#### COMMODORES COMMENTS

I wanted to begin by thanking the people who helped tackle all the tasks this summer. Instead, let me list what the Birch Lake Yacht Club did for the Lake community. The initial database was assembled... we sent the April flyer & held the Spring Dinner... followed by the Road Cleanup, Yacht Club Cleanup, Commodore's Cocktail Party, Boat Parade, Fireworks Display, Tannadoonah Pancake Breakfast, Garage Sale, Vice Commodore's Cocktail Party, Men's Golf Outing, Ladies Golf Outing and Luncheon, Corn and Sausage Roast, Fall Dinner, ran over 20 Season Sail Races for two boat classes, the Regatta Kidz, Memorial Day Regatta, Fourth of July Regatta and the Labor Day Regatta this weekend (for those of you who read aloud, now would be a good time to take a breath).

We also organized and printed 500 new Directories (some still remain for sale), arranged advertising, sold 150 Birch Lake mugs and about a kazillion t-shirts/sweatshirts, held four Board meetings and one Homeowner Association meeting plus some of the residents are also active on area government boards, both in an official capacity as well as contacting governmental agencies and officials on behalf of the Lake residents (attending endless meetings in the process). We were able to offer an on-lake Marine boat check and the Boating Safety Class, published the Marine Rules for Boats and PWCs, made contributions to the Marine Sheriff Dept, local Fire Department and a group of people helped raise funds so that the "gathering of friends on a hill" are still campers - not condo owners.

The Blackwoods and their delivery team edited, assembled and distributed 3,450 Birch Barkers, the Water Quality Committee did countless tests, reports, responded directly to resident issues, interfaced with County officials, enrolled Birch into the CLMP and published educational articles on their process, efforts and results. (Do I know how to write run-on sentences or what?)

Frankly, having related the above, it's surprising that only 3 of 5 residents pay their dues as members of Birch Lake Yacht Club! We are more than social. We are a powerful collective.. working for the benefit of everyone on Birch, now and through the next Century. It is my hope that we can enlist even more support next year.

Only a couple items remain this summer: The Regatta is this weekend (see Sailing News). Please come out on the water as players or spectators. Before some of you drag your sailboats back to their winter resting places without having hoisted sail, how about having a sail-around this Sunday at 2? Imagine seeing 50-100 boats out together! We may have a Club cleanup/bonfire this fall. There is also the lingering thought of celebrating the New Year at the Lake. Watch your mail for the flyer this spring announcing a new location for the Spring Dinner.

The huge response for Vice Commodore has made "tryouts" necessary... they will be in our yard Monday at high noon - bring your squirt guns for battle #2. I will be the first Commodore-in-absentia. #### Homeowners' Association News

At the annual meeting of the Homeowners' Association on August 14, 1999, the Board reported on and obtained input from the members concerning various items affecting Birch Lake. Among the matters discussed was the defeat of the recent Constantine School property tax increase request; the Homeowners' Association complaint to the Michigan Department of Agriculture about the "application" of hog manure on the fields to the South of the lake, and the results of that complaint; the new waverunner legislation; the Canada geese problem; the boat launch; developing contacts with the new Porter Township police officer; sewers; new Michigan Supreme Court case holding the DNR must comply with local zoning requirements before developing boat ramps, restrooms and parking lots; fire department and EMT considerations affecting insurance premiums; and meetings of the local governmental boards attended by members of the board of the Homeowners' Association, including the Porter Township Board of Trustees, the Constantine School Board, the Department of Public Works; the Board of Zoning Appeals and the Community Policing agency.

After the annual meeting of the Homeowners' Association it was learned that an item being considered by the County Commissioners and the DNR is to pave the entire boat launch, lot line to lot line, cut down the big tree at the road intersection at the bottom of the hill, and make some unspecified widening of the road at the bottom of the hill by the boat launch. It is not known if this will actually proceed. The Homeowners' Association board wanted the Birch Lake community to be aware of this possibility, because it raises issues affecting all at Birch Lake. Among other things, paving the entire boat launch would have an environmental and safety effect on this small lake, by increasing runoff into the lake and possibly increasing the day use by more and larger boats and waverunners. Let your Homeowners' Association and BLYC board members know how you feel about this.

