

## Congratulations Harold & Donna



Harold and Donna Cranmer, Cove #316, were honored at a 50th anniversary reception on Thursday, August 11 at the Matterhorn Restaurant in Elkhart

The party was given by their children, Robert, Julie and Steven, Julie's husband Steve, and their children, Chad and jared.

In attendance were many family and friends and Donna's father, Dr. Maurice longenecker, who is is 99 years old (Dr. Longenecker will be 100 on January 13, 2006).

Harold and Donna were married on Sunday, August 14, 1955 in Elkhart, IN at the Longenecker residence on the upper St. Joe River.

Harold's mother, Dortha Wagner Cranmer told many stories about her family coming to Birch Lake by horse and wagon. This family tradition started in the 1850s with Harold's great grandfather, Egbert Wagner, who homesteaded a farm just south of Shavehead Lake on Rainbow Rd., after emigrating from Germany about 1850. Egbert fathered nine children. One

was Dortha's father and Harold's grandfather, Albert Wagner, who introduced Harold's father, Joseph Cranmer to Birch Lake for the first time about 1925 after dating Dortha. For most of young Albert's life he came to Birch Lake to camp in the old cove campground. This became the annual family reunion retreat.

Harold's father Joseph purchased two lots on the West side in 1928 and built their first home on the property that is now owned by Jim and Juanita Tjaden. Harold was born in 1936 while his folks were living at the lake. In 1940 they sold that property and kept th lot next door where they erected a small summer cottage. They moved to Elkhart for Harold to attend school.

In 1957 they rebuilt the cottage into a year-round home where they retired until their deaths.

## Sea captain graces Cowens' yard

There's some new news from the little gray two-story house in the cove. Most of the people around the lake seem to have already noticed that the Cowen family has a new addition to the decorations in their yard. There now stands a 22-ft.-tall carving of a sea captain, a blue heron, an owl, rope, some dragonflies and cattails, and, on the backside, a spirit face.

This beautiful carving is owned by Dick and Peggy Cowen. When they built their



new home a few years ago, the tried to preserve as many trees on the property as possible; one of these trees was a 160+year-old red oak that they used to make the hardwood floors upstairs. Another was an old white oak tree that was used to make the stairway in the back of the house.

Sadly, a 100+ year old tulip tree, the only tree left on the property, died while the house was being built. The Cowens didn't want to just cut it down, so they looked into other options. Earlier this summer their old neighbors, the DeYoungs, had a dead tree of theirs carved into a beautiful piece of art with bears and flowers. The Cowens saw it and thought it was a great idea. So, they asked for the name of the carver and gave him a call.

The carver is Bob Depner, and he planned with the Cowens what they wanted on their tree. It took only six days to cut, carve, paint and finish the whole thing. Bob's wife Alicia even came over to stain it. They used five chainsaws to do the sculpting and Bob paid excruciating attention to detail so everything would come out just perfect. They worked in 90-degree weather to turn the 92 ft dead tree into a 22 ft masterpiece.

Now that the work is done both Bob and the Cowens are happy with the carving, and the Cowens would like to welcome any visitors that would like to stop by and see their new piece of art. I've seen a lot of people drive by slowly in their boats to take a look, but it is hard to see all of the detail and work that went into it from the water, and from the water you can't see the beautiful spirit face on the back. I highly recommend taking a short walk or drive to this side of the lake to get an up close

Bob is very experienced at what he does and he has a very thick portfolio of carvings that he has done over the years full of eagles, bears, fish, flowers, birds, etc.; but he is very willing to work with anyone's ideas. If anyone else has a dead tree, or just a tree



## Moon illusions and names

arly Friday morning, at 1 a.m. CDT, (that would be the time at the lake) the Moon passed the perigee (closest point of its orbit), 222,074 miles from Earth. That makes Friday's Full Moon the 2nd closest of the year. Tonight the Moon rises in ESE about 25 minutes after sunset, as seen from the lake and southern Michigan.

When the Moon is rising or setting, regardless of its distance, it always seems much larger than when its overhead, even though when overhead the Moon is nearly 4000 miles closer. This effect, occurring only in the mind of the beholder, is called the Moon illusion

Moon illusion occurs because viewers watching a rising or setting Moon have points of reference with which to compare the disk of the moon. Seeing the Moon just above a tree or a barn makes it seem relatively large indeed. When the moon is high over head there are no reference points, thus it doesn't seem quite so imposing.

Each full Moon of the year has its

own name, most of which are associated with the weather or agriculture. Friday's full Moon is called the Grain Moon. The full Moon that occurs closest to the autumnal equinox, next month is commonly referred to as the "Harvest Moon," since its bright presence in the night sky allows farmers to work longer into the fall night, reaping the rewards of their spring and summer labors. Because the equinox always falls in late September, it is generally a full Moon in September which is given this name, although in some years the full Moon of early October earns the "harvest" designation.

Below is the full list. The most common names used in North America include:

January -- Moon after Yule

February -- Snow Moon

March - Sap Moon

April -- Grass Moon

May -- Planting Moon

June -- Honey Moon

July -- Thunder Moon

August -- Grain Moon

September -- Fruit Moon (or Harvest Moon)

October -- Hunter's Moon (or Harvest Moon)

November -- Frosty Moon


December - Moon before Yule

No matter what you call it, the full Moon is always a beautiful part of the show here at the lake. And it's free.






