Public Enemy: Purple Loosestrife

THE PURPLE PLAGUE

Are you an admirer of the purple flowering plants that are cropping up along roadways and in wetlands all over Michigan? Did you know that this plant, called purple loosestrife (Lythrum salicaria), is an aggressive invader of North American wetland habitats?

THE PLANT

Purple loosestrife is a

native of Europe and Asia which has spread throughout much of the United States and Canada.

Purple loosestrife grows an impressive four to seven feet

tall. Its blooms are long spikes of beautiful purple



seeds per year. THE PROBLEM

It grows

A fierce competitor, purple loosestrife eventually overtakes native vegetation, forming nearly impenetrable stands of this single species. As the native plants are reduced, so too are the wildlife species that depend on them.

Dense stands of purple loosestrife also impair recreational use of wetlands and rivers and impede water flow in drainage ditches.

THE SOLUTION

Birch Lake has had a

purple loosestrife program since 1999. Bruce and Sue Wagner and Rick Russwurm are the volunteers for the program.

The shore line is inspected through-out the summer. The plants are identified then properly removed. The program has been very successful. At the start there were 10 sites on all the shores of Birch Lake, some of which were heavily infested. Last year there were four sites that were slightly or moderately infested, confined to the west shore. We are hopeful that we will see a continued improvement this year.

We ask that every one keep a look out for this purple plague. If you think you have found it or suspect a plant please contact Rick Russwurm or The Wagners to identify it.





Summer triangle reigns ...

he three bright stars that outline the Summer Triangle really stand out this week. There's no Moon in the evening sky, so the stars don't have to compete with its glare. The triangle stands low in the east and northeast as darkness falls, but wheels high overhead during the night.

The summer triangle isn't really a constellation, or asterism at all. It's simply a triangle defined by 3 bright stars, Deneb, Vega and Altair. The brightest star in the triangle is Vega, in the constellation Lyra, the harp. Vega's also the highest in the sky during the evening hours, so it's easy to spot.

Vega looks so bright for a couple of reasons. First, it really IS fairly bright — it produces about 50 times more visible light than the

Sun does. And second, it's one of our closest neighbors, at a distance of just 25 light-years. That means the light we see from Vega tonight actually left the star 25 years ago.

Well to the lower right of Vega, look for Altair, the brightest star in Aquila, the eagle. It's even closer than Vega — just 17 light-years. Altair is similar to Vega, though not as bright. Both stars shine pure white.

The final member of the triangle is Deneb, to the lower left of Vega. It forms the "tail" of the cross-shaped constellation Cygnus, the swan. Deneb looks just about as bright as Altair. But if we could line up all three stars of the Summer Triangle at the same distance from Earth, Deneb would blow the other two stars away. It's a supergiant star that shines

about 1700 times brighter than Vega. It shines prominently in the night sky of Earth — even thought it's almost 1500 light-years away.

With the Moon out of the way, we can see many of the stars inside the triangle, too. One of the most popular is Albireo, the second-brightest star in Cygnus, the swan. To our eyes alone, it looks like a single, relatively faint star. But binoculars or a telescope reveal TWO stars. One looks yellow-orange, while the other appears sapphire blue. A nineteenthcentury writer said the system presents "perhaps the most lovely effect of colour in the heavens."

The colors tell us the surface temperatures of the two stars. The yellow-orange star, for example, is cooler than our own star,

the Sun. It's a giant star, which means it's many times larger than the Sun. The blue star, on the other hand, is much hotter than the Sun. Blue stars "burn" their nuclear fuel much more quickly than other stars, so they live shorter lifetimes.

The stars of Albireo are perhaps 385 light-years from Earth. That means the light we see from Albireo tonight actually left the stars around the time the pilgrims arrived at Plymouth Rock.

During the evening hours, look for Albireo a little below Vega, and the rest of the Summer triangle. Enjoy the show. It's free..

Ø Five Smooth Stones (Fairbairn)


