LAKE NOTES

Lake Notes are compiled from local history publications including Birch Barkers and other newspaper archives

Quoted from 8/24/68 Elkhart Truth..."and probably the most distinctive is Birch Lake...The Lake waters are almost 100 percent mineral, which accounts for its historic reputation as a health spa. As with all the other large lakes in the area, its 300 acres are the site of vast and interesting folklore, dating back to the mid-1800's when the great Indian chief Pokagon and Shavehead gathered their tribes on its shores to bathe and drink of its waters. While Birch offers excellent swimming, ideal boating and fishing and therapeutic values, it also boasts Camps Kiloqua and Tannadoonah for Campfire Girls (Birch Barker 8/7/68

A number of people on the lake may be unaware that the Fish Club has been responsible for getting the lake stocked with 6,500 trout over a two year period. In the past, Birch Lake has received 3,000 fish every 3 years (Birch Barker 8/5/72)

Many people of Birch Lake will probably remember Mr. E.P."Grandpa" Purdy, as he used to sit in the window of the Williamsville (Lanky's) store drawing pictures and giving the pictures away as he drew them...(Birch Barker 7/13/74)

Birch Lake Joins <u>C</u>OOPERATIVE <u>L</u>AKES <u>M</u>ONITORING <u>P</u>ROGRAM

This program, which is a cooperative venture between the Birch Lake Yacht Club Water Quality Committee, Michigan Lakes and Streams (ML&S), and the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), allows us to measure and monitor Birch Lake's CLARITY, PHOSPHORUS, and CHLQROPHYLL.

Following are some questions and answers about the first element of the program— CLARITY and SECCHI DISK TESTING.

What is a Secchi Disk Test?

A Secchi Disk reading measures water clarity. The depth at which the disk can no longer be seen in the water is the water clarity depth. The depth of clarity is affected by factors such as free floating algae, soil particles from erosion, re-suspension of bottom sediments, etc.

How do you do a Secchi Disk test?

Secchi Disk measurements are taken once a week. The Disk is lowered into the water until it disappears and the number of feet is recorded. This is the transparency depth, which is then sent weekly to ML&S and MDEQ for state recording.

What does the Secchi Disk measurement tell us?

Secchi Disk testing is an indirect measurement of lake fertility and productivity. It measures the depth of light penetration into the lake, which may be decreased by algae, water color, or particles suspended in the water. Generally, the greater the number of free floating algae, the shallower the Secchi depth reading.

What is the purpose of Secchi Disk testing?

This testing shows changes in water quality from week to week, month to month, and season to season. The seasonal results over a period of years will indicate whether Birch Lake is remaining stable, decreasing, or showing improvement.

In the next issue, we will discuss PHOSPHORUS, the second element of testing.

And now, a word from BIRCH LAKE ...

The Birch Lake Water Quality Committee took samples of my water and just received the results from the MDEQ Lab. The fecal/coliform in Birch Lake is LESS THAN 101

According to the Public Health Department <10 = POLLUTION FREE WATER!!!

MICHIGAN WATER CRAFT LAWS

- Boats Requiring Registration All motorboats; all sailboats; rowboats (privately owned) over 16; rental or commercial canoes 12' or longer; rental or commercial vessels propelled by any means that are 12' or longer. The registration numbers must be affixed to the watercraft and the certificate of registration must be carried on board when the watercraft is being operated.
- 2. All boats are required to have aboard one Coast Guard approved personal floration device for each person on board. Boats 16' or over must be equipped with a type 1, 11 or III coast guard approved, wearable floration device, plus one type IV throwable device.
 - (New Law) Children under six (6) years of age must wear a type I or 11 personal flotation device when in an "open deck area" of the vessel.
- Approved fire extinguishers must be carried on motorboats with closed compartments and should be carried on all motorboats.
- Running lights are required on all watercraft between sunset and surrise. (red and green on front, white on rear).
- 5. Children between 12 and 16 years of age may operate a motorboat of six horsepower or more only when accompanied by a person 16 years old or older, or when in possession of a boating safety certificate issued after satisfactorily completing a Michigan Department of Natural Resources approved course in boating safety. Children less than 12 years old may operate a motorboat of no more than six horsepower without supervision or a boating safety certificate. Young operators under age 12 may not operate a vessel powered by more than a total of 35 horsepower engine(s) even though that young operator is properly supervised.
- No person shall operate any watercraft while under the influence of alcoholic beverage or narcotic drugs.
- 7. Any person who operates any watercraft in a careless and heedless manner so as to disregard the rights or safety of others, and at a speed that would endanger or likely to endanger any person or property, shall be guilty of reckless operation.
- No person shall operate any watercraft at a speed greater than will permit him to exercise reasonable care, to bring the watercraft to a stop within the assured clear distance ahead.
- No person shall operate a watercraft in a manner so as to unreasonably interfere with the lawful use by others of any waters.
- All accidents resulting in personal injury or property damage to exceed \$100 shall be reported to local law authorities.
- All motorboats must operate in a counterclock-wise direction, insofar as it is reasonably possible.
- 12. No operator of any watercraft shall have in tow any person on water skis, watersled, surfboard, or any similar contrivance during the period one hour after sunset to one hour prior to sunrise.
- 13. There must be one observer plus the driver in any watercraft towing water skis, or any similar contrivance. The observer must be a person capable of communicating the needs and condition of the person being towed.

