

Rounding out the meal you may select green beans al almond, country baked beans. Grandma's potato salad, and scrumptious cookies.



Individual cash prizes were awarded for the longest and straightest drives, closest to the pin and longest putt.


After the golf all contestants chowed down on prime rib provided by Brian Lower from Eddies Steak Shed in Granger, IN.

Sky tips from a cool frood

ow. This is going to be tough.
Being here at the lake this week I don't have access to my usual sources of cut and paste (read plageriseable) information. But not to worry. Now that this column is appearing in the Reader's Digest Large-Print-Edition format it shouldn't be too much of a problem filling up a good portion of a page.

Here are a couple of things to look for this week ... The Big Dipper. The Little Dipper. The Little Dipper is easier to spot here at the lake than in town. The darker skies allow you to follow the pointer stars, the two that form the outermost portion of the bowl, over to Polaris, the North Star, at the end of the handle of Ursa Minor. Continue along that line to the lazy W, Casseopiea.

In the south, enjoy the Tea Pot formation of Sagitarius. Above and a little left look for the Tea Spoon. To the west of Sagitarius look for the great scorpion, Scorpius. (not Scorpio or Serpico)

As always keep a sharp eye out for meteors and flying

saucers. The Persiod meteor shower will peak on Wednesday. Best viewing hours are after midnight when our portion of Earth is traveling headlong into the path of the comet debris that brings us the show. As for the flying saucers, the Vogon space parade is week after next but there's always a few that get started early. Get out there and have some fun. Oops, sorry. I meant the show is free

Graphic Novels are the new wave in getting teens to read. If you're not familiar with this type of book think: good story in comic book form. I don't if any teachers will accept these titles for a book report but they are definitely worth picking up and reading. While I haven't read all of these titles, so I didn't make personal comments, they have all been highly recommended by the library community.

Ø Maus: A Survivor's Tale (Spiegleman)
A memoir about Vladek Spiegleman, a Jewish survivor of Hitler's Europe, and about his son, a cartoonist who tries to come to terms with his father, his story, and with history itself. Cartoon format portrays Jews as mice and Nazis as cats. Powerful stuff! There is also Maus II.

Ø Shutterbug Follies (Little)
Bee, a photo-finishing technician at a one-hour lab in lower Manhattan, becomes dangerously

curious after a photojournalist brings in a strange picture of a naked corpse. This one is for a more mature reader. It does have adult content.

Ø Astro City: Life in the Big City (Busiek) A collection of the first six volumes from the comic-book series "Astro City," which chronicles the hopes, dreams, and trials of ordinary people and superheroes in a city with a long history of protection from such powerful figures as Samaritan and Winged Victory.

Ø Jimmy Corrigan: Smartest Kid on Earth (Ware)

A graphic novel about a lonely thirty-six-year-old man named Jimmy Corrigan, who meets his father for the first time and contemplates the worth of his own existence.

Ø <u>Usagi Yojimbo: Grasscutter</u> (Sakai) Usagi Yojimbo, a samurai rabbit, having come into possession of the Grasscutter, the lost sword of the Gods, finds himself the target of the Conspiracy of Eight, a shadowy group that wants to overthrow the shogunate.

#50 from Cecil and Millie Dixon in 1968. Bruce served as Commodore in 1970.


Bruce's favorite memory at Birch Lake is the 10 years he taught sailing at Camp Tannadoonah.






