



Stu's Star Stuff



amed for the Roman god of war the planet Mars is cold and dry, with an atmosphere that's less than one percent as thick as Earth's — a desert world that's not especially friendly for life. But that hasn't always been the case. Billions of years ago, it was much warmer and wetter. An ocean may have covered much of the planet, surrounded by a thick, warm atmosphere.

Much of the water may still be there -frozen beneath the dusty surface or in the polar
ice caps. But much more probably wafted off
into space -- along with a good chunk of the
Martian atmosphere.

In fact, wisps of Martian air are still escaping into space today. They're carried off by the solar wind -- a stream of charged particles from the Sun.

The solar wind erodes the Martian atmosphere all the time. But a recent study found that it carries off more of the atmosphere at some times than at others. The heaviest erosion occurs when fast streams of the solar wind overtake slow streams, creating pressure waves. As these waves break across Mars, they grab almost three times more of the atmosphere than average -- making the desert planet even less friendly for life.

Mars has been known since prehistoric times. Of course, it has been extensively studied with ground-based observatories. But even very large telescopes find Mars a difficult target, it's just too small. It is still a favorite of science fiction writers as the most favorable place in the Solar System (other than Earth!) for human habitation. But the famous "canals" "seen" by Lowell and others were, unfortunately, imaginary.

The first spacecraft to visit Mars was Mariner 4 in 1965. Several others followed including the Mars Expedition Rovers "Spirit" and "Opportunity" in 2004. They are still operating after many years on Mars. Three Mars orbiters are also currently in operation.

Mars' orbit is significantly elliptical. This has a major influence on Mars' climate. While the average temperature on Mars is about -67 F, Martian surface temperatures range widely from as little as -207 F at the winter pole to almost 80 F on the day side during summer.

Though Mars is much smaller than Earth, its surface area is about the same as the land surface area of Earth.

Mars has some of the most highly varied and interesting terrain of any of the terrestrial planets, some of it quite spectacular. In addition to extensive canyons and vast dessert plains in the souther hemisphere there is an impact crater more than 3.5 miles deep and more than 1200 miles across. Mars also boasts the largest mountain in the Solar System rising 78,000 ft. above the surrounding plain. Its base is more than 300 miles in diameter and is rimmed by a cliff 20,000 ft high. It would

shadow Everest by more than 9 miles. To date no one has reached the summit though many have tried.

Look for Mars high in the western sky at nightfall. It looks like a bright orange star. And it's especially easy to find tonight because it has an equally bright companion: Regulus, the brightest star of Leo, the lion. Regulus stands just a whisker below the Red Planet.



It's Pirate Week at Camp T



Camp Tannadoonah Silent Auction


