




Sailing Made Simpler

Also, to encourage newbies, special "bonus" points are being awarded to regular sailors who take along "crew."





The legend of the Beer Scooter

The Best of Beck's Bistro



- 1/2 chopped onion
- 2 Tlb vegetable oil
- 4 chicken breasts
- 1 can (12 oz) cola
- 1 cup ketchup
- 1/8 tsp garlic powder
- 1/8 tsp salt 1/8 tsp pepper
- 4 1/2 tsp cornstarch
- 3 Tlb cold water

In a skillet, saute onion in oil until tender. Add chicken, brown on all sides. Carefully add cola, ketchup, garlic powder, salt and pepper. Cover and simmer for 25-30 minutes or until juices run clear.

Remove chicken and keep warm. Combine the cornstarch and cold water until smooth, and add to the skillet. Bring to a boil, cover and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened.

Return chicken to pan, and heat through. Yield: 4 servings.

Caramelized Sweet Onions

(To ensure proper caramelization, avoid salting the onions before they have finished cooking)

- 6 sweet onions (medium), peeled and cut into
- 1/4 inch rounds
- 1/2 tsp coarse salf
- 1/4 tsp freshly ground pepper

Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Add onions; cook, stirring occasionally, until all juices have evaporated, about 20 minutes.

Reduce heat to medium-low, and cook, stirring occasionally, until onions are very tender, and golden brown. I hour to 1 1/2 hours. Season with salt and pepper and serve.

Update/The war on Zebra Mussels

Zebra mussels were first found in the Great Lakes in the mid-1980s, after a European cargo ship expelled its ballast water into Lake St. Clair. They have since spread into nearly 150 inland lakes.

Mike Klepinger, a specialist in aquatic nuisance species, says monitoring for zebra mussels in inland lakes is difficult to keep up with.

Established in 1991, The Aquatic Nuisance Species Office is a branch of the Michigan Sea Grant Inland Lakes Monitoring Program through Michigan State University. It is the central source of zebra mussel information in Michigan.

"Michigan has over 11,000 lakes that are over five acres," he said. "With so many lakes, it is impossible to set up a sample program."

Mussel damage

Klepinger says zebra mussels fundamentally change the water system forever.

They do two types of damage: socioeconomic and ecologi-

cal.

Socioeconomic damage takes the form of clogged intake lines, rows of dead zebra mussel shells on beaches, sharp shells on lake bottoms and mussels attached to boat motors, propellers and docks.


Zebra mussels impact the ecosystem by filtering nutrients from the water.

"Each zebra mussel can filter a liter of water per day," Klepinger said. "Each female zebra mussel can put out up to one million spawn a season and they sometimes grow into huge clumps several inches thick."

Because they filter the water so effectively, it looks clearer. But the pollution hasn't been removed — it's concentrated in the tissue of the zebra mussels. When they die it is released again. And because the water is clearer, increased light causes more plants to grow. That changes fish habitat.

No predators:

Zebra mussels have been associated with causing a musty taste and odor in drinking water.

It's not like they cover the whole bottom, but on a clear day you can look down and see black spots. If you reach down and pick one up, you will see it is not a rock, but a clump of zebra mussels.

They have no natural predators and there's no way to get rid of them once they're established.

Rick Bakka has lived on Strawberry Lake for 15 years. In 1997, he was one of the first residents to report zebra mussels in that lake. "People started noticing them on docks and rocks," he said. "The main problem is the shells are sharp and they cut your feet," Bakka said. "And as they spread it is getting worse and worse."



Lake life economics

The economics of owning lake property has been turned upside down since Shirley Anne and I bought our place at Birch on a land contract in 1973. If we were coming here today in the same financial circumstances, we wouldn't be able to make a purchase. Sylvia Bright was open, helpful, and a touch sentimental, but she was no fool, and she wouldn't have "given her place away," just because we looked like a "nice couple."

