On August 23rd at 7 a.m, we will be re-roofing the Nurses Infirmary at Camp Tannadoonah.



# The tale of the Birch Lake slave wagon

# SLAVE WAGON DISCOVERED ON BIRCH LAKE BOTTOM

Divers today continued efforts to recover what they believe to be a wagon that local legend says has been at the bottom of Birch Lake, near Vandalia, MI, for more than a century.

At various times over the years, swimmers in Birch Lake have reported finding what seemed to be parts of a wagon in 15' of water at the east end of the lake. Where the divers are working is not far from the cottages of V.M. Ball and Chester Hemminger of Elkhart.

On February 15, 1937, the Dowagiac Daily News published an account that Perry Storey of Vandalia had told members of the Cassopolis Service Club and the businessmen's association of Cassopolis that his father had told him about the wagon.

### SEEN BY DIVER

The summer before, Storey said, a diver said he had seen the wagon under water. In the days of the Underground Railroad, by which escaped slaves escaped from the South, Penn township in Cass County was a terminal for the railroad. The Negroes were given safe haven by Quaker farmers who had migrated to Cass County from Pennsylvania, and who had given the name Penn township to their settlement.

In 1847 slave owners of Bourbon county, KY, organized an expedition to



come to Michigan to recover some of their runaway slaves. The Birch Lake Barker, mimeographed publication circulated several years ago among Birch Lake residents, carried this account of that invasion: "They arrived in the month of August and camped near Shavehead Lake.

They knew exactly where the runaways were living, as they had sent a spy up the previous winter. "The spy made several maps and reported their location to the slave owners."

### ROUTED BY QUAKERS

"The Kentuckians captured several men, women and a baby living on the Odell farm. The alarm spread, and from all over the Birch Lake area angry farmers gathered, armed with guns, scythes and clubs. The Kentuckians were stopped and surrounded at the Osborne farm. Their wagons were overturned and later dumped into Birch Lake."

The residents at Birch Lake today believe it is one of these wagons that has been located. The Underground Railroad traveled by two routes. One northward from Cincinnati, through Indiana, the other from St. Louis, through Illinois.

### MARKED BY MONUMENT

They converged just east of Cassopolis at the home of Stephen Bogue. A monument now marks this spot on M60, at what has become known as the Elk Park farm because of the herd of elk maintained there by the Bonine family in Cass county. The Bonines no longer own the farm.

Stations of the route were about 20 miles apart.

One is believed to have been in an old home in Bristol. The Birch Lake divers say the wagon on which they are working is buried upside down in sand and marl, and task of uncovering it will be long and tedious. Friday they used an air hose to blow silt deposits away from a wheel and worked it free. They worked until 5 o'clock Friday evening and were to resume work today.

I wanted to share this Birch Lake legend with all my fellow Birch Lakers, young and old. I remember hearing this story as a child, and have often wondered how many of these wagons could still be on the bottom of the lake. This is how the article appeared in The Elkhart Truth dated in the 1950's.

# Birch Lake Recipes of the Week

### Heath Bits Monkey Bread

- 2-15 oz pkgs frozen bread dough rolls
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 1/2 t. cinnamon
- ½ cup chopped nuts
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 6oz.pkg Heath Bits divided
- 1 3 oz pkg regular (not instant) butterscotch pudding dry mix
- ½ cup marganne, cut in small pieces

### Preheat oven to 350

Grease a bundt pan. Lay frozen bread dough balls in bottom of pan. Mix sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle over dough. Sprinkle

remaining ingredients over dough in order listed above

Cover with a towel and let rise 4 hours at room temperature(or make before you go to bed and pop in oven when you get up). Place on a sheet of foil on oven rack (to catch the drips) Bake at 350 for 30-40 minutes or until golden brown. Let set 5 minutes and then invert onto platter. Serve WARM!!!

### Irish Coffee Pie

- 1 3 ½ oz pkg vanilla whipped dessert mix (Dream Whip)
- 2 t. instant coffee powder 1/2 cup cold milk

3 T. Irish Whiskey ½ cup whipping cream

In small mixer bowl combine Dream Whip and instant coffee powder. Add milk' beat at high speed of mixer one minute. Blend in 1/3 cup water and Irish Whiskey' beat at high speed till fluffy, about 2 more minutes. Whip cream; fold into a prepared pie shell and chill for 3-4 hours. 

# Birch boaters lead the county in boat checks

Sgt. Dan Covey, the head of the Cass County Sheriff's Department's Marine Division, has reported that Birch Lake led the county in the number of boats that have been voluntarily checked by his department.

Covey said that on the day he and his crew checked boats for safety (and issued stickers indicating compliance), that 35 boats were checked at Birch Lake, compared to 14 that were checked at Diamond

Lake, the group with the second highest number.

