





Give the sailors a break

During last weekend's Fourth of July Sailboat Regatta, there were several incidences of power boats cutting off sailboats, interfering with the races and/or nearly swamping sailboats by coming too close at high speed.

Power boaters and operators of personal watercraft (jet skis) are asked to behave responsibly at all times, especially during the Sunday sailboat races. Remember that Michigan law requires that ANY power boat making a wake must stay at least 100 feet away from ALL other boats, piers, rafts and people.

In addition, please remember that a sailboat ALWAYS has the right of way over a power boat (unless the power boat is anchored or otherwise dead in the water).





'on our knees to please'



Dizzying speeds in space

the evening sky offers up a number of beautiful treats this weekend.

One being a tight grouping of the Moon and the planets Venus and Mercury As twilight fades this evening, brilliant Venus stands a little below the Moon, with fainter Mercury farther to the lower left.

The moon itself, a waxing crescent, rests in Leo tonight, near the neck of the cosmic cat Four degrees (8 moon diameters) to Luna's left, and somewhat lower, sits Regulus, the lion's heart Venus will pass close to Regulus about 2 weeks from now The separation between star and planet is currently 15 degrees (1-1/2 fist widths).

Continue monitoring the Venus-Regulus spread each night that you are able.

To find Leo imagine the bottom falling out of the Big Dipper If it did, water would pour down onto Leo's back Look for the backward question mark that represents Leo's head Regulus is the reddish star near the bottom of the question

mark

Scorpius, one of my favorites, is now highest near the end of evening twilight Bright reddish Antares, heart of the scorpion, skitters across the south shore about 1-1/2 hours after sundown This magnificent constellation is a favorite of serious skywatchers, but can be easily overlooked by casual observers in temperate latitudes where Scorpius always remains low in the sky Southern skywatchers have an advantage since the scorpion climbs higher with decreasing latitude, reaching the zenith for those 20 to 30 degrees below the equator.

Draco, the Dragon, is a popular but dim constellation in the northern sky Its brightest star, 2nd-magnitude Eltanin, passes 10 degrees (a fist width) below overhead about 3 hours after sunset In England, where the star climbs even closer to overhead, Eltanin has been known as "ZenithStar."


Eltanin sits within the head of the beast The Dragon's body hangs below the head. The tail wraps around the bowl of the Little Dipper then drops between the two Dippers.

Often a little imagination is useful when enjoying the night sky.