There are few "old" houses and even fewer "fixer-uppers" left on these shores. There are no more inexpensive buys. At \$1,100 a running foot or more, the lakefront land makes even "bargain" properties too pricey for young families on tight budgets.

pricey for young families on tight budgets.
Our place was "fancier" than many others on Birch 30 years ago. It was a year-round home with two bedrooms, two baths and an attached garage. It had been put together in pieces through handyman remodeling, but it looked presentable and it served us well when we drove in from Chicago to spend the weekends. Over a ten year period we paid about \$85,000 for the acre-and-a-third with 50 feet of frontage we own now, but the original house had only a 10-foot shared easement and we bought it with no down payment for \$30,000.

Imagine trying to do that today.

Looking back further to the days when my in-laws came to Birch makes the contrast even greater. Starr and Millie Wentworth bought a lot in the cove in 1946 (which ran up the hill behind them for at least 100 feet) for \$3,000. They had a one-room fishing shanty moved in and their friends helped them put in a well and septic

system. They were depression-hardened buyers and they waited until they could pay cash for their "extravagant" purchase.


Today, this is an upscale enclave by Michiana lake community standards, not quite as pricey as Diamond, but much too salty for the average working family in search of the "lake cottage" of their youth. We've become exclusive without meaning to do so, and while there are very nice property value benefits for those of us who are here, the price of admission has become prohibitive for people whose circumstances mirror the ones many of us brought to these shores.

Norm and Nancy Monroe have lived beside us for 29 years, and they and their children could serve as the poster family for "good neighbors." They are friendly and considerate and I've never heard either of them say an unkind word about anyone.

Nevertheless, when we were building our new home 12 years ago, I remember feeling that Norm was almost as sad as our daughters were to see our old place go. He was happy for us and he said very complimentary things about the new home, but I thought he had mixed feelings about the idea of "re-doing" the lake. I remember him saying rather wistfully one day, "It won't be very long before all the old places are gone and the only kids playing around here will be somebody's grandkids."

He wasn't far off the mark. We have

He wasn't far off the mark. We have far more year-round and seven-month residents than we used to have at Birch, and I'm sure the average age of a Birch Lake homeowner has gone up by a decade in the time we've been here. Many of us are



retired or we've decided to give up the house in town and make this our only place of residence. We have homes as large as 4,000 or 5,000 square feet, and it is not unusual to hear of a half million dollar price tag on a Birch Lake property.

Shirley Anne and I have certainly been part of the problem, if it is a problem. We've upgraded regularly to get to the look and the comfort we wanted from our Birch Lake home. We've even had strangers pull up in our roadside parking area and stroll down the sidewalk toward the lake, because they mistakenly believed our yard was a public park.

I like the lake the way it is today. I love to look at the beautiful homes and to visit with friends in what is clearly a vacation paradise, but I understand what Norm Monroe was probably mourning as he watched our new house go up. This is no longer an affordable place for working class families who want their children to enjoy a lakeside summertime experience. We've all stayed the same, but our neighborhood has moved uptown.



Stu's Star Stuff

Sunrises and sunsets

The Sun blazes with all its fury

as we head into the hottest part of the year. But because of Earth's lopsided orbit, today we're actually farthest from the Sun for the year — about 1.5 million miles farther than the average distance of 93 million miles.

Astronomers refer to this event as "aphelion," derived from Greek meaning "from the sun." Just after midnight the sun and Earth were 94,506,950 miles apart. This figure varies by about 3 percent from the closest approach of these two bodies

(perihelion) that occurs in early January. Take note that today is not the coldest day of 2002, so the annual temperature swings we endure must have a cause other than how far away the sun is.

That cause is the tilt of earth's axis of rotation. Instead of being perpendicular to the orbital plane, earth's axis is tilted about 23 and a half degrees. As Earth travels through it's orbit, the point where the sun's energy is focused changes from north to south. When the focus is most northerly, as we had last week, we have the longest day and the official start of summer. When it's

farthest south, we begin win-

ter with the shortest day of the year. In spring and fall our orbit positions the sun directly over the equator at noon. These times mark the vernal and autumnal equinoxes - the time of equal day and night.

It doesn't have to be dark to enjoy the show. Sunrises and sunsets can be quite spectacular. And they're free.






