The margarita machine was steadily



#### Flotsam v2

The wind looked weird, with half the lake calm / half blowing 8-12. I put a paddle in the cockpit just before leaving for the course should I need to paddle in or out (the N shore was dead calm). Sailed a crappy race — kept making errors and moving back down from 3rd to 5th, up again, then 2nd to 4th, etc. Decided to consolidate the loss and finish. About 100 feet from the finish line I tacked and realized not only was the tiller extension in my hand, but the entire assembly was loose, dragging astern. It's maybe \$750-900 of kit ... and I have no idea whether the wooden tiller floats the (mainly metal) assembly.

By the time I had the rudder blade, bracket, tiller and extension onboard, the boat decided to go into a wicked gybe, pirouetting on the dual daggerboards (both deployed for the finish in case I had to tack to make the line). This didn't happen once — it happened a couple times, and the nasty circling gybes fed on themselves to the point I began to get dizzy.

Aha — the paddle thinks I. Dug in and fought the spin until I was able to come head to wind, and then thought to sail across the line (now maybe 150' away) using the paddle as a sideboard steering device. This worked for about 10 seconds before the uncontrolled gybing/circling started all over againrinse and repeat.

A few friends came alongside, but I urged them to stand off, not knowing how to control my boat. One thing I did know was it was impossible to stand on the foredeck to drop the sail. I headed off on a semi-controlled reach steering canoe style on one swing then paddling like mad as the boat swung the other direction, trying to keep headed towards the leeward shore.

My boat must know where to beach as with some difficulty I was able to make on the open space near Harmans' ... roughly where I'd put in on the (now) infamous swamping day. The last couple hundred feet turned into a struggle directly into the wind, but I eventually made it ashore. I jumped in the water, quite happy to be out of the boat.

Don Harman came over laughing, wondering what was wrong this time? I asked if he had a paper clip, thinking I'd just lost the ring-ding which keeps the rudder pintle pins secure in the transom gudgeon bracket. Nope ... the

pintle pins had both sheered off and were gone, in 70' of water. I took down the sail and got towed home.

As always, many thanks to the kind souls who offer aid.

Adding the paddle at the last moment was prophetic. It's the same paddle I lost overboard on swamping day. Friend Phil found it in my flotsam. This was the first time I had it back onboard since that day. Musta been my density -or- destiny, or sumpin!

Besides repairing / engineering a work-around bracket (a new one is 2.45 boat units — \$245 plus shipping) ... think I'll test to





Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.)

Season Place = total season points/number of races attempted

# The dog days of summer?

hose who believe in global warming may have a tricky time trying to defend the theory, given the cool summer that we've had here at the lake. We've really not been much burdened with the hot and sticky weather that we've come to know and love this time of year — often called the Dog Days of Summer.

If you look quite low in the east-southeast during twilight the next few mornings, you may just make out the brightest star in the night sky: Sirius.

Its first appearance in the dawn sky is known as its heliacal rising — a word that means "with the Sun." In other words, it's rising around the same time as the Sun does.

In ancient times, this first appearance held great significance. In ancient Egypt, where the star represented the goddess Isis, it marked the beginning of a new year. The Nile began its annual floods around that time, bringing water and fertile soil for Egyptian fields.

And in ancient Greece, Sirius ushered in the "Dog Days" — the hottest, stickiest time of the year. The name comes from Sirius's constellation — Canis Major, the big dog.

At the time, Sirius made its first dawn

appearance a little earlier in the year than it does now. It's moved later because of an effect known as precession.

We usually speak of the North Star, or Polaris, as marking the exact position of north. In actuality, it is slightly off true north, the point astronomers designate as the North Celestial Pole. The fact that Polaris is even close to the pole is an accident of time. Earth's rotation axis slowly wobbles, sweeping out a circle in the sky in 26,000 years. Polaris is currently within three-quarters a degree of the axis, a distance that will shrink to half a degree around the year 2100, As the wobble continues, the distance increases, reaching almost 50 degrees 13,000 years from now.

At the same time, over the millennia the Sun appears against different stars at any given date. And that, in turn, means that stars rise at different times in relation to the Sun.

