## Unwritten rules of the water

Every parent knows that good manners involves more than saying "please" and "thank you."

When it comes to boating, manners is called "boating etiquette," a code of unwritten rules and behaviors that every boater should learn and know.

Other boaters on our lake are generally like our neighbors in town

— they are considerate of one another and follow similar "rules." Good boating manners make for better experiences on the lake.

Here are a few etiquette tips that can help make your day on the lake smoother and more enjoyable. **KNOW THE RULES** 

The best way to learn how to act on the water is to take a certified boating course. It will teach you safety procedures and how to operate and handle a boat. Plus, you can often get discounted boat insurance, not to mention keep your family and crew safer.

## **RESPECT THE ENVIRONMENT**

Be kind to water, one of Earth's most precious resources. That means avoiding fuel spills and never dumping trash or garbage into the lake. **MINIMIZE NOISE POLLUTION** 

Respect other people's right to privacy and quiet. Dock away from other boaters if you have barking dogs or rowdy children on board, especially at night. Keep comments about fellow boaters to yourself (remember, sound carries a looong way over the water). **PLAY IT SAFE.** 

Always have and use the proper safety gear, including life jackets and communications equipment.

## MAKE SOLID DECISIONS

A good decision is a safe one. Don't race other boats or attack a boat if it cuts you off — boat rage can be as dangerous as road rage. That means making safety the goal. Remember, a safe decision includes not "drinking while driving" a boat. **BE A GOOD GUEST** 

Guests have certain responsibilities whether they are on board for the an hour or all day. Overall,

guests need to be safe. So, it's best if the boat owner reviews safety procedures, any duties expected of them and the "rules" of the boat (no smoking, no running, no one allowed on the foredeck while the boat is moving, etc.). Guests should be told not to touch the gauges, buttons, radios or other instruments that operate the boat. Remind guests they should wait until the boat has docked to gather personal items or climb onto the pier.

## ASSIST OTHER BOATERS

Any boater will appreciate help if he has broken down, run out of gas or has engine trouble. As a fellow boater, call for help or lend a helping hand. You'd want someone to do the same for you. If there is no dock master or helper on hand to assist those docking and undocking, you may also want to offer assistance to them.

## Jet Skis

Next week we'll review the rules on operating a personal watercraft (PWC, or Jet Ski) on Michigan lakes.

Some of the key points of Michigan law include: ■ A person shall not operate a personal watercraft during the period that begins 1 hour before sunset and ends at 8 a.m.

# - Birch Lake Notes -

■ A person operating a personal watercraft shall not cross within 150 feet behind another vessel, other than a personal watercraft, unless the personal watercraft is operating at a slow-no wake speed.

■ Unless operating in a navigable channel, canal, river or stream, a person who operates a personal watercraft or a person that is being towed by a personal watercraft **shall not operate within 100 feet of**: — A dock or raft.

 A buoyed or occupied bathing or swimming area. — A person in the water or on the water in a personal flotation device.

An anchored or moored vessel.
A vessel that is drifting or sitting dead in the water.

■ A person shall not operate a personal watercraft if a child under 7 years of age is on board or towed unless with a parent or guardian or designee of parent or guardian.
 ■ A person under the age of 14 shall not operate a personal watercraft in this state.

■ A person who is 12 but less than 14 may operate a personal watercraft

if he or she obtained a boating safety certificate before January 1, 1999.
■ Persons born after December 31, 1978 shall not operate a personal watercraft unless they obtain a boating safety certificate.

■ The operators of a personal watercraft must carry their boating safety certificate and display it upon the demand of a peace officer.

■ Non residents shall only operate a personal watercraft if they possess a boating safety certificate

hursday, for the second time this month, the Moon was fully illuminated. According to old folklore, some people say, the second full Moon in a calendar month is called a "blue Moon." They go on to explain that this is the origin of the expression "once in a blue Moon." But it isn't true! The term "blue Moon" has been around a long time, well over 400 years, but its calendrical meaning has become widespread only in the last 25 years or so.

In fact, the very earliest uses of the term were remarkably like saying the Moon is made of green cheese. Both were obvious absurdities, about which there could be no doubt. "She would argue the Moon was blue" was taken by the average person of the 16th century as we take "She'd argue that black is white."

The concept that a blue Moon was absurd (the first meaning) led eventually to a second meaning, that of "never." The statement "I'll marry you, m'lady, when the Moon is blue!" would not have been taken as a betrothal in the 18th century.

But there are also historical examples of the Moon actually turning blue. That's the third meaning — the Moon appearing

blue in the sky. When the Indonesian volcano Krakatoa exploded in 1883, its dust turned sunsets green and the Moon blue all around the world for the best part of two years. In 1927, the Indian monsoons were late arriving and the extra-long dry season blew up enough dust for a blue Moon. And Moons in northeastern North America turned blue in 1951 when huge forest fires in western Canada threw smoke particles up into the sky.

So, by the mid-19th century, it was clear that visibly blue Moons, though rare, did happen from time to time, whence the phrase "once in a blue Moon." It meant then exactly what it means today, a fairly infrequent event, not quite regular enough to pinpoint. That's meaning number four, and today it is still the main one.

But meaning is a slippery substance, for we all know of a half dozen songs that use "blue Moon" as a symbol of sadness and loneliness. The poor crooner's Moon often turns to gold when he gets his love at the end of the song. That's meaning number five: check your old Elvis Presley or Bill Monroe records for more information.

And did I mention a slinky blue liquid in a cocktail glass, one that requires curaçao, gin, and perhaps a twist of lemon? That's number six.

So fix yourself one and get out there and enjoy the show. It's free.
