



Birch Lake Notes Boater Safety Classes offered

Who needs boater safety?

Michigan conservation officers and Michigan county sheriffs encourage all persons operating boats in Michigan to enroll in a boating safety course.

The following rules apply to boaters:

- A person who is 12 but less than 14 may operate a personal watercraft if he or she obtained a boating safety certificate before January 1, 1999.
- Persons born after December 31, 1978 shall not operate a personal watercraft unless they obtain a boating safety certifi-
- The operators of a personal watercraft must carry their boating safety certificate and display it upon the demand of a peace



The 2005 officers of the homeowners Association are Scott Troeger, Jim Bolinger, Don Harman, Bill King and Rick Russwurm.


There are quite a few members of the homeowners Association; contact any officer for more information. Homeowners Association meetings are publicized in the Barker and open to members and prospective members.

Stu's Star Stuff

Our solar system shines


ur solar system is an oasis of light, heat, and life in the cold reaches of the Milky Way

Galaxy. It consists of a central star — the Sun — and its family of nine planets, more than 100 moons, millions of rocky asteroids, and billions of icy comets.

Recent discoveries prove that our solar system is not alone. Astronomers have discovered planets orbiting several other stars. But current technology cannot reveal Earth-like planets — the planets that are most likely to harbor life. As far as we know, then, Earth is the galaxy's only inhabited planet.

The Sun formed from a nebula, a giant cloud of dust and gas — mostly hydrogen. At the end of its life, the Sun will balloon into a red giant, swallowing Mercury, Venus, and possibly Earth. But don't hold your breath. It's not going to happen anytime soon. After expanding the red giant will then evolve into a white dwarf, surrounded by a planetary nebula.

The inner planets, Mercury, Venus, Earth and Mars are made up of mostly rock and metal. One even contains water.



Most of the outer planets, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune, are mostly gas and dust. That means that there is no solid surface on which to stand, so don't try it. Pluto consists of nitrogen ice and rock, although scientists are not sure which is more abundant. More on Pluto next week.

One can remember names of the planets in order of increasing distance from the sun by recalling the phrase "Man Very Early Made Jars Serve Useful New Purposes," the first letter of each word being the first letter of a planet. Another phrase that works is "My Very Educated Mother Just Served Us Nine Pizza pies." I'm sure there are more.

The planets will be putting on quite a spectacular showing later this month with a brilliant trio forming in the WNW after sunset.

More on that alter, too.

Until then get out there and enjoy the show. It's free you know.
