
#### Walker graduates from Colorado State

# Swimmer's itch/What it is, does and how to pre-

The technical name for swimmer's itch is cercarial dermatitis. Swimmer's itch is a patchy red pinpoint skin rash associated with itching on the parts of the body that have been in the water. Swimmer's itch is usually not severe. After the initial transient itching it will disappear without treatment. The itching occurs within 48 hours and may last up to 7 days. Rarely, it can be severe if a large proportion of the body is affected. The major, although not the only, cause of swimmer's itch are trematode parasites of aquatic/migrating birds. The life cycles of these parasites involve snails as the first host and aquatic birds or some mammals as the final

The larval parasite called a "cercaria" is released by snails and causes dermatitis when it mistakenly penetrates a person's skin rather than

it rightful host, usually a duck.

Common lore is that this is caused by "duck fleas" in freshwater — this is incorrect. Trematode parasites cause the freshwater swimmer's itch.

At one time or other in the past 70 years, since it's major cause was first identified in Douglas Lake, Michigan, swimmer's itch has been reported in almost every country in the world

Swimmer's itch occurs the water temperature reaches the appropriate level for snails to reproduce and grow rapidly, and when migrating aquatic birds infected with the parasite return from their winter habitats or domesticated aquatic birds return to full activity.

Specific diagnosis is difficult. There is no widely available blood test that gives specific indication that cercaria have caused the itching. The best confirmation of the cause is

based on knowing from other people that swimmer's itch occurs in the place where one swam or entered the water.

Treatment may not be necessary when there are only a few itching spots. An antihistaminic or mild corticosteroid cream purchased over the counter in pharmacies can be beneficial. If the initial itching is severe, then scratching can cause abrasions and skin infections may develop. If the symptoms persist for longer than 3 days, a dermatologist should be seen. Prescription medications may help reduce the itching.

Here are some tips to prevent swimmer's itch: avoid swimming for long periods in shallow water

- avoid swimming in areas where swimmer's itch is a problem and where there is an onshore
- **■** towel off immediately after leaving the water may help reducing swim-

mer's itch caused by cercariae of some species that enter only as the water dries on the skin

- do not encourage birds to stay in your area by feeding them
- avoid placing rip-rap on your shore. This provides an excellent surface for certain species of snails to attach their eggs. The higher the number of snails, the greater the chance for swimmer's itch.

Editor's Note: As usual, after a weekend of spring fun at Birch Lake, I (and several members of my family) are once again suffering with the dreaded swimmer's itch. Even though we print this info every year, a lot of people remain oblivious ... be advised that the condition is relatively harmless (although quite a nuisance for a week or so), and the parasite that causes it almost always disappears in a couple of weeks.



## Stu's Star Stuff



rare astronomical event occurred on Tuesday morning. Did you see it? No, Stu. You didn't tell us about it. Oops, sorry. My bad.

Early risers in the eastern United States had a chance to view a rare astronomical event on Tuesday ... a transit of the planet Venus across the face of the Sun. Venus appeared as a black dot against the bright solar disk.

The last transit took place in 1882. Venus transits occur in pairs, with the second transit coming eight years after the first. But it's more than a century between pairs.

The transits of the 18th and 19th cen-

turies were among the most intensely studied astronomical events in history.

Astronomers used the transits to measure the distance from Earth to the Sun. By viewing the transits from different points on Earth, astronomers saw Venus at slightly different angles against the Sun. By calculating those angles, they determined the Sun's distance to within a hundred thousand miles.

Today, astronomers know the distance to the Sun with high precision, so the transit has less scientific interest. But it's still a rare event. It began at 12:13 a.m. Central Time, when Venus first appeared to touch the Sun's disk. It ended more than six hours later. The


best views came from Asia, Europe, and Africa.


From the eastern United States, the transit was underway as the Sun rose, and ended shortly thereafter. If you missed it you can watch the entire transit on the web. One site you can try is stardate.org.

a Stephen King fan but I liked this story.


■ Silence of the Lambs by Thomas Harris. Where do they get these ideas from?