When you receive your property and casualty insurance bill for your Birch Lake property, you might wish to make sure the insurance company has the correct information about which fire department and EMT team responds to calls from Birch Lake. Birch Lake is located in Porter Township, so the insurance company might assume that Porter Township's fire department and EMT handles calls from Birch Lake. In fact, however, Birch Lake is served by the Newberg Township fire department and EMT. This can make a difference in your insurance bill, because the Newberg Township fire department and EMT facilities are located much closer to the lake than are Porter Township's. Because your insurance premium is based in part on how long it would take the responsible fire department or EMTs to reach the insured property, you could possibly save some money on your insurance premiums if the insurance company has the correct information about the local fire protection and EMT arrangements.

SEPTIC SYSTEM ORDINANCE - WORKING TOGETHER WITH LOCAL TOWNSHIP GOVERNMENT - Cecile Kortier, Lake Avalon Property Owners Association, Hillman, Michigan.

(Not all lakes in Michigan are agreeing that a sanitary sewer system is an answer to lake preservation and are addressing the problem of inadequate septic systems through their township and their local health department)

In May of 1990, Lake Avalon sponsored a Septic Ordinance for the purpose of upgrading septic systems affecting their lake......

- Owner was contacted to return an application-for-inspection form
- Owner was asked to submit all infomation about system (drawing, etc.)
- Was there an approved permit on file in the County Health Dept. office?
- Was the existing system constructed without a permit?
- Owner was asked to uncover septic tank, locate field, etc.
- Owner was contacted to schedule inspection of his system
- Public Health Officer made an on-site inspestion to determine compliance
- Report filed by Health Officer with details about tank, field, distance, etc. Immediate upgrade was required. Many new systems were installed voluntarily. That's the good news. The bad news is that some problems have arisen. Will there be a "get tough" policy in the end? Enforcement is a responsibility. Their goal, over a period of 10 years culminating in 2005, is to upgrade all drywells, waste pits, and other antiquated waste systems to modern septic systems with a septic tank and drain field of adequate size and remote siting from the lakefront.

#### 1979 - Birch Lake Watershed Analysis Study

• Dr. Snow, Andrews University, and Peter Elliott, Planner, SMRPC, recommend that Birch Lake reduce the impact of inadequate inplace systems.

1984-1994 Cass County Health Department Birch Lake Survey Program

The Cass County Health Department enforced the Cass County Sewage Disposal Regulation at Birch Lake - A Public Health Officer made an on-site inspection at every takefront and stream property - 96 septic systems were in non-compliance -96 septic systems were brought into compliance.

- Bacteriological contamination at Birch Lake was eliminated.
- Phosphorous loading from septic seepage was reduced.
- What Can You Do For Birch Lake now that properly sized and located septic systems have been installed Conscientious maintenance is one of the most critical steps you can take to protect your lake. Clean your septic regularly and have it insected every 1 to 2 years.

#### Star Stuff

If you look carefully just before sunrise the next few weeks, you might see a bright "morning star" standing very low in the east. That's the planet Venus, which is pulling away from the Sun right now, and is getting ready to put on a dazzling early morning show.

Until mid-August, Venus highlighted the EVENING sky. But two weeks ago, it passed between Earth and the Sun, moving into the morning sky.

This back-and-forth motion, combined with the planet's brightness, made Venus one of the most revered astronomical objects of the ancient world and one of the most misunderstood.

Some cultures thought the MORNING-star Venus was a completely different object from the EVENING-star Venus. It's not, though. It's a single planet that changes positions because it's moving around the Sun, just like we are.

Other cultures understood that Venus was a single object, even if they didn't know its true nature. To many, its cycle represented the death and rebirth of an important god. To others, morning and evening appearances represented two separate gods.

Look for Venus about a half-hour before sunrise.
Although it's brighter than anything else in our night sky, except the Moon, it's so low that you might have trouble finding it if you're down by the lake. But keep trying. It rises a few minutes earlier each day, so within a week or so, it should be quite easy to find in the waxing color of twilight.

In many sci-fi movies a hushed voice speaks, "There's something up there." You bet there is. This line is usually heard in reference to an extraterrestrial spaceship. What is up there is not just something,... it's everything. It's the universe we live in. And, though that universe may extend to truly inconceivable distances, it is also incredibly close... as close as your backyard, your window, a tilt of your head to the sky. I hope you continue to enjoy the night sky and all its wonders. See you next summer. Until then, you know what to do...

Keep looking up.


