



Water Clarity

You have probably noticed a rather sharp drop in the clarity of the our lake's water, especially in the last week or so. Earlier in the spring the Secchi disk reading was around 30 feet and in fact less than two weeks ago it was 15 feet. However, just before the July 4th weekend it dropped to 8 feet. A couple of contributing factors have been the warm temperatures and the abundant sunlight. These could have led to an increase in the algae population which scatters light and thereby reduces clarity.

We sample for algae by taking chlorophyll "a" measurements monthly, then forward our data to the Michigan Lakes and Streams Association for processing and interpretation. When we get the results back from The ML&SA later this winter, we will see if this was true, that we have experienced an algae growth.

In his latest brochure, Dr. Wally Fusilier, Ph.D. Limnologist [one who scientifically studies bodies of freshwater], described an additional cause for these seasonal drops in water clarity. His theory could be very true for our lake since it is a relatively hard water lake, due to it being spring fed. Think of your well water and all


the minerals in it. The warming of the water with summer may cause these minerals to precipitate, or separate from the water solution, and thus decrease the transparency. Dr. Fusilier indicated that a way to ascertain this visually is to look at the color of the water. If it is pea green it is due to an algae bloom. If it is sea green it is due to the mineral precipitation.

Terry Dugan was in Wisconsin recently, by Lake Como which is about 2 miles from Lake Geneva. Lake Como is a shallow eutrophic [near to the end of its' life cycle, filling with algae and sediment] lake and it was truly pea green. In comparison, Terry

reports that Birch is more gravish green or sea green, suggesting at least some of the loss of clarity results from the mineral precipitation. In summary: yes we have more algae, but that is only part of the story. The rest is probably chemistry.

A short visit to Saturn

hile it is entirely unlikely that one could get from Jupiter to Saturn in one week we will nonetheless visit Saturn anyway. Saturn has been known since prehistoric times. Galileo was the first to observe it with a telescope in 1610; he noted its odd appearance but was confused by it. Early observations of Saturn were complicated by the fact that the Earth passes through the plane of Saturn's rings every few years as Saturn moves in its orbit. This means that the rings are view "edge on," making them difficult to detect. It was not until 1659 that Christiaan Huygens correctly inferred the geometry of the rings. Saturn's rings remained unique in the known solar system until 1977 when very faint rings were discovered around Uranus, and as we learned last week, around Juniter.

Since Saturn's claim to fame is its rings let's learn a little more about them. First, there are at least 7 of them, not counting the open spaces, or dividers, between. Saturn's rings are extraordinarily thin: though they're 175,000 miles or more in diameter they're less than a half mile thick. Despite their impressive appearance, there's really very little material in

the rings -- if the rings were compressed into a single body it would be no more than 60 miles across.

Though they look continuous from the Earth, the rings are actually composed of innumerable small particles each in an independent orbit. They range in size from a centimeter or so to several meters. A few kilometer-sized objects are also likely. The ring particles seem to be composed primarily of water ice, but they may also include rocky particles with icy coatings.

Like Jupiter, Saturn has more than 50 named moons. When it is in the nighttime sky, Saturn is easily visible to the unaided eye. Though it is not nearly as bright as Jupiter, it is easy to identify as a planet because it doesn't "twinkle" like the stars do. The rings and the larger satellites are visible with a small telescope.

Look for Saturn high in the southwest after sunset, in western Virgo, just a couple of degrees below Denebola, the second brightest star in the constellation Leo the Lion. To find Leo find the Big Dipper and imagine the bottom falling out - the water would spill on Leo's back. Saturn's rings are currently very nearly

edge on, therefore not too spectacular. That will improve in the next couple months. Look for other stuff too, like the Summer Triangle, Little Dipper and my favorite, the Tea Pot. Enjoy the show. After all, it's free.



It sounds like we had approximately 550 diners, and lots of people stopping by to purchase camp items. We have plenty more t-shirts, hoodies, and other camp store items, if you didn't get a chance to purchase what you wanted on Sunday! We will also be receiving an order of embroidered fleece blankets this week.

Some of you may have noticed some improvements in our shower house when you came up to the breakfast this weekend. We received an anonymous donation this past winter which enabled us to put on a new roof, fix the leaky skylights, put in a new ventilation system, replace the rusty and dented bathroom stalls, and put in new drywall and plastic panels behind the showers. 
