

Lake Notes are compiled from local history publications including Birch Barkers and other newspaper archives.

Many property owners in Sylvan Shores, south side of Birch Lake, are very concerned about the County Park Commissioner's plans for developing access sites for general public use. We believe that such development will result in greater congestion, pollution, and safety hazards for all residents at Birch Lake. The proposed sites are inadequate in depth and area to accommodate proper sanitary facilities, parking areas, boat launching, and the like, required for general public use. (Birch Barker 7/27/74)

We made a single recommendation: if swimming is to be permitted at Sears Park, then the County must provide restroom facilities. Otherwise, swimming at this site should be stopped by Commission notice. (Birch Barker 7/26/75)

At a meeting of the Yacht Club officers, trustees, and directors on Sat., July 26, it was unanimously agreed that we proceed on the second phase of our lake self-help program...the voluntary dye testing of septic systems. Plans are now being formulated to conduct this project. Property owners will be advised directly of the project and their voluntary participation will be solicited. (Birch Barker 8/2/75

HONEY - LIME HAM

1/2C butter or margarine

1/4C honey

1/4C lime juice

2 tsp. Seasoned salt

1 fully cooked ham center slice (1 ½ lbs)

In a small sauce pan, heat the first four ingredients until the butter is melted. Place ham in a re-sealable plastic bag or shallow baking dish, pour honey mixture over ham. Seal bag or cover container, refrigerate overnight. Bring to room temperature. Drain and discard marinade. Grill, uncovered over hot coals, turning several times for 5-10 minutes, or until heated through. Yields 4-6 servings.

Star Stuff

Two ancient "rivals" are closing in on each other in the early-evening sky this month. They're visible in the south southwest as darkness falls. They both look like moderately bright orange or red stars. In fact, though, only

one of them is a star — Antares, in the constellation Scorpius. To the right of Antares is the planet Mars. Since they look so much alike, ancient Greek sky watchers gave the star a name that means "rival of Mars."

Mars and Antares are rivals in name only, though. Mars is a ball of rock that's a bit more than half the size of Earth. It looks red or orange because its surface is coated with a powdery red soil.

Antares is a red supergiant star — one of the largest stars in our region of the Milky Way Galaxy. Its outer layers are fairly cool, which is why the star appears red. Antares is several hundred times bigger than the Sun — so big that if it took the Sun's place at the center of our solar system, it would swallow the three or four innermost planets — including Earth.

Within the next few million years, Antares will explode as a supernova. For many months, it will outshine the Moon—leaving its ancient "rival" far behind.

But Mars will get the last word in this cosmic rivalry. It will continue to shine in Earth's night sky long after Antares fades from view.

Watch each night as Mars gets closer and closer to Antares. In mid-September, they will be at their closest, about 3 degrees apart. After that, they will begin to pull apart.

Keep looking up.

"Brochetta Tomatella Heavenella"

With the multitude of ripe tomatoes now available, I would like to share one of our favorite ways of using them:

Cut vine ripend tomatoes in half, removing as little as possible of tomato when you remove the stem end, sprinkle cut side with olive oil, crushed garlic, sea salt, and fresh ground pepper. Put on small grill rack and place in center of grill on indirect heat with the cut end up. Grill for about 30 min.

We put this on lightly toasted peasant bread, crushing them a little until the juice soaks into the bread and top with chopped fresh basil.

We have also cut them in quarters and tossed them with pasta, basil, more roasted garlic, and parmesan cheese.

Birch Lake Water Quality Update

Birch Lake Joins COOPERATIVE LAKES MONITORING PROGRAM

This program, which is a cooperative venture between the BLYC Water Quality Committee, Michigan Lake & Stream Associations, and the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality allows us to measure and monitor Birch Lake's CLARITY, PHOSPHORUS and CHLOROPHYL

Secchi Disk Transparency

The station number for the Secchi Disk report is the 95 feet deep basin of Birch Lake. Transparency monitoring is reported on a weekly basis which began on May 3, 1999 and will continue throughout September. Readings will be sent to ML&SA for state recording. Readings will be included in the report produced by the state. The Program is On-Going. The water quality committee will make results available.

Phosphorus

The sampling site for the phosphorus test is the 95 feet deep basin of Birch Dake. The surface of the lake (spring turnover) was sampled on April 8, 1999. More extensive water column sampling will be done in the late summer. All Phosphorus samples are delivered to Michigan DEQ for their analyzing. Results will be included in the report produced by the state. The Program is On-Going. The water quality committee will make results available.

Chlorophyll

The sampling site for the Chlorophyll test is the 95 feet deep basin of Birch Lake. Sampling Event #1 was in May. Sampling Event #2 was in June. Sampling Event #3 was in July. Sampling Event #4 will take place in August and Sampling Event #5 will take place in September, 1999. All Chlorophyll samples are delivered to the Michigan DEQ for analyzing. Results will be included in the report produced by the state. The Program is On-Going. The water quality committee will make results available.

The late summer phosphorus results, along with chlorophyll and Secchi disk transparency measurements, provide an estimate of the level of productivity, or trophic state, of Birch Lake. These indices provide a quantitative means of describing the stage of lake aging. Using Carlson's TSI the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality classify lakes according to their trophic state.

Lakes can be divided into three categories based on trophic state. Oligotrophic lakes are generally clear, deep and free of weeds or large algae blooms. They are beautiful!

Eutrophic lakes are high in nutrients and support a large biomass. They are usually either weedy or subject to frequent algae blooms, or both.

Mesotrophic lakes lie between the oligotrophic and eutrophic stages.




