
King to be Inducted into Hall of Fame

Congratulations to Birch Lake resident Bill King, who will be one of the five area athletes inducted this month into the Indiana Football Hall of Fame.

Bill, a 1946 Elkhart High school and 1950 Ball State Teachers College graduate, earned varsity letters in football and track. He was elected Captain as well as Most Valuable Player his senior year in high school. At Ball State he was Acting Captain for 3 years and Most Valuable Player for 2 years. He was an integral part of the Cardinals' only undefeated and untied Cardinal team in 1949.

He was drafted by the Cleveland Browns in 1950. He was Assistant Freshman Coach at Ball State, played for the Indianapolis Tryons Semi-Pro Team, and played two years on the Ft. Leonard Wood, Mo, 5th Army Championship Team. He also participated on the Post Track Team in shot put and discus, as well as went to the All Service Olympic Tryouts in California.

Bill is a charter member of the Ball State University Athletic Hall of Fame



and a recipient of the BSU Distinguished Alumni Award.

The induction will be June 27 at the St. Joseph Valley Chapter of the Indiana Hall of Fame Banquet being held at the St. Hedwig Memorial Center in South


Weather permitting.







Ever think about how far away those things are

up there? A few things are relatively close - the Moon, Venus, Mars. Some are very, very far - Deneb, Betelgeuse, Altair. Some even farther objects can only be seen using sophisticated equipment or even Earth-orbiting telescopes.

The distances between objects in the universe are so great that measuring them in miles would be like measuring the distance between New York and Los Angeles in inches. To measure these vast distances astronomers have developed their own units. The one you may be most familiar with is the light year. A light year has nothing to do with time. Nor does IST, yet we keep hearing about it. But I digress. A light year is the DISTANCE that light can travel in one year, about 6 trillion

miles.

Light, traveling at about 186,000 miles per second, takes about 1.25 seconds to travel from the Moon to us here at the lake. Light from Venus, which is about 100 times farther away, arrives here just over 2 minutes after leaving it's surface. Light from the Sun takes about 8 minutes to reach us, while the trip from Pluto, which currently is about $100 \times 100 = 10,000$ times farther away from us than the Moon, is not much more than 3 "light-hours" away.


The nearest star system to ours is about 4.3 light years away. There are individual stars that we can see with the naked eye that are 3,000 or 4,000 light years away. And the great Andromeda galaxy, which we can glimpse with the naked eye on autumn nights, is almost 3 million light years distant. That means the light

we see from it tonight left
there almost 3 million years
ago. What we're seeing is the way the
Andromeda galaxy looked 3 million years
before now. It's like a window back in time.
The Hubble Space Telescope has been able to
detect light from objects that began it's journey
to us before the Earth and Sun formed. And the
farthest reaches of the universe may be something like 15 billion light years away.

The Andromeda galaxy, and any of the stars out there for that matter, might not really even be there now. But their light continues to beam its way across the vacuum of space to put on the show that we all enjoy.

Next week, summer begins, weather or not.

The clock/is ticking for some lakes, and unresolved problems are killing them

According to Michigan Lake & Stream Associations, one of many unre solved problems in Michigan lakes is the exotic, Eurasian Milfoil..

Area residents hoped it would not come to their lake, but it did. Now they have it and hope it will go away - but it won't. When it moves into a lake, it grows wild on a big scale. A patch as big as a dining room table will grow to 10 acres in one year. Maintenance control may knock it back to 5 acres, but within two years it can come back and cover 40 acres and cost as much as \$30,000 to eradicate. Many lakes do not have a lake management program and to not know that it is absolutely essential to have an Eurasian Milfoil Watch.

Just like the plants growing on your land, you own the plants in the lake. Birch Lake is our responsibility as owners and managers. It is meaningful for the Water Quality Committee to have a map of aquatic vegetation and samples of the plants that grow in Birch Lake's garden. Keep the "good guys" and enjoy looking at them in the depths of the clear, clean water. Get rid of the "bad guys" before

they become a problem.

Because the Birch Lake Yacht Club a member of Michigan Lake & Stream Associations and water quality committee members attend the regional fall seminar, and spring conference, we learn from and work for water quality specialists who recommend what is best for Birch Lake. We follow through with their guidance, and with the data we have collected since 1978 to resolve a problem when it exists and to prevent other problems from occurring. Since we were one of three lakes chosen to participate in the 2001 program, our data now include Aquatic Plant Mapping.

Under a Memorandum of Understanding between Michigan State University and the Michigan Lake & Sream Associations, Howard Wandell provided professional assistance to Birch Lake's Water Quality Committee. He selected 24 transects in the lake. There were 3 sampling sites at each transect, at 1-foot, 4-feet, and 10-feet, giving a total of 72 sampling sites. The plant density numbers were totaled and divided by the total number of sampling sites to calculate its average density. A number was assigned to each of the density ratings: 1 for "found"; 2 for "sparse"; 3 for "heavy", and 4 for "dense". The average density for each plant species established the relative dominance and distribution of plants throughout Birch Lake.

The Mapping Project revealed that Birch Lake has moderate plant population consisting of good diversity of species, none of which dominates. Birch Lake is a marl lake with good clarity and few aquatic plants, which is consistent with the excellent condition of the lake.

Birch Lake is the jewel of Cass County. If we stay the course, we will stay the jewel.

The project revealed that Birch Lake did ndt have Eurasian Milfoil. Last summer, 2002, the Milfoil sites were checked. and Howard Wandell examined the samples. We still do not have the exotic.

The first time we find the "bad guy" we will hand-remove it carefully to not break off the fragments, and Birch Lake will keep smiling.



Well, were you able to guess any of the C power foods? I'll just go ahead and not keep you in suspense any longer.

Carrots - Silly rabbits are pretty smart. Studies show that these diet staples help to protect against heart disease, certain types of cancer, skin and eye disorders, constipation, and high cholesterol. WOW!

love em. Baby carrots are a favorite

and easy snack out on the boat.

Celery - Another high fiber favorite has been shown to lower blood pressure and reduce the risk of cancer. It's a favorite for its low calories and quick feeling of fullness.

Insoluble fiber is filling because it

absorbs water and adds bulk as it moves through

the digestive tract, a process that also keeps your digestive system working properly. Is rather high in sodium so you hypertension folks use sparingly.

Cherries - Cherries deserve more room in your diet than as a garnish to a sundae or Manhattan. They are a top source of perillyl alcohol, which kills cancer cells but spares



healthy cells. Studies have shown that this alcohol shrank pancreatic,

breast and liver tumors.

other fruits. Phenols are plant chemicals that lower oxidation of LDL ("bad") cholesterol.


Cranberries also make it hard for bacteria to stick around - literally. One 8 oz

glass of juice can stick around for up to 10 hours keeping bad bacteria E. coli from attaching to bladder walls and causing urinary tract infections. One more benefit, Dentists will tell you that cranberries prevent bacteria from adhering to teeth. Top to bottom, cranberries are a powerfully good choice.





