LAKE NOTES

Lake Notes are compiled from local history publications including Birch Barkers and other newspaper archives.

Birch Lake Conservation Club was organized more than a quarter of a century ago. Thru the efforts of this early organization, Birch Lake was made an experimental lake with a resident conservationist. Trout were introduced to the lake but, after several years, it was found they were detrimental to the natural fish of the lake.

As the population of the lake increased, other interests, besides fishing, have developed such as boating and swimming. Also, the name of the Club was changed to Birch Lake Community Club.

The name of the organization was next changed to Birch Lake Yacht Club and the clubhouse was built on land donated by the Howards and financed by subscriptions, ranging from \$5 to \$500. With the new clubhouse, bingo and dancing became popular. Travel and fishing films were shown. Melon feasts and ice cream socials were enjoyed by all.

Around 1955, the first B.L.Y.C. fireworks display was shown on July 4th. Also, about the same time, the first boat parade was held. In 1965, the Yacht Club purchased a patrol boat and motor and the county and state furnished a Marine Patrol Officer. This same year, the Safe Boating Course was started at the B.L.Y.C. In 1968, the first rummage sale was held at the clubhouse to help the finances of the Yacht Club." (Floyd Fulmer, 1970)