- 14. No person being towed on water skis or other similar contrivance shall be closer than 100' to any swimming area, fishing craft, pier, raft or other watercraft.
- 15. The only exception to the regulation above is when landing and taking off - then, extreme caution must be used.
- 16. All persons must be seated in seats provided when the watercraft is underway or in motion. Sitting on the deck or gunwale is prohibited. Persons are also prohibited from being "in or on the bow" of a vessel if the vessel is exceeding a slow, no wake speed. This does not apply if there is seating installed by the manufacturer, or to sail boats under sail only.
- No operator shall allow his watercraft to pass closer than 100' to any anchored fishing craft.
- No operator shall allow his watercraft to pass closer than 100' from any swimming area except when docking or debarking.
- 19. A boat shall not be operated within 200' of a buoyed diver's flag (red rectangle with white diagonal stripe) unless the boat is tendering the diver(s).

NEW ANTI-DRUNK BOATING LAWS

(in effect March 31, 1993)

Boaters will be subject to stronger penalties if they are convicted of operating a vessel while impaired or under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances, beginning March 1, 1993.

Persons convicted of violating the new laws that are designed to make Michigan waterways safer risk the following:

- Suspension of boating privileges
- Fines ranging from \$100 to \$10,000
- Jail sentences from up to 90 days to five years; and /or
- Community service requirements up to 90 days.

The Secretary of State's office will maintain a record of boating convictions. Exact fines, length of sentence and community service requirements will depend on the number of alcohol related violations on a person's boating record and the severity of those violations.

BOATERS WILL BE SUBJECT TO IMPLIED CONSENT LAW

- Under the new anti-drunk boating laws, people operating a vessel who refuse a chemical test upon request of a law enforcement officer will be subject to a suspension of boating privileges for six months.
- A second refusal within seven years will result in a one year suspension of boating privileges.
- People charged with operating a vessel while suspended may have their watercraft registration cancelled for 90 days and upon conviction, will face possible impoundment of their watercraft.
- Violation of this new anti-drunk boating law will not affect your motor vehicle driving privileges.

For more information on these new laws, please contact your local Sheriff's Department, local conservation officer or local Department of Natural Resources office.

BLYC SAILING NEWS

There were steady and sometimes strong winds for all five races of the Fourth of July Regatta. There was even a little rain to cool down the third race. Harold Cranmer's consistency prevailed in the MC class, and Bob King earned a hard fought victory in the Sunfish class. A 14' racing hobie cat sailed with the MC class, with the same result as when Dennis Conner sailed a catamaran in the America's Cup try-outs some years ago: those multi-hulls are soooo fast.

Many thanks to Marte Sante and Mike Gottstein, who officiated in the committee boat. The regattas are scored with the "olympic" system, rather than the "square of 40" method described earlier. The olympic system gives a first place 0 points, second place 3 points, third place 5.7 points, fourth place 8 points and fifth place 10 points and sixth place 11.7 points. The boat finishing the series with the fewest points wins. In scoring a regatta, if a boat hasn't sailed in all the races it has to be given the number of points a last place finish would earn; otherwise the scoring would be skewed. The races sailed in the regatta also count for the season standings, but for this purpose the "square of 40" scoring system is used and a boat that didn't sail is not penalized. My head hurt after doing all the math. The results of the final Fourth of July Regatta of this century, and the current season standings, are:




