Lake Notes are compiled from local history publications including Birch Barkers and other newspaper archives.

The 1st issue of the Birch Barker was distributed in 1943 or 1944. The editor was Chuck Schott; Denny Horvath was Sec. and Treas.; and Marsha Enyeart, Jane Cox, and Gilbert Eberhart were reporters. One of the first paid advertisers was Lanky's Williamsville Store, who advertised block ice cut from Birch Lake and delivered. The Coxes printed the Barker for the first couple of years and then the Schotts bought a mimeograph to use at the Lake. After a lapse in publication from 1953 to 1957, Julie (Ebling) Weaver and a group of Junior Yacht Club members reorganized the paper and it has been a yearly Yacht Club publication ever since. (*Birch Barker 6/27/64, 8/26/72, & Denny Weesner*)

Star Stuff

In recent weeks, you've probably seen the term "Dog Days" used a few times. This term is commonly used to refer to the hottest, stickiest time of the year. The "Dog Days" actually get their name from the dog star, Sirius. At this time of year, Sirius appears quite near the Sun in our sky. It's also the brightest star in Earth's night sky, so ancient sky watchers thought the heat from Sirius and the Sun combined to produce the year's hottest weather. Sirius is hotter than the Sun, but it's also 50 trillion miles from Earth. At such a great distance, Sirius doesn't do anything to warm our planet.

Sirius played a crucial role in daily life in ancient Egypt. Its first appearance in the morning twilight marked the beginning of the Egyptian year. It also heralded the annual flooding of the Nile River, which deposited fertile soil in the Nile Valley. Three thousand years ago, this pre-dawn appearance occurred in early July. Today, though, it happens several weeks later. That's because Earth wobbles on it's axis. The wobble takes 26000 years to complete and causes the stars and constellations to shift position with respect to the sun.

Look for Sirius later in August. It will become visible low in the eastern pre-dawn sky as an intensely bright, blue-white star. Even so, the last couple of weeks have been oppressively hot. Call them "Dog Days" or what you want. Keep looking up.

- 7. Other repairs in various locations throughout the camp??.
- New refrigerator for the kitchen \$2,500.00 approximately
