Millage for Porter services

A special millage election will be held on August 7 for funding for the Southeast Public Safety Authority (SEPSA), which provides fire and ambulance services to the south part of Porter Township and the northeast part of Mason Township.

Although Birch Lake receives emergency fire and ambulance services from Newburg Township and is not served by SEPSA, if the millage is passed, Birch residents will be required to pay a twomill increase (\$2 for every \$1,000 of assessed valuation for seven years). SEPSA currently is funded through Porter and Mason Township general funds. Last year the residents of Porter Township denied a request for an additional 2.25 mills for the same group by a vote of 516 to 267.

There will be a special meeting today (Saturday, Aug. 4) from 4 to 7 pm at the Porter Fire Station on US 12 and Gard's Prairie Rd. You can also get more information from the Porter Fire Department's website: http://www.ptfd.org.



# Tannadoonah Tidbits



T's the last week of camp already. Can't believe how fast this summer has flown by! On Friday night around 9 to 9:15 pm we will be having our annual end-of-the-summer candlelight serenade down on the pier. Come on out in your boats to hear us serenade the lake and see the beautiful candles floating on the water!

This week's theme is On the Loose Week (also known as Wilderness Week). Each of the cabins will be camping out in tents at least one night this week.

It was a huge staff in comparison to last year (we had 23 cabin staff this year, compared to only 11 last year!). We added a lot of great new programs, and had lots of kids trying new things at camp. It was also a young camp this year (camper-wise), which bodes well for next year. More than 90 percent of the kids up at camp this summer were going into the 7th grade or younger! I don't think Morris Lodge has ever been so empty! So hopefully next year many of those kids will return, and bring lots of friends with them.

Saturday the staff will stay at camp to clean up, and then we'll have our staff banquet, followed by a staff party. Then everyone departs for home on Sunday morning. It will be sad to see them all go.

We're already making plans for fall camp (tentatively September 7-9), and many of the staff are talking about coming back next summer.

Here are the last few staff bios for this summer season:

Mr. Cain lives in Exchange, and works out at Sports and Games. He was a camper for many years, and a Counselor in Training last summer. He will be a junior at Caledonia High School in Michigan in the fall. Mr. Phil lives in Rotary with the oldest boys. # BLYC House Walk Preview

#### Lazy Lodge

Ben ad Vanessa Wozniak Once upon a time, back in 1926, we are told by " old timers", that there was a large pavilion on this property. It was used to hold square dances, puppet shows, etc. In 1943, Wanda and Pete Winarski bought this large house with the huge screened in porch and 5 small cottages across the road. They sold hamburgers, hot dogs, milk shakes, etc. In the 50's, Pete and Wanda tore down the old place and built the present house. In 1995, Ben and Vanessa purchased the home and have lovingly "rehabed" the 50's era Lodge, and made it their own.

Upon entering the house, note the pine columns, which were trees planted by the original owner and removed to see the lake. The window in the lake level bedroom, was the "Serving Window" for the restaurant. The 1840's barn, moved from Traverse City, is also on the Home Tour and adds to the charm of this special property. This 1850's barn, was moved from its original location, just south



of Traverse City in 2003. Taken down, board by board, and built again by the Amish, it is 36' X 50' with hand hewn beams for the main structure. New wood was milled for the outside. The original outside wood is being used by Ben to build cabinets and bird houses. Both of which, can be seen in the home. Bird Houses will be on sale on the day of the Tour.

House Walk will be August 11 (rain date August 12) from 1 to 4 pm. It will feature six homes and the beautiful and historic barn owned by Ben and Vanessa Wozniak. 



# Stu's Star Stuff Conjunction junction?

planet's "elongation" refers to its separation from the Sun in the sky, as viewed from Earth. When a planet's elongation is zero, it is aligned with the Sun and Earth, and is in a "conjunction." What many people call the morning or evening star is actually a planet, usually Venus but sometimes Jupiter, Saturn, or even Mars. When one of them appears close to the Sun as viewed from Earth, sunset or sunrise watchers are treated to starlike brilliance of one of our planetary neighbors, which may be brighter than any of the true stars in the night sky. The distinction between "morning" and "evening" simply refers to the time at which the planet is visible.

Due to the orbital motion of planets around the Sun, a planet might be a "morning star" at one time of the year, and then later, as its orbit carries it behind and then to the other side of the Sun, it appears as an "evening star."

Saturn, visible low in the west through most of last month, has disappeared into the sun's glare in the western sky. But look for some of the other planets this evening. Jupiter is high in the south above and to the east of Antares, the heart of the scorpion. It looks like a bright cream colored star and is the

brightest object in that part of the sky. Mars and the eye of the bull follow close behind the last-quarter Moon tonight. The Moon rises around midnight and Mars follows about an hour later. It looks like a bright orange star. The orange eye of Taurus, the bull -- the star Aldebaran -is about an hour behind Mars.

Right now Venus is the brilliant "evening star," but it's beginning to disappear from view. It is quite low in the west at sunset, and drops below the trees as darkness falls. It will return to view by the end of the month, but this time as the "morning star," low in the east at first light.

The positions of the planets change nightly so continue to watch. They're a great part of the show. And the show's free.



The scheduled date, type of treatment, restrictions and information provided in the notice from Professional Lake Management is (in part) for review by all Birch Lake residents.

- Birch Lake has been scheduled for the week of 8-6-07. Due to the uncertainty of weather, the treatment scheduled is approximate.
- Watch the shoreline for the posting of the 11x14 inch, yellow, red or green signs. The signs will indicate the date of the treatment, the products used and any restrictions on the use of treated water for swimming, watering lawns, etc.
- Please be aware that only the products approved by the State of Michigan and the Federal Government are being used.
- No adverse effects on people, fish, wild life or domestic pets has been experienced since applying products.
