

Caribbean Spice Chicken

4 boneless skinless chicken breasts

1/2 cup lemon juice

1/4 chili sauce

2 Tlb Dijon mustard

1 Tlb dried basil

I Tlb minced fresh parsley

Pre-heat the grill or broiler. Combine ingredients in a shallow baking dish to create marinade. Cover dish and refrigerate for 30 minutes, and up to 2 hours. Drain chicken and discard marinade. Grill or broil over medium heat 18-25 minutes or until juices

run clear.

Garlic Potato Wedges

4 Lbs small red potatoes, cut into wedges 1/3 cup olive or canola oil, divided

16 unpeeled garlic cloves

2 Tlbs minced fresh rosemary, or 2 tsp dried rosemary, crushed

1 tsp salt

1/3 cup white wine vinegar or cider vinegar

4 tsp dijon mustard

3 tsp sugar

1/4 tsp pepper

1/3 cup chopped green onions

In a bowl, combine the potatoes, 1 Tlb of oil, garlic, rosemary, and salt. Pour into a 9x13 baking dish coated with non-stick cooking spray. Bake, uncovered at 450 for 25-30 minutes or until potatoes are tender, stirring every 10 minutes. In a small bowl, combine the vinegar, mustard, sugar, pepper, and remaining oil until smooth. Squeeze garlic mixture into vinegar mixture discarding skins. Pour over potatoes and toss to coat. Sprinkle with onions.



BIRCH LAKE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM - BLYC Water Quality Committee

Birch Lake is not like other lakes in Porter Township, Cass County.

Birch Lake is not in the same category of other lakes. Birch Lake is an excellent lake with a management program to maintain its integrity. Birch Lake has a lake association, the Birch Lake Yack Club. Within the lake association is a water quality committee that has represented Birch Lake for 18 years under the direction of water quality and environmental specialists. It has always been their desire and our desire to reward Birch Lake residents with a clean lake.

The accomplishments of the water quality committee surpass other lakes in Porter Township, Cass County. By reducing pinpoints by correcting faulty septic systems, Birch Lake is now an excellent lake. There is no problem with groundwater. There is no problem with phosphorus runoff from soil erosion within our watershed, no problem with agriculture. No problem with fertilizers (thanks for buying our nophosphorus fertilizer).

Water quality data began in 1984, and in that data are the names of those who served Birch Lake, not only on the water quality committee but those who assisted the committee and showed respect and appreciation for the professionals who the committee worked for.

In 1999, the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program was added to the lake management program at the advise of Don Winne, Executive Director of the Michigan Lake and Stream Associations (ML&SA). In the words of Winne: we rely on ML&SA to keep us informed and they depend on us to continue to collect valuable data. They have assumed the leadership role and assist us in making decisions for wise use and management in order to maintain the integrity of Birch Lake. ML&SA brings the experts to the annual and other regional conferences and provide the opportunity for us to get answers to questions about Birch Lake water matters.

BLYC renewed its membership in ML&SA for the year 2002. It is the desire of the water quality committee to dontinue to make this partnership successful, to continue to work for the water quality experts and on water quality matters, to continue to represent "the lake."

Membership provides professional interpretation of collected data, provides an annual check-up on the trophic state of Birch Lake, and gives us the answers to actions that are essential to protecting and guarding the excellent water of Birch Lake,

Not only are the experts concerned about the continued excellence of the water, but also management of the invasion of the exotics. Howard Wandell, Specialist Lake and Stream Management Outreach, Michigan State University assists us with "Milfoil Watch." N Klepinger, Michigan Sea Grant College Program recommends programs to help control the spread of Zebra Mussels and Purple Loosestrife. The Hand-Pick Zebra Mussel Program results will be forwarded to Mike Klepinger at the end of summer "picking." Following is a report on our Purple Loosestrife Program which will also be forwarded to Mike Klepinger at the end of summer "blooming."

"PURPLE ALERT"

It's that time of year again. We are going into our third year of the "Birch Lake Purple Loosestrife Project." Each year the sites have been cleaned up by 1) Identification; 2) Bagging to prevent the seeds from spreading pefore the plant is dug out; 3) Digging the plant out.

This year, so far, two old sites have returned, but not as strongly as last year. We need to keep looking for the pinkish-purple flowers. This plant blooms from June through September along the shoreline. Although it has been found on all the shores of Birch Lake, it seems to favor the West shore. If you see this weed, or are not sure, please let us know so we can identify and advise or assist in the proper removal. Purple Loosestrife unchecked will overrun the native lake plants. It has no natural enemies, so it is up to us to keep it in check. Each year we see the problem improving so we are having a positive effect on the problem. Stay at home dads

My son-in-law, Scott, is a stay at home dad, a vocation so foreign to men of my generation that when he began doing it, I paid special attention to what he was doing and how he went about it. When he and Dawn found out they were going to have a baby, they invested a lot of time in thinking about and talking about what they would do about daytime child care. We heard some of the peripheral portions of those discussions and we knew of their concems.

Scott was a Respiratory Therapy
Technician at Memorial Hospital in South
Bend. He worked the second shift, coming
home about midnight and leaving for work
in the early afternoon. Dawn taught English
at Penn High School. She left for work
around 6:30 AM, and got home about 4 in
the afternoon. For nearly three years they
put up with their conflicting work schedules
and the short times together, because both of
them enjoyed what they were doing.

them enjoyed what they were doing.

However, once Madison was on the way, they saw a big problem looming, and they knew they would have to make some changes in their lifestyle.

