
What a wonderful Birch Lake tribute to the U.S.A. The fireworks were paramount and cottagers' additions to the red, white and blue added more oohs and ahs.




#### **Boat Parade Winners**

# Birch Lake Recipes of the Week

THAI CHICKEN BROCCOLI WRAPS by Darlene Troyer

Six 8- to 10-inch plain, red, and/or green flour tortillas
1/2 teaspoon garlic salt
1/4 - 1/2 teaspoons pepper

3/4 pound skinless, boneless chicken breast strips for stir-frying

1 tablespoon cooking oil

4 cups packaged shredded broccoli (broccoli slaw mix)

1 medium red onion, cut into thin wedges

1 teaspoon grated fresh ginger

1 recipe Peanut Sauce (recipe follows)

Wrap tortillas in paper towels. Microwave on high power for 30 seconds to soften. (Or, wrap tortillas in foil. Heat in a 350 degree F. oven for 10 minutes.)

In a small bowl combine garlic salt and pepper. Add chicken; toss to coat evenly. In a large skillet cook and stir seasoned chicken in hot oil over medium-high heat for 2 to 3 minutes or until cooked through. Remove from skillet; keep warm. Add broccoli, onion, and ginger to skillet. Cook and stir for 2 to 3 minutes or until vegetables are crisptender.

To assemble, spread each tortilla with about 1 tablespoon Peanut Sauce. Top with chicken strips and vegetable

mixture. Roll up each tortilla, securing with a toothpick. Serve immediately with remaining sauce. Makes 6 servings.

Peanut Sauce: In a small saucepan combine 1/4 cup sugar, 1/4 cup creamy peanut butter, 3 tablespoons soy sauce, 3 tablespoons water, 2 tablespoons cooking oil, and 1 teaspoon bottled minced garlic. Heat until sugar is dissolved, stirring frequently. Makes about 2/3 cup.

#### ORZO-BROCCOLI PILAF by Darlene Troyer

2 teaspoons olive oil
1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
1/2 cup chopped onion
2/3 cup orzo (rosamarina)
1 14-ounce can reduced-sodium chicken broth
1/2 cup shredded carrot
1 teaspoon dried marjoram, crushed
1/8 teaspoon pepper
2 cups small broccoli flowerets

In a large saucepan heat olive oil over medium-high heat. Cook and stir the mushrooms and onion in hot oil until onion is tender. Stir in the orzo. Cook and stir about 2 minutes more or until orzo is lightly browned. Remove

from heat.

Carefully stir in the chicken broth, carrot, marjoram, and pepper. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer, covered, about 15 minutes or until orzo is tender but still firm. Remove saucepan from heat; stir in broccoli. Let stand, covered, for 5 minutes. Makes six 2/3-cup servings.

## ARTICHOKE-CHILI DIP by Darlene Troyer

One 14-oz. can artichoke hearts 1 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese 3/4 cup sour cream 3/4 cup mayonnaise 1/2 (4-oz.) can Diced Green Chiles 1 clove garlic

PREHEAT oven to 350°F.
COMBINE artichokes, 3/4cup
cheese, sour cream, mayonnaise, chiles
and garlic in medium bowl; stir well.
Spoon into 1-quart casserole dish.
Sprinkle with remaining cheese.

BAKE for 25 to 30 minutes or until bubbly. Serve with bread cubes, pita wedges or tortilla chips

# Birch Lake Recipes of the Week

LEMON SQUARES

by Darlene Troyer

This easy-to-make treat is a cool taste any time of the year, but especially fresh when planning your summer desserts.

2-1/4 cup flour, divided

1/2 cup confectioners sugar

I cup butter or oleo

1 tsp baking powder

4 eggs

2 cups granulated sugar

1 tbsp lemon peel

4-1/2 tbsp lemon juice (from 2 lemons)

Mix 2 cups flour and confectioners sugar. Cut in oleo until particles resemble small peas.

With your hands, work into a dough and press into the bottom of a 13x9x2" pan. When putting the crust in the pan, pat on the bottom and also pat the mixture up the sides of your pan.

Bake 15 minutes in preheated 350-degree oven.