But even though Sirius climbs into view later in the year than it did long ago, the hot, sticky days of summer are still named in its honor — the Dog Days.

Look for Sirius in the east during the dawn twilight. To find Polaris follow a line from the outer-most two stars of the bowl of the Big Dipper. Polaris is the end of the handle of the Little Dipper and it is not particularly bright.

Enjoy the show everybody. This one's on me.





#### **Testing Continues**

As we have repeatedly stated, if we test for something it will be reported in the Barker as soon as possible.

Last week we reported on E coli testing a few days before the heavy rains and the day of the heavy rains. It was clear that whatever was in the wetlands was being scoured out and sent into the lake. We believe this to be from a wildlife source, and in the wetlands E coli can stay alive replicate in the muck and detritus. Thus the clearer water normally coming from the stream does not have sufficient E coli to show up as it is rapidly diluted.

However, on the day of the rain, the counts in the stream went from the hundreds to the thousands, and E coli was observed in rather high numbers by adjacent piers.

To see what a few days means after the rain, we again tested in the inlet area, but also expanded the sites to give a little more general look at the lake.

Testing was done this time in about 6 inches to a foot of water, and in all cases duplicate samples were taken. Testing was conducted on the 19th of August with reading of the plates on the 20th.

It should be noted that we have continuous sources of E coli entering the lake. We now have about 300 gulls that have taken up residence, the geese still around some during the week, there are two groups of ducks that circle the lake, raccoons that prowl the shoreline in search of food, and the ubiquitous dogs whose business may not always be picked up before some rain etc. that might help some of it into the lake. I still wonder what folks who recreate at the lake do (non residents) when they have their boats out on the lake all day during a weekend.


Just looking at the stream and adjacent areas, it is clear that after the dumping following the rain, this quickly changed to the pattern we have seen the rest of the year.

#### **Water Temperature**

Someone asked the other day if we have a record of the water temperatures this season. We are not taking it weekly, but have data from the days we conducted temperature and dissolved oxygen from top to bottom. Thus, the surface temperatures from a location at the deep basin of the lake were as follows:

It should be noted that the temperature was fairly stable for the first 10-15 feet of depth. These temperatures also are a far cry from the bottom which has stayed at about 41 F



Around Lakes, the issue often arises as to whether it is trespassing on a riparian's bottomlands when someone else places a dock, shore station or raft anchor on the riparian's bottomlands or walks on the riparian's bottomlands without permission. Under Michigan law, most riparian property owners own the bottomlands adjacent to their properties toward the center of the lake in a pieshaped fashion.

While both riparians and members of the public have the right to freely float on the water over another's bottomlands and even to temporarily anchor there pursuant to navigation, people do not have the right to place docks, shorestations or raft anchors on the bottomlands of another without permission, or to moor boats other than temporarily on such bottomlands.

Furthermore, one cannot normally walk on the bottomlands of another without permission. Unfortunately, law enforcement agencies will almost never prosecute bottomlands trespass cases due to their lack of knowledge of riparian law and the difficulty of ascertaining bottomlands boundaries. Only a county circuit court in a fullblown civil lawsuit can determine true bottomlands boundaries, which is an expensive and complicated process. Accordingly, the ultimate relief for the owner of bottomlands who experiences bottomlands trespassing is a private civil lawsuit.

The various trespass laws differ regarding whether or not a property must be posted before a trespasser can be pursued. The RTA requires signage at every visible point, or, alternately fencing. Some local ordinances do not require any signage or fencing while others do. To be

safe, it is best to post your property, utilize fencing or use both methods if you are concerned about trespassing. If you are dealing with a relatively small lot, a confined area or lake bottomlands where fencing or posting is not practical, either you or your attorney should send a warning letter to whomever has been a trespasser in the past warning that person not to trespass or you will take appropriate legal action.


Here are two additional tips regarding trespass:

Once you have had a survey done (which can be quite

expensive), you may desire to dig a small hole around each corner iron (without disturbing it) and pour a little redimix cement into the hole. This will ensure that corners do not get moved, lost, bent, etc., so that your property lines will remain established.

If someone trespasses on your property and damages, cuts or takes your trees, crops, wood or other natural resources without permission, they are potentially liable for triple damages under MCLA 600.2919.