Did they want to use a baby sitter or a daycare provider? Nope, not for a small child. Did they have anyone in the family who could step in and help? Maybe, but they weren't going to ask. Could they get by on only one salary? It wouldn't be as easy as doing it on two, but they could manage.

And so it came to pass that they decided one of them would stop working outside the home for a few years. Scott drew the short straw. As (soon to be) grandparents, we were relieved. Shirley Anne had worked for a time while I went to college, but we had always traded baby-sitting shifts with

our two girls. One of us was at home at all times, and we thought it worked well for the kids.


Nevertheless, I knew that had it fallen on me to become the stay-at-home parent while Shirley Anne pursued a career, I wouldn't have known how to handle it. I had way too much of my ego tied up in what I did for a living, and I would have worried entirely too much about how others would have judged my choice.

If Scott gave a thought to what anyone other than he and Dawn thought about what they were doing, he never talked about it or showed it. In fact, he seemed so focused on making certain that their new baby was going to be well cared for, he paid little attention to anything else.

Madison is now almost a year and a quarter old, and he and his Dad are doing great. (This is probably a good place to put in the warning that whatever claims I make for the perfection of my own grandchild may need to be read with a modest amount of skepticism.) This is the happiest little boy I've ever been around. He has the fearlessness of a child who has been encouraged to try new things, but who has not been put in situations in which he might hurt himself and become tentative or fearful.

He runs from new adventure to new adventure all day long, talking with the speed of Chris Mathews in a language only he (and sometimes his Dad) can understand. Most of all he makes up games from each new contact and conversation, and he laughs, ceaselessly.

I look at my son-in-law and ask myself, now how did he do that? I know I could not have done it. I didn't and don't have the skills, or the patience, or the sense of voca-



tion. I would have always been eager to lay down my life to save my daughters, but I could no more have been their primary parent than I could have been their ballet instructor.

Is it generational? That is certainly a piece of it. Careerism no longer has a stranglehold on the young men of this country. If child rearing is appealing to them, they don't sweat the "loss" of not climbing the business ladder. However, I think there is more at work here than differing attitudes between men of different generations. There is something fundamental going on, an ability to see children and child rearing through a prism that appears opaque to me. Until recently, I'd never met any men who could see clearly through that prism. Many women, but no men.

Thank God for the change. If all little boys whose dads stay at home with them have an experience equal to that of my grandson, in about 20 years, we are going to be blessed with the best crop of young men we've seen in a long, long time.





-Stu's Star Stuff

"Venus is the evening star." "No, Venus is the morning star." "No, Jupiter is the morning Actually, all of the above are correct.

It just depends on when.

Jupiter dropped out of sight late last month. The giant planet, along with all the others, has been trudging along its orbit, as has the Earth. As a result of these two motions, Jupiter now sits behind the sun, at what astronomers call "conjunction," or more properly, "conjunction with the sun." Because Jupiter's orbit is on a slightly different plane than ours, the planet usually appears above or below, rather than directly behind the sun. This time it passes above. Conjunction also marks Jupiter's official

anointment as a morning object. Several more weeks must pass, however, before Jupiter emerges from the sun's glare and becomes visible in the dawn glow ahead of sunrise

While today marks Jupiter's conjunction, tomorrow it will be Mercury's turn. The situation is somewhat different, however, with this speedy little planet. Because Mercury's orbit is smaller and inside the Earth's orbit, when it lines up with Sol, the planet can appear in front of or behind the sun. To distinguish those two possibilities, astronomers refer to superior conjunction when Mercury is beyond the sun and inferior conjunction when it lies between Sol and Earth. Tomorrow we note the former. With superior conjunction Mercury technically passes into the evening sky, but it won't become visible until the second week of August, and then with difficulty as it is quite low and so tiny.

Out of the fading blue of the western sky comes Venus, brilliant as ever and low on the horizon, heading for it's next conjunction. Mars and Saturn are up there too, but that's another program. For now let's just enjoy the show. And don't forget...it's free. Next week, back to basics.



Zebra Hunt Update

At Cal's 2001 birthday party we gave each kid a bucket and offered a bounty of a penny per mussel. The kids scoured the beach, removing over 1,000 mussels. They were restricted to a roped off area approximately 54' x 48' ... or, 2,592 square feet. So, that was nearly 1 mussel found in every 2 square feet!

This past weekend Cal and I harvested the area from knee-deep to the end of the pier and removed another 1,043 of the critters. These were mostly adult mussels (very bad on the feet). I was under the impression the Zebra mussels were primarily in a shallow band, say 10-20" deep ... not so. To clean the area waist deep I put on mask and snorkel. Swimming out 6' deep — sure

enough, the exposed rocks were sprouting mussels.

You can ignore this infestation for now, but if so, invest in water shoes. I keep thinking of the quote published in the Barker, 07/06/02: "... people better purchase a good rake because they'll need it to rake their beaches." -Don Winne, Executive Director, Michigan Lakes & Streams Association.

TWO-FER:

The Yacht Club bounty will continue through July. Kids who clean the beaches are asked to notify any Lake Director of their count — a penny per mussel will fund kids events at the Yacht Club. Last week I suggested property owners might offer to

pay the kids directly (on top of the YC bounty) so they would get both immediate and deferred reward. Well, we are doing it!

The owners on each side of our place have agreed to double the bounty. Any kids who want to harvest mussels can come clean the beaches at Mullins/Kings/Rogers this weekend. You will be paid a penny per mussel and the count will be reported to the Yacht Club. Please wear water shoes and bring a bucket.

Any other resident who wants to join in is encouraged to do so. If you will be around (to pay the kids) and want help, maybe put a bucket on your pier as a signal to the kids?