Meanwhile, mix the remaining 1/4 cup of flour and baking powder and set aside.

Beat the eggs until fluffy; stir in granulated sugar, lemon peel, lemon juice, and flour mixture until blended. Pour on hot crust and bake 25 minutes more, or until filling is set and top is light brown.

Cool on rack and cut into 48 squares.



# How the scorpion lost its claws

This time of year one of my favorite summer constellations, Scorpius (not Scorpio), reaches its highest point in the south near the end of evening twilight. A graceful curve of stars dips down toward the lake and stretches from the scorpion's head, on the right, through its bright heart, Antares, and on to the tip of its tail. The flowing pattern seems to relax the eye as your vision wanders down that string of stars.

The constellations of the zodiac are ancient — they were drawn thousands of years ago. But that doesn't mean they haven't changed over the centuries. Individual stars have been shuffled between constellations, creating slightly different pictures in the night sky.

Probably the biggest change was the creation of a new constellation from part of an old one. The "claws" of Scorpius, the scorpion, were pulled away to create Libra, the balance scales. The timing of the split is unclear, although it dates at least to the days of ancient Rome. And the concept of Libra as a "balance" suggests the constellation may be much older. More than 4,000 years ago, the Sun appeared against the stars of Libra at the time of the autumnal equinox — a time when day and night are equal — a "balance" in the heavens.

Whenever the split occurred, some of the stars of Libra retain their association with the scorpion. Libra's brightest stars are named Zubenelgenubi and Zubeneschamali — the southern and northern claws.

Seek out Scorpius tonight before the Moon rises so you can better examine its details. Look for Libra a bit higher and to the west of the scorpion's head. What a pity for northern observers that Scorpius doesn't climb higher above the horizon. The summer haze that frequently lingers near the horizon combines with light pollution and obscures all but the brightest part of the scorpion.



# The ABCs of healthy eating

## JUST FOR THE HEALTH OF IT

Lentils — Low in fat and rich in protein, lentils help reduce cholesterol and



stabilizes blood sugar and battle illnesses ranging from cancer to

heart disease. Lentils main power source is iron which is vital for immunity, healthy pregnancy, and anemia prevention. Listen up ladies, Isoflavones in lentils lowers the risk of heart disease and also eases some of the symptoms of perimenopause and menopause. The fiber in lentils helps to stabilize blood-sugar levels.

Melons — What a great time a year for melons. These fragrant fruits help prevent cardiovascular disease, certain cancers, and vision loss. There main power source is soluble pectin fiber which lowers cholesterol. Melons also contain Zeaxanthin, a carotenoid, which is a vital component in the retina. It helps to protect against vision loss by shielding the eye from damaging ultraviolet radiation. Because of its orange hue, cantaloupe is the best melon you can eat for beta-carotene, the orangeyellow pigment that may protect against acne, certain forms of cancer, and vision loss. Honeydew and can-



taloupe provide potassium, which lowers blood pressure and

reduces the onset of heart disease and stroke. Watermelon is a particularly good source of the antioxidant pigment lycopene. Studies link a lycopene-rich diet with a low risk of cancer, particularly prostate cancer.

Mushrooms — With an ancient tradition as a healing food, mushrooms have dis-

ease-fighting compounds that continue to be heralded



today. They are believed to have an impact on cancer, heart disease, high

blood pressure, viral infections, and other ailments. In one study, Japanese men who ate about four ounces of fresh shiitakes a week — or two ounces of dried — experienced a substantial reduction in cholesterol within seven days. Eritadenine, found in shiitake mushrooms, lowers cholesterol.

Selenium, an antioxidant. mineral, is thought to protect against cancer and macular degeneration. The thioproline in shiitakes may block the formation of cancer - causing nitrogen compounds. Lentinula edodes

mycelium (LEM), another compound in shiitakes, prevents cancer, heart disease, high cholesterol, high blood pressure, infection, and liver disease. So the next time your doing those steaks or burgers on the grill be sure to top em with sautéed shiitakes just for the health of it.

Throw in a side salad and this week's power foods become a whole, healthy meal your family and guests will love.