# Stu's Star Stuff

One of the most recognizable star patterns in the sky is high above the north shore on summer nights. The Big Dipper, most likely the first constellation we each ever noticed or recognized, is also called Ursa Major, the Big Bear. Ancient Egyptians saw the pattern as a hippopotamus, not ever having seen bears. The Big Dipper can be used as a starting point to finding many other constellations and individual stars. One that would seem most obvious to look for next would be the Little Dipper. I always find this a treat to be able to see, because none of the stars in Ursa Minor, or the Small Bear, are very bright. Being at the lake away from (most of the) bright lights allows us to see some of the

fainter stars that would otherwise be blocked out by city glare.


The handle of the Dipper is the Little Bear's tail and the Dipper's cup is the Bear's flank. The star at the end of the handle is Polaris, the North Star. The North Star is not very bright, but it has a special function in the sky. Because it indicates true north, sailors have used Polaris for navigation for centuries. If you were to stand on the North Pole of the Earth, Polaris would be directly overhead. It would remain overhead all night long, while all the other stars in the sky circle around it. Because the Earth has a slight wobble in it's spinning motion, like a spinning top wobbles around, Polaris is only temporarily at


the North Pole. This wobbling is called precession. In about 14,000 years, Vega will be the North Star and another 14,000 years after that, it will be Polaris again.

To find Ursa Minor, first find the Big Dipper. If you follow the two stars at the end of the cup upwards (out of the cup of the Big Dipper), the next bright star you will run into is Polaris. The distance to Polaris on the sky is about five times the angle between the two stars at the end of the cup of the Big Dipper. Because they are so useful for finding the all-important North Star, these two stars are known as the Pointer Stars. They are also called Dubhe and Merak. Merak is the one at the bottom of the cup.

Next week, "arcing to Arcturus", dumping water on Leo's back, and the lady with the mirror.

# A Life that Matters

One of the questions people ask fiction writers is "Where do you get the ideas for your stories?" My usual answer is that they come from everywhere, but many of them come from the pages of newspapers. Last winter when Shirley Anne and I were in Naples, Florida, I saw an article in the local paper about a wealthy socialite from Tampa who had recently been released from prison.

She conspired with two men to murder her husband, and all three of them went to prison "for life." One of the men died in jail, the victim of another killing, and the second man is still serving time. The woman, who had been in prison for 27 years and whose health was failing, had been paroled. She had done her best to slip away quietly to live with relatives in some small Florida town, but the press remembered her and dug up her story once again.

Before the death of her husband she was a beautiful, wealthy, popular, woman whose social calendar was always full, and who was admired and envied by many. She traveled extensively, lived in a gorgeous home, and dressed in clothes that few can afford. Today she is sick, tired, broke and nearly friendless, and she is starting over.

I cut that article out, not because I had any interest in the details of her crime, but because three questions nagged at me:

- What would a person in those circumstances do now?
- When was the last moment before the crime when she might have called the whole thing off?

- Why do some people waste themselves while others fill each day with the best they can find?

The first of those questions became the generator of a short story that will appear in Hand-Held Crime later this month, and the second will influence a book I'm beginning in the fall, but the third question brought me back here to Birch Lake and to John Scofield.


John and his wife Laveta have lived in the cove for almost all of the 41+ years I've been coming to Birch Lake. They bought a lot between the Wentworths and (what became) the Waggoners and built a home that looks as well kept and well made today as it did when I watched it go up four decades ago.

The Wentworths, Starr and Millie, were Shirley Anne's parents, so we saw a lot of the Scofields. Their older daughter, Anina, or Nina as we knew her, was about the age of our daughter Lisa, and the youngest Scofield, Dawn, was the age of our daughter, Dawn. The girls played together and kept their eyes on the Scofield son, John (Mike), every summer, until we bought our own place on the East side of the lake.

Over the years, John and Laveta were perfect neighbors, and when Starr became ill, John's help enabled Millie to hold onto her place until she was really ready to sell. We lived far away during some of the worst times and John looked out for our family.

Dean Davis has told me wonderful


John Scofield stories that demonstrate what



a wise and thoughtful fellow John was, and Bill King speaks of John as though he was talking about a brother. Nancy Walker's voice was full of emotion, gratitude, and admiration, when she told me how John "showed up each morning, wearing his tool belt" to help her family build their house "as though it were his job." "I was never able to thank him enough," she said.

He worked without fanfare or pay for dozens of people and causes around the lake. He was lean and strong and handsome and he lived a life that demonstrated to any who watched him, how to live a good life. John was incapable of bragging or of bringing attention to himself, but he did so many fine things for so many of us that they could not all go unnoticed.

Think of that sad, empty woman from Florida. What a waste she made of her life and what damage she did to others. Couldn't she have been a glorious person if she had known John Scofield and followed his example.
