



Sometimes when I am pensive — reminiscing of the past Of when you were a child — my, my you grew up fast!


Grandma — Grandpa — Mom — Dad That cottage — this cottage — that shore — this shore I know my lovely blue Will always be protected — by families like you.




Once again, we're going to try to sail at 11 am, and if the weather doesn't cooperate, we'll try again at Noon.



# Get your boat checked Sunday!

Sgt. Dan Covey and other members of the Marine Division of the Cass County Sheriff's Department will be conducting a free boat check tomorrow, Sunday, June 29 from 9 am to 11 am (Indiana time) at the Public Landing.

Covey says that because of the new decal/certification, the check will be more time consuming and thorough than in years past, and special attention will be paid to the required equipment and to the placement and condition of boats' "MC" numbers and registration stickers.

Boats that pass the inspection will be

given a decal to post, which will alert police agencies that the boat is in compliance with state laws.

Boats that do not pass the inspection will be given the opportunity to leave and correct any infractions, and then return for a re-inspection.

Anyone who is unable to correct the boat on Sunday, or who is unable to attend Sunday's checkout, can still get their boat checked by contacting Covey and scheduling an appointment.

Covey noted that the laws have not



changed since last year. A supply of handbooks of Michigan Boating Laws and Responsibilities will be available at the Yacht Club at tonight's Vice Commodore's Party.



#### HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION NEWS

Jim Bolinger has been selected to fill the remainder of Dean Davis' term on the board of the Homeowners' Association. Dean Davis, one of the founders of the Homeowners' Association and a member of its board since its inception, resigned from the board earlier this year. Elections for a new board will take place in August this year.

Something to think about as Independence Day nears and reminds us of that familiar motive to the Revolution; "No taxation without representation..." As many of you know from personal experience, Michigan has an interesting school tax law which permits property owners who can vote (residents) to decide whether to impose three times as much

school tax millage as they pay on property owners who can't vote (second home owners). Of course, the law is worded more cleverly — the tax rate difference results from a "homestead exemption" for a primary residence — but the effect is the same because those who don't qualify for the homestead exemption also don't qualify to vote.) Human nature being what it is, those who can vote have in the past almost invariably chosen to stick their neighbors who can't vote with a higher tax. For instance, while voting residents of Birch Lake in the Constantine school district pay six mills school tax, their non-voting neighbors must pay roughly 18 mills. It was therefore somewhat of a pleasant surprise to learn that voters recently passed up a chance to stick it even harder to the nonvoters. The

Headlee amendment to the school tax law provides that if the property tax base increases faster than inflation, the tax rate is reduced slightly to compensate. That has happened in the Constantine district, so instead of 18 mills, the non-voting property owners have recently been paying a little over 17½ mills. Although that isn't much of a break, it apparently bothered the Constantine School board enough to ask the voters to restore the full 18 mill school tax on those who can't vote. That attempt at taxation without representation failed to pass. Although property owners who can't vote still aren't treated equally with those who can vote, they are being treated slightly less unequally - at least until the next time the matter is brought to



# Of hunting dogs and Charles' heart

Canes Venatici (KAY-neez Veh-NAT-ih-sigh), the Hunting Dogs, nip at the heels of the Great Bear, Ursa Major. The constellation is faint, its brightest star is only 3rd magnitude, but not too difficult to find, thanks to the Big Dipper nearby and no other stars as bright in the vicinity. Cor Caroli, that brightest star, sits 15 degrees under the end of the Big Dipper's handle. That's about the same length as the span of the handle. It lies roughly on a line between the Dipper's Bowl and the bright star Arcturus. (Remember "Arc to Arcturus"?)

Cor Caroli has nothing to do with hunting or dogs. The name is Latin for "Heart of Charles," referring to King Charles II of England. Edmund Halley, of comet fame and Astronomer Royal of England, created the designation in 1725. It seems that astronomers, long ago as today, were not immune from the realities of politics.

In centuries past, when astronomers relied on the royal purse to support their work, they often thought it was a nice gesture to name something in the heavens for their benefactors. Galileo named the moons of Jupiter for the Medici family, and William Herschel named a new planet for King George. Other astronomers ignored those names, though, so today we have the "Galilean" moons of Jupiter, and the planet Uranus.

To the unaided eye, Cor Caroli is modest. But telescopes reveal a beautiful sight: Cor Caroli is really TWO stars, which are bound to each other by gravity.

The brighter and heavier of the two stars is a bit odd. Its magnetic field is many times stronger than the Sun's. And it contains a higher percentage of heavy elements, like iron, which are dredged to the surface by the magnetic field. What's more,

the heavy elements are unevenly distributed at the surface of Cor Caroli, so astronomers see concentrations of different elements as it turns on its axis.

Look for this magnetic and regal "heart" below the Dipper's handle this evening, and watch as it rises throughout the night. Next week, Universal Time vs IST - no contest.


#### Denim, Golf shirt, towels




