

Mark Your Calendar! The Corn and Sausage Roast will be held on Saturday, August 6, serving food from 5:30 pm until 7:30 pm.


Once again we will be serving grilled chicken breasts on a limited basis, so

Safe boating reminders:

Capacity plates are located in the vessel for your safety. Remember each person weighs 150 pounds according to the law (but not your tailor). Do not exceed this number or pound value. Failure to do so may be viewed as "careless operation".

Other Important Reminders:

- PFD's cannot be stored in plastic bags.
- All boats must stay at least 200 feet away from a diving flag. A diving flag is a red flag with a diagonal white stripe. It may be seen on a floating buoy or even displayed on a boat.
- The operator of the vessel must have the registration on board.
- Intoxicated vessel operators go to jail!
- You are liable for damage caused by your wake.

- It is illegal to ride on the side (gunwale) or covered bow of the boat, unless the manufacturer designed the boat for that use.
- Children 12 to 16 years of age must have a Boating Safety Certificate to operate a motorboat of six horsepower or more. The certificate must be in their possession while operating the boat.
- Some insurance companies give lower rates to skippers who have completed safety courses.
- When towing a skier or tuber it is essential to let your observer observe while you pilot the boat.


What I like


Afternoon, a slight breeze and building thunderstorms, we don't sail in those conditions. Agarragh!

BIRCH LAKE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

July 18, 2005 Report to Residents BLYC Water Quality Committee

Birch Lake has built up an historical record, which is extremely valuable to promotion of effective resource management. Part of the collected information is aquatic plant surveys

- June 18, 1978: The near shore waters were surveyed for significant growth of submerged and emergent macrophytes (water weeds).
- June 1986: Recent aquatic plant distribution surveys indicate significant increases in lake phosphorus levels and near shore aquatic plant growth have occurred since earlier surveys.
- 2001 Aquatic Plant Mapping: Moderate plant populations
 Septic upgrade program from 1985 to 1994. "No phosphorus" fertilizer program:
 Controllable sources of phosphorus loading were eliminated. QLMP phosphorus results classified Birch Lake oligotrophic (top quality) in 1999, 2000/2001, 2002, 2003, 2004. It is meaningful to have phosphorus level data and a map of aquatic vegetation in order to recognize an increase in plant growth from negative impact of gravity sewer construction.

 Below is a page taken from CLMP Armual Summary Report. The map of Birch Lake and 18 pressed and mounted plants are available for your review at the Temple's house.

2001 COOPERATIVE LAKES MONITORING PROGRAM
- AQUATIC PLANT MAPPING

Three lakes participated in the 2001 CLMP aquatic plant mapping pilot project. They were Corey Lake in St. Joseph County, Birch Lake in Cass County and Gunn Lake in Mason Courity. All three lakes have similar productivity, with TSI values in the high 30's to low 40's. The CLMP plant mapping project revealed that all three lakes had moderate plant populations consisting of a good diversity of species, none of which dominated. Additionally, none of the lakes had Eurasian milfoil and only sparse populations of curly-leaf pondweed were identified in any of the lakes. As an example of the work completed in the CLMP aquatic plant mapping pilot project the whole lake reporting data sheet for Birch Lake is presented below. In addition to the data sheets each lake monitoring team produced a map of the lake showing aquatic plant distribution and density for each plant type identified.



Geography in heaven

the big, bright Moon changes addresses tonight. As darkness falls, it's at the southeastern corner of the constellation Ophiuchus. By the time it sets over the western states, it'll be in the northwestern corner of Sagittarius. And as it makes the switch, it'll just miss the corner of Scorpius.

This crowded little patch of sky illustrates the complicated "geography" of the heavens. Like political boundaries here on Earth, the sky is split by a series of precisely defined lines. These lines insure that every star and galaxy has a constellation to call its own.

That hasn't always been the case, though. The first of the constellations that we recognize today were drawn thousands of years ago. But they consisted only of "connect-the-dot" patterns of bright stars. These patterns depicted common animals, or honored important gods or goddesses. Any star between these patterns was pretty much an orphan.

As the science of astronomy began to develop, though, astronomers needed a common reference frame to describe the positions of all the stars. So the classical

star patterns were extended to encompass the space around them.

Over the centuries, various astronomers added more constellations to fill in the gaps. And they created even more new constellations to divide up the southern sky, which was charted by European explorers.

But this created a jumble of overlapping, competing constellations.

Like the maps of Earth's countries, maps of the stars have changed a lot over the centuries. New constellations have come and gone, old ones have changed borders, and some just never caught on.

More than half of today's constellations were passed down from ancient Greece. A scientist named Ptolemy compiled a catalog of 48 Greek constellations almost 2,000 years ago; that's where we get the signs of the zodiac. But the Greeks had adopted many of these constellations from older cultures.

Ptolemy's catalog didn't account for every star in the sky, though. There were gaps between the constellations, and the southern sky wasn't cataloged at all. In 1687, Johannes Hevelius filled in some of

the gaps with seven new constellations. Nicolas de Lacaille added 14 more in the next century.

Other astronomers tried to add to the list, or to rework it entirely. Edmund Halley tried to add a constellation in honor of King Charles the second, while Father Maximillian Hell tried to add one that honored King George the second. Both failed — as did many others.

Even so, by the beginning of the 20th century, the system of constellations was a mess. Different experts listed anywhere from about 76 of them to more than a hundred. And individual stars could appear within two different constellations drawn by two different astronomers.






