or a few years now, my grandma (Peggy Cowen, with the little, gray, twostory in the cove) has been bugging me to write an article for the Birch Barker.

My responses were constantly "maybe later,"
"there's nothing to write about that anyone would be interested in," "who cares what a kid has to say," or sometimes, when she bugged me until I was irritated, I would start off on a rant starting with "What's the point?"

At least now I'm back on my grandma's good side and I really did write that article she wanted me to write. It isn't much, but you can find it elsewhere in the paper.



Turn your eyes to the southern sky

he southern sky holds a couple of wonderful constellations; favorites of summertime sky watchers. Sagittarius and Scorpius sit low at nightfall and just to the left (east) of due south. Experienced observers usually think of Sagittarius as the "teapot" because the outline traced by its brighter stars bears a resemblance to that piece of tableware. Sagittarius hosts a number of well known "deep sky objects" within reach of small telescopes and binoculars. Look before the middle of next week when the bright Moon arrives in that area.

While known to most observers as the "teapot," the classical representation for Sagittarius is the Archer. The names of several of the constellation's stars allude to this ancient centaur figure armed with bow and arrow. The star at the top of the "lid" is Kaus Borealis, which literally means "northern (part of) bow." At the bottom of the spout is Kaus Australis, or "southern bow." Between the two, resides Kaus Meridionalis, "middle bow." And the spout's tip, Nasl or Nash, translates as "the point" (of the arrow).

Scorpius, the scorpion, also skitters across the southern sky. Summer is a pretty good time of year to watch Scorpius. Its tail clears the southeastern horizon in late evening, and the scorpion remains visible for the rest of the night.

The brightest star in Scorpius is Antares, which is in the middle of the scorpion's curving body.

This brilliant red star is one of the behemoths of our stellar neighborhood. If you placed it at the center of our own solar system, it would swallow Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars, and almost reach Jupiter.

Antares is so big because it's nearing the end of its life. The star's nuclear furnace has consumed its original hydrogen fuel, and is now "burning" heavier helium. As the star switched fuels, its outer layers puffed up like a balloon.

Antares will someday consume its helium, too, converting it to heavier elements like carbon and oxygen, which will in turn continue to feed the star's nuclear fires.

Eventually, though, Antares no longer will be able to use the elements in its core as fuel. The star will explode as a supernova, outshining even the Moon in Earth's sky. All that will remain of Antares will be a crushed corpse: either a neutron star — a ball so dense that a teaspoon of its matter would weigh millions of tons -- or a black hole — an object with such powerful gravity that not even light could escape from it.

But don't mark your calendars just yet. Antares will be part of the show for quite some time to come. And it will continue to be free.




