





Bring to a simmer and gently cook 5 to 8 minutes. Salmon will be opaque. Remove to 2 plates. Whisk





mayonnaise, lemon juice, whiskey and pepper together in a small bowl and



Heart Attacks

Bayer is making crystal aspirin to dissolve under the tongue. They work much faster than the tablets — and you should keep some by your bedside.

Stu's Star Stuff



On to Venus — two stars in one

ur next stop on our journey outward from the sun brings us to the second brightest natural object in the night sky - Venus. Only the Moon shines brighter. Named for Deb, the Roman goddess of love and beauty, it is the second planet from the Sun, orbiting it every 225 Earth days. Because Venus is inside of Earth's orbit, it never appears to venture far from the Sun. And also for that reason, viewed through a telescope, phases can be detected, much like our own moon. Venus reaches its maximum brightness shortly before sunrise or shortly after sunset, for which reason it is often called the Morning Star or the Evening Star. It's two stars in one. (Sorry, couldn't resist bringing that one back.)

Classified as a terrestrial planet, it is sometimes called Earth's "sister planet" because they are similar in size, gravity, and bulk composition. Venus is covered with an opaque layer of highly reflective clouds of sulfuric acid, preventing its surface from being seen from space in visible light. It has the densest atmosphere of all the terrestrial planets, consisting mostly of carbon dioxide. The atmospheric pressure at the planet's surface is 92 times that of the Earth, making it a most inhospitable place. A younger Venus is

believed to have possessed Earth-like oceans, but these totally evaporated as the temperature rose, leaving a dusty dry desertscape with many slab-like rocks.


Venus's surface was a subject of speculation until some of its secrets were revealed by planetary science in the twentieth century. It was finally mapped in detail by Project Magellan in 1990-91. The ground shows evidence of extensive volcanism, and the sulfur in the atmosphere may indicate that there have been some recent eruptions. However, the absence of evidence of lava flow accompanying any of the visible caldera remains an enigma.

Venus actually rotates from east to west, as opposed to west to east which is the common rotating direction of most other planets in space.

Venus is in view to the naked eye from Earth for a period of 2-3 hours before sunrise and 2-3 hours after sunset. Venus is the only other non terrestrial body, besides the moon, that can be seen from Earth during both day and night time hours. Look for Venus just after sunset this weekend. It is approaching the sun but should still be visible here at the lake for another week or two. Where to pext? We'll

just have to see. Enjoy the show up there. It's always there and it's always free.

on't forget to come to the Camp Tannadoonah meeting this week! The meeting is at 10 am AT CAMP. In last week's column I mistakenly said that the meeting would be at the Yacht Club, when it is actually AT CAMP! See Chas's notes for more details

If you've been up at the lake this past week, you've probably noticed that we had our first group of campers at camp this week! This week the People of Praise rented camp for a week-long camp program. This is the 21st year that they have rented Camp Tannadoonah for their camp, and they had a record number of campers attending. There were over 200 people in camp for the week! They had 112 campers, and more than 90 volunteer staff!

It always seems that the People of Praise week is a rough week at camp, and this year was no exception! We had water heaters going out, refrigerator and freezer units not getting cold properly, a leaky dishwasher, broken toilets, leaky roofs, and more. It's the first week that we really use everything in camp, so we find all the problems in a hurry!

I want to extend a HUGE thanks to Rick Russwurm and Stan Pitakos for coming up on short notice to install a new water heater in the dining hall, and Patti Russwurm for helping me get a lot of other things taken care of. Also, a big thanks to Shawn O'Donnell for sending out someone to make some last-minute adjustments to the pier very early last Saturday morning! And finally, our wonderful and patient volunteer, Chuck White, who made 6 trips up to camp in 4 days to work on the cooler, freezer, water heaters, and leaky plumbing.

My staff will be arriving at camp on Sunday afternoon, and I can hardly wait to kick off the staff training week. It looks like we're going to have a fabulous staff this summer. We have almost half of last year's staff returning, so there will be a lot of experienced counselors, as well as some fresh new ideas!

The numbers for this summer are still looking good. We're at 352 campers currently, and on this date last year we had 313. The previous year we hadn't even hit 300 at this point. So we're still ahead of last year's pace, although I'd like to see the numbers growing at a faster rate! We're still hoping to hit a total of 550 campers by the end of the summer!

So far this year, I have received 47 campership requests, for a total of over \$15,000 in requests for financial aid. We have collected around \$10,000 in pledges or actual funds, so we're well short of the amount needed to help all of these campers get to camp. If you're interested in sponsoring, or helping to sponsor, a camper this summer, please contact me. The cost for each camper is \$397. It's really important to me to be able to share the camp experience with as many children as we can each year!

Don't forget to mark your calendars and join us for the Hog Roast up at camp on July 31st! It should be a fun party and a great chance to meet some of the camp staff and Camp Fire Board Members

Camp Fire financial picture shared

Camp Fire USA River Bend Council invites you to attend a public meeting at Camp Tannadoonah on Saturday June 12 at 10 am. We will present our financial picture and plans for the coming years. For those who cannot attend, or those who wish to start thinking about the topic, I'd like to share a bit now.

As you may know, Camp Tannadoonah is owned and operated by our local Camp Fire USA council (formerly Camp Fire Girls, though we've been co-ed since 1976). We also operate a day camp in Mishawaka and our Club Program serves youth throughout the year.

What you may not realize is that we have consistently lost money for nearly 20 years. Since 1993, our average net income has been —\$12,000. In order to survive, the council took drastic measures and sold land, cashed out investments, and borrowed money. Because of

this historically poor adaptability and a few strategic missteps, we continue to carry debt and face deficits.

The two camps represents over 75% of our income. With declining funding, we have focused on increasing campers in order to stabilize our financial position. This means raising prices and working to improve the facilities and programs. The path to sustainability is found with more campers.

The current board of directors is entirely new in the last three years. We have taken major steps to make our council sustainable and we continue to see growth. We're not done yet, but I am confident we have built a solid base upon which our council can thrive.

We'll dive into numbers in more detail during the meeting, and I'll share some of our plans for the next few years. I hope you'll join us Saturday and bring your questions, ideas, and support.
