
Gum dispenser







2009 meteor shower viewing tips

he next meteor shower is the Perseids on August 12, 2009. The shower peaks early afternoon on the 12th, so the morning of the 12th (midnight to dawn) and late evening are the best times to watch from the U.S.

What are meteor showers?

An increase in the number of meteors at a particular time of year is called a meteor shower

Comets shed the debris that becomes most meteor showers. As comets orbit the Sun, they shed an icy, dusty debris stream along the comet's orbit. If Earth travels through this stream, we will see a meteor shower. Depending on where Earth and the stream meet, meteors appear to fall from a particular place in the sky, maybe within the neighborhood of a constellation.

Meteor showers are named by the constellation from which meteors appear to fall, a spot in the sky astronomers call the radiant. For instance, the radiant for the Leonid meteor shower is located in the constellation Leo. The Perseid meteor shower is so named because meteors appear to fall from a point in the constellation Perseus.

What are shooting stars?

"Shooting stars" and
"falling stars" are both names
that people have used for many
hundreds of years to describe
meteors -- intense streaks of
light across the night sky caused
by small bits of interplanetary

rock and debris called meteoroids crashing and burning high in Earth's upper atmosphere. Traveling at thousands of miles an hour, meteoroids quickly ignite in searing friction of the atmosphere, 30 to 80 miles above the ground. Almost all are destroyed in this process; the rare few that survive and hit the ground are known as meteorites

When a meteor appears, it seems to "shoot" quickly across the sky, and its small size and intense brightness might make you think it is a star. If you're lucky enough to spot a meteorite (a meteor that makes it all the way to the ground), and see where it hits, it's easy to think you just saw a star "fall."

How can I best view a meteor shower?

If you live near a brightly lit city, drive away from the

glow of city lights and toward the constellation from which the meteors will appear to radiate.

For example, drive north to view the Leonids. Driving south may lead you to darker skies, but the glow will dominate the northern horizon, where Leo rises. Perseid meteors will appear to "rain" into the atmosphere from the constellation Perseus, which rises in the northeast around 11 p.m. in mid-August.

After you've escaped the city glow, find a dark, secluded spot where oncoming car headlights will not periodically ruin your sensitive night vision.

Look for state or city parks or other safe, dark sites.

Once you have settled at your observing spot, lay back or position yourself so the horizon appears at the edge of your peripheral vision, with the stars and sky filling your field of view. Meteors will instantly grab your attention as they streak by.

How do I know the sky is dark enough to see meteors?

If you can see each star of the Little Dipper, your eyes have "dark adapted," and your chosen site is probably dark enough. Under these conditions, you will see plenty of meteors. What should I pack for meteor watching?

Treat meteor watching like you would the 4th of July fireworks. Pack comfortable chairs, bug spray, food and drinks, blankets, plus a red-filtered flashlight for reading maps and charts without ruining your night vision. Binoculars are not necessary. Your eyes will do just fine



Further information regarding E coli and Birch Lake

Although it may seem at times like overkill, we are going to continue to inundate you with information and data. Concerns about potential sources of pollution need to be taken seriously as we are all invested heavily in this beautiful lake and we all have little interest in seeing any of our recreational activities taken away. Thus, to repeat, last year there were some concerns about bacterial contamination in the lake. A formal program was undertaken to evaluate this at multiple sites around the lake, and nothing in the body of the lake was found. However, the inlet stream did demonstrate elevated levels of E coli. In concert with Michigan State University, this was found not to be of human origin, and thus was considered to be the wildlife in the wetlands which upon entering the lake was diluted to insignificant levels. We have surveyed the lake twice this year with nothing being found in the body of the lake beyond one or two very low level findings. Again the




stream had the highest levels, but we illustrated last week that this is rapidly diluted immediately upon entering the lake to nondetectable levels mere yards away. We will survey the lake fully in another week or two of further clarity. We are also in touch with Michigan State regarding evaluating agricultural versus wildlife origins of the bacteria in the stream. This brings us to the latest data generated

If the bacteria in the stream were agricultural, i.e. runoff from the hog barn operation about a half mile east of Birch Road on Harvey Road, it has to be able to actually run off into the stream. Gordon and Terry did a sleuthing walk about last week starting with stream and moving east through the wetlands,

to the pond beyond the wetlands, and to the small inlet stream that comes under the road that feeds the pond. The pond is blocked from the Hog Barn by a hill, valley with wetlands and pond and a woods thus precluding runoff into the pond on the east side. On the north side of Harvey Road is another pond adjacent to a open field. We sampled the stream as it comes out of the wetlands and obtained a count of 420, the stream that is between the pond and the wetlands and obtained a count of 200, the stream that leads into the pond from the under the road and obtained a count of 100. The pond in the valley east of the pond and west of the hog barn field had a count of 60 and the pond on the north side of the road had a count of 120. Thus, the highest count was coming out of the wetlands and the farthest area removed from the hog barn operation. By this, it would seem unlikely that we are getting runoff from that operation, and if so it is not contributing to the bacterial count. Thus, it might be presumed that the E coli in the stream is from wildlife. We will continue to clarify

Additionally, on the same day, there was a lot of foam out on the lake in the early AM. This was sampled in duplicate. One sample was non detectable and in the other a count of 20.


