a.m. All sailors, family and friends are welcome.



'on our knees to please'



The third-largest planet ...

ll nine planets of our solar system were born from the same rotating cloud of gas and dust that surrounded the newborn Sun. Because of that, we might expect all the planets to spin in the same direction, and at the same angle — but they don't. This jumble of motions tells us that the early solar system was chaotic, with frequent collisions between the planets and smaller bodies.

A prime example is Uranus, the third-largest planet.

Most of the other planets rotate more or less in the same direction that they orbit the Sun. In addition, their poles point away from the Sun. But Uranus is different: it lies on its side, so its poles lie nearly in its orbital plane. As a result, its north pole aims at the Sun at the begin-

ning of summer. During southern summer, the south pole gets most of the sunlight. And at the start of spring and fall, the Sun appears above the planet's equator. That creates weather patterns unlike those on any other planet, with winds and clouds changing directions with the seasons.

The most likely explanation for the planet's topsy-turvy rotation is a collision. In the distant past, a planet-sized body must have slammed into Uranus, knocking it on its side, like sometimes happens when two billiard balls collide off-center.

Similar impacts may have affected the other planets, too. An impact between Earth and another body, for example, may have blasted out a geyser of vaporized rock that coalesced to form the Moon.

Uranus is putting in its best

appearance of the year. It rises at sunset, in the constellation Aquarius, and remains in the sky all night. It's also closest to us for the year, so it shines brightest. But you still need binoculars to find it. To look for Uranus follow a line from the spout of the teapot across its top and through the handle. That will take you to Aquarius and it's somewhere in there. A star chart will be helpful.

Also check out Venus and Saturn an hour or two before sunrise. On Tuesday they will be just two degrees apart, about the width of a finger held at arm's length. A great show in one field through your binoculars. And it's free.

Ø Kathlyn Gay Ms. Gay lives in Elkhart, Indiana. She has written a large number of non-fiction books that are


