



Stay out of the kitchen!

Grilled Two-Cheese Pizza

Total: 1 hr 10 mins

Ingredients

3 to 4 pounds beef back ribs (about 8 ribs)*

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon black pepper

1 large onion, finely chopped

1/2 cup honey

1/2 cup catsup

1 4-ounce can diced green chili peppers, drained

1 tablespoon chili powder

1 clove garlic, minced

1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

Directions

- 1. Trim fat from ribs. For rub, stir together the salt and black pepper. Sprinkle mixture evenly onto both sides of the ribs; rub into surface
- 2. In a grill with a cover arrange preheated coals around a drip pan. Test for medium heat above the pan. Place the ribs on the grill rack directly over the drip pan. Cover and grill for 1 to 1-1/4 hours or until the ribs are tender. Add more coals as needed.
- 3. Meanwhile, for sauce, in a small saucepan stir together the onion, honey, catsup, chili peppers, chili powder, garlic, and dry mustard. Cook and stir over low heat for 10 minutes. About 10 minutes before the ribs are finished grilling, brush sauce generously over ribs. Continue grilling until glazed. Pass remaining sauce. Makes 4 servings. Enjoy!

Again, no need to heat up the kitchen, just make it pizza night on the grill with just six ingredients and in less than 30 minutes!

Servings: 4 servings Prep: 25 mins Total: 25 mins Ingredients

1 package fresh chevre (goat) cheese (3 1/2 ounces)

2 packages prebaked Italian pizza crusts (two 8-inch crusts each) (10 ounces each) or 4 pita breads (8 inch)

4 plum (Roma) tomatoes, sliced

16 kalamata olives, cut in half, pitted

1 1/2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese (6 ounces)

 $1\ table spoon\ \ chopped\ or\ shredded\ fresh\ basil\ leaves$

Directions

Heat gas or charcoal grill. Spread cheese evenly over each pizza crust. Top with remaining ingredients except basil.
 Place pizzas on grill over medium heat. Cover grill; cook 5

2. Place pizzas on grill over medium heat. Cover grill; cook 5 to 10 minutes or until crusts are crisp and vegetables are hot. (If crusts brown too quickly, place a piece of foil between crusts and grill.) Sprinkle with basil.

Or simply add your own favorite ingredients and make it fun.

Grilled Texas-Style Beef

The slightly sweet grilling sauce gives a Texas twist to these back ribs. As is customary in the Lone Star State, most of the cooking is done before the sauce is slathered on. Be generous with the slathering, and be ready to serve more of the sauce on the side.

Dunkampin

named Dunkampin started out as a campsite in the woods overlooking the beautiful lake that Floyd Fulmer 'discovered' one day as he was out driving up and down the country roads in Cass County. A chance turn down a narrow dirt lane led to what would become home to five generations of the family.

Floyd drove down the dirt lane until he reached Nan Binkley's house, now the Parnell/Niezgodski home. He knocked on the door to ask who owned the land and found he was talking to the owner herself. In 1937 Floyd and Ruth bought a small parcel in the cove along with a new tent. Knowing the importance of good neighbors, friends were brought to the lake that also fell in love with it and bought lots of their own. The Shewmans (now Vaths) bought the lot next door, the Cowens (Dick's parents) bought a few lots down, as did Ruth's sister and her husband (the Partridges, now the Caenepeels and still in the family). It wasn't long after that Jack and Buddy (Fulmer) Asire bought a lot too.

Within a few years and with the help of good friends all working together, cottages began to go up. A black and white reel of movie film captured Floyd and Dee Shewman mixing concrete in a wheel barrow and pouring it into what would become the foundation for Dunkampin. The first cottage was fairly primitive with a pump handle by the sink for running water and an outhouse across the road but Ruth and Floyd were out of the tent and no longer camping, thus the name Dunkampin. Wanting to preserve as much as they could around the lake, Ruth and Floyd started saving and when finances allowed, they bought an additional five lots on the back side of the road. Having a vision of the future and not wanting the lake to become overcrowded, Floyd became active in closing



off the many lake easements that would have allowed for keyholing. He took his duties as yacht club commodore seriously and for a number of years was also the Barker editor which meant the rest of the family got roped into collecting the news, typing, and delivering the papers.

Summer evenings were filled with corn and sausage roasts followed by slide shows in the Beard's (now Waggoner's) shop or games of canasta that could get pretty competitive. The Westsiders were a tightly knit group of friends who passed their love of the lake on to their children and grandchildren. Dunkampin now boasts electricity, hot and cold running water and a high speed internet connection. It has come a long way from its first days so many years ago but it is still owned and loved by the Asires, descendants of Ruth and Floyd.






