next two growing seasons as the fields in question are being put to crops. Next, the farmer who leases the land from the owner was reminded of the MI good farming practice methods (which should reduce the odor). Lastly is is hoped that the leasing farmer will choose other fields to enrich with future applications, if not, that injection equipment be used to put liquid manure underground (rather than on the surface). The Water Quality Committee was asked to pay special attention to the area noting any abnormalities. Homeowners Association will follow up to protect our Lake.

Have a problem with a neighbor's barking dog? Quite often the owner is not aware of the severity of the problem. So the first step is to bring the problem to your neighbor's attention. If that doesn't work, then more serious action can be taken:

- 1. Call Cass County Animal Control Dept at 445-3701 and they will send someone to investigate and issue a warning.
- If this action doesn't solve the problem, call again. A possible citation and fine will be issued.
- 3. If the problem continues after the citation, the owner of the dog could be issued a warrant for arrest. REMEMBER: TRY THE NEIGHBORLY APPROACH FIRST. IT USUALLY WORKS.

Officiating on the Committee Boat and occasionally dousing the sailors were Stan Pitakos, Jim Beck, Phil Vitale and Mike Spratt. I earned a new appreciation for the role and responsibilities of the starters by helping on the Committee Boat at the Diamond Lake MC Regatta last Saturday. There's a lot to do and keep track of to make a sailboat race run smoothly, and I wish again to express my gratitude to our starters who so generously devote their time so the sailors can chase each other around. The Diamond Lake Regatta was impressive, with 31 boats from different lakes contending. Some noteworthy items from that regatta were: (i) a boat that came in 1st or 2nd in one race might be close to last in the next race, and vice-versa; (ii) some very old boats beat some sparkling new ones; (iii) some very young sailors beat a lot of the old salts; and (iv) boats from other lakes such as Eagle did very well against the Diamond Lakers despite the "home course" advantage. I know I'm a little prejudiced in this case, but having watched our sailors and those contending in the Diamond Lake Regatta, I believe any of our regular MC sailors would have had a good chance to bring home a trophy had they participated.

The Fourth of July Regatta will be on Saturday, July 3 (11 a.m. Ind. time/12 m. Mich. time) and on Sunday, July 4 (2 p.m. Ind. time/ 3 p.m. Mich. time).

BOAT INSPECTIONS JULY 10

Cass County Marine Department Officers will conduct voluntary boat inspections at Birch Lake on Saturday, July 10, 1999 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. (Ind. time)/12 m. to 2 p.m. (Mich. time). Boats passing the inspection will receive a sticker to display. Items the officers will be looking for include: registration; appropriate type and number of life preservers (for boats over 16 feet, one PFD for each occupant of the boat plus one throwable flotation device); running lights; fire extinguisher and horn or other noise device. The inspections will take place at Sheryl Papandrea's pier (gray house, fourth to the East of the boat launch; look for the sheriff's boat).

BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATION COURSE JULY 24

Cass County Marine Department Officers will conduct a boating safety certification course on Saturday, July 24, 1999 at the BLYC clubhouse. The course is from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. (Ind. time)/8 a.m. to 2 p.m. (Mich. time). Those passing the course will receive a boating safety certificate. This certificate is needed for those between the ages of 12 and 16 to operate (with someone over age 16 present) boats of more than 6 horsepower. Michigan residents born after 1978 need this certificate to operate personal water craft (ie; waverunners). Beginning next year, this certificate will be needed by nonresidents of Michigan of any age in order for them to operate personal water craft. To register for the course, call the Cass County Sheriff's office at (616) 445 2481, and provide the student's name, date of birth and social security number. This information will enable the certificate to be available on the day of the class to those passing the course.

LEARN TO SAIL, OR LEARN TO SAIL BETTER.

Eagle Lake Sailing Club has a Summer Sailing Program for Persons 9 and Older.

Each session is taught for two weeks - three hours per day-Monday through Thursday; morning or afternoon classes; 9 a.m. to noon or 1 to 4 p.m. Taught on Eagle Lake by certified instructors. Boats provided by Eagle Lake Sailing Club; all you need is a swim suit and U.S. Coastguard approved lifejacket. Cost is \$150 per student.

The Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program is a cooperative venture between the Michigan Lake and Stream Associations, the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, and us, Michigan's citizen volunteer lake monitors. They view this cooperative venture as a partnership for Michigan's lakes, which they hope will continue to grow for many years ahead. We, the BLYC Water Quality Committee, filed an application in February, 1999 and mailed fit to MSSSA for participation in CLMP. Bob Temple is registered for the program as/Sampler #1, citizen volunteer for Birch Lake.

In April, 1999 Bob and Gertie Temple attended the 38th Assual Conference Program, MC&SA, Boyne Falls, MJ. Mr. Ralph Bednarz conducted the CLMA Training Session. Mr. Bednarz has been with the MDEQ since 1979, serving as an Aquatic Biologist, Environmental Chemist, Environmental Engineer (presently, Land & Water Management Specialist) his MS from MSU in Aquatic Chemistry, BS from U. of Jl. in Biological Science. At the CLMP Training Session, Bob (Temple received instructions, recording forms, equipment, etc. that are needed to carry out the testing assigned. — Mr. Bednarz, along with Donald Winne, Executive Director MC&SA, and Pearl Bonnell, Treasurer and Director Operations MC&SA, coordinate the CLMP. Ms. Diana Klemans is overseeing the CLMP.

In May, 1999 a letter was received from Diana Klemans. She earned a BS in Aquatic Ecology and an MS in water resources management; both from University of Michigan. The Annual Summary Report that she sent was prepared by Ralph Bednarz. It includes:

1) Summary of the Secchi disk transparency data for individual lakes that participated in the 1998 CLMP.

) Summary of spring overturn and late summer total phosphorus data collected by the volunteers who participated in the 1998 CLMP.

3) Results from the 40 lakes that participated to the chlorophyll monitoring pilot study. DEQ was pleased with the results and the chlorophyll monitoring study continued in 1999 with up to 60 lakes participating. The BLYC Water Quality Committee is pleased to be enrolled in, as Diana Klemans states in her letter, "one of the top volunteer monitoring programs in the nation today".

Pursuant to our discussion at the Michigan Lake and Stream Associations Annual Conference last month, I am sending you a copy of the 1998 Annual Summary Report for the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program (CLMP).

The CLMP is a premier volunteer/state partnership for monitoring water quality in Michigan's inland lakes. Michigan's volunteer lakes monitoring program has been in existence since 1974 which makes it the second oldest volunteer monitoring program for lakes in the nation. The CLMP remains one of the top volunteer monitoring programs in the nation today.

The CLMP is administered as a partnership between the Department of Environmental Quality and Michigan Lake and Stream Associations, Inc. The primary purpose of this cooperative program is to help citizen volunteers monitor indicators of trophic state, or lake productivity, in their lake and document changes in productivity over time. The basic indicators included in the program at this time are water clarity, as measured with a Secchi disk; the plant nutrient phosphorus; and the algal plant pigment chlorophyll.

The CLMP provides sampling methods, training, technical support, quality control, and laboratory assistance for volunteers to monitor their lake for these basic indicators of lake productivity. The volunteers may then classify their lake according to its level of productivity, using Carlson's Trophic State Index. Long-term monitoring of these parameters on a consistent and regular basis may provide the data needed to recognize changes or trends in lake productivity. By participating in the CLMP, you provide an annual check-up on your lake's health in terms of its productivity.
