


Happy Birthday Helen!





Luau Madness!!!





Homeowners Association update

The Birch Lake Yacht Club's Homeowners Association held its annual meeting last Saturday, Aug. 7.

Scott Troeger opened the meeting and apologized for the problems with the printed notification of the meeting. Troeger reported that the group has \$4,330 in available funds (after spending \$1,250 for the safety booklet earlier this year). He explained that the association has a policy to keep \$2,500 in its account as an emergency fund, but they are actively soliciting suggestions for projects to fund this year. Some potential projects include establishing a contingency fund for additional marine patrols on high-traffic days, funding equipment for the County Sheriff Department's Marine Division, funding a program to control the geese, and the possibility of posting safety signs around the lake.

Jim Bolinger discussed on the history of the association. He noted that the group was formed to monitor property values and safety. Board members monitor township and county governmental activities that might impact the lake, attending meetings of the township board, planning, zoning and zoning appeals boards, and County Commissioners and Board of Public Works.

Bolinger reported that the only unresolved issue is a potential private road ordinance that has been before the board for nearly two years. He further reported that the zoning board previously adopted a 'keyholing' ordinance designed to limit development around the lakes.

Bolinger gave a report on the history of the sewer project. He reported that the contracts for construction have been awarded and work is expected to start as soon as state permits are received. The project is expected to be completed by the end of 2005.

Bolinger discussed the controversy that has led to the makeup of the new township board, and that board's recent decisions to replace several

zoning and appeals boards members. Rick Russwurm is no longer on the zoning board of appeals. Bob Morrison is now on the zoning board.

Questions following the presentation touched on matters of funding and costs for the sewer project, authority, whether or not the project could be stopped and the effect of that effort, and the effect the sewer might have on Camp Tannadoonah.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:54.

Where are all the bricks?

A few of the lake residents have asked where the bricks are that were donated for the Camp Tannadoonah Murphy Sports Complex. As with most fund raising events, things move more slowly than planned. BUT, the bricks have been engraved and are waiting to be placed within the Murphy Sports Complex.

Let me give you a little history and then bring you up to date. The Complex is in memory of Mrs. Jo Murphy, Camp Director from 1971 to 1997. Groundbreaking took place in the spring of 2003. Since that time site preparation was completed and asphalt has been laid for the two tennis courts. Nets have been installed, and the "Buy A Brick" engraving has been completed to date. Also temporary lines were striped on the courts for use by this summers campers.

We are now in the process of raising the funds to complete the final phase. This phase will include the permanent striping, asphalt sealing, fencing, a new equipment shed with new equipment, and asphalt for a much needed small basketball area near the Dining Hall.


We, at Camp

to all our golfers! Everyone had fun and was a winner!


Individual prizes were awarded for special "skill" shots,



Meteors shower like tears

aint Lawrence shed his fiery "tears" earlier this week, punctuating the sky with bright streaks of light.

The tears are best known as the Perseid meteor shower. They're bits of comet dust that burn up as they streak into Earth's atmosphere. The debris is left over from comet Swift-Tuttle and the meteors created by the debris appear to rain into the sky from the direction of constellation Perseus. But they can shoot across any portion of the sky, so you don't need to look in any particular direction to see them.

Chinese astronomers first recorded the shower in 36 A.D. Later, it became famous for its association with Saint Lawrence, a

deacon of the early Catholic Church

On August 6th, 258, the Emperor Valerian executed the pope and six of his deacons. Lawrence was executed four days later -- perhaps by beheading, although legend gives him a far grislier death.

Tradition says he spent the days before his death giving away the church's wealth. When he was ordered to present the treasure, he pointed to a crowd of the poor and ill, and said THEY were the church's wealth. Valerian was so enraged that he ordered the deacon roasted alive on a red-hot gridiron. That night, streaks of fire blazed across the sky — the Perseids. They appeared each year on Lawrence's feast day — August 10th.

Over the centuries, the peak of the Perseid shower has moved a couple of days later. But even now, the Perseids are sometimes called the Tears of Saint Lawrence. To see any meteor show, find a skywatching spot away from bright lights. After it gets dark, just look up -- the meteors can streak across any portion of the sky. For us here at the lake, the best show occurred from late Wednesday night until the first light of dawn on Thursday. The thin crescent Moon did not interfere. Rather it, along with Venus, 9 degrees (a fist) to Luna's right, enhanced the show. And with all that, it was still free.



appearances in plays in the South Bend/Mishawaka area


She met her husband, Bruce, through their mutual love for acting in South Bend. They have been married for 25 years,


