



What to Drink?

A fine Cabernet Sauvignon Or your house-favorite beer Yield 20 appetizer servings

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup soy sauce
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1/4 cup water
- 2 tablespoons molasses
- 2 teaspoons mustard powder

- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon onion powder
- 2 pounds flank steak, cut into thin strips
- 32 wooden skewers (8 inch long) soaked in water

Directions

1. In a large resealable bag, combine the soy sauce, olive oil, water, molasses, mustard powder, ginger, garlic powder and onion powder. Seal and shake the bag to mix together. Add steak strips to the bag and seal. Refrigerate for at least 8 hours to marinate.2. Preheat the oven's broiler.Thread meat

"You spent how much on that sail and you like your old one better??!! Really??"


My suggestion to you all is regardless of where you place; tell your spouse you LOVE your new sail.

he clear skies on warm summer nights here at Birch Lake are what inspired me to write this column many years ago. Looking up and seeing so many stars, some bright, some not so bright, seeing planets and sometimes even satellites can be breathtaking. It can also be overwhelming, especially to the beginning stargazer. In town, city lights drown out all but the brightest objects in the sky. But here there is so much more to see. Our sky here at the lake is filled with twinkling lights. But what's what up there? Today we'll learn to pick out a couple of objects here in Stargazing 101.

A long time ago, before Wii, sliced bread or even chamber pots, folks had to entertain themselves by using their imagination. One game they played was Connect-the-Dots using the stars. Patterns were defined and named and stories were invented for them. In short, this gave birth to the constellations we know today. Let's find a few.

To start off, we need a landmark. One that almost everyone can find is the Big Dipper. Aptly named because it looks just like a dipper. The Big Dipper is really an asterism, which is just a recognizable part of a constellation, in this case, Ursa Major, the Big Bear. It rides high in the northern sky. Three stars form a handle and four make up the bowl. The two stars opposite where the handle connects can be used as pointer stars. If you draw an imaginary line from the star at the bottom of the bowl through the star at the top and follow the line north you will roughly arrive at Polaris, the North Star. Now the North Star is not particularly bright but it is important. It marks, again roughly, true north from anywhere in North America. It is also the end point on the handle of the Little Dipper, part of Ursa Minor, the Little Bear. It's tricky to see in town but much easier here at the lake. If you continue to follow your imaginary line beyond Polaris you will come to a group of five stars that looks like a lazy W, or M. This is Cassiopeia, the Oueen, one of my favorites and an interesting story.

Back to the Big Dipper. Imagine the bottom of the bowl of the dipper falling out. The water would have to go somewhere, right? It falls right on the back of Leo, the Lion, another favorite of mine. Leo really does look like a lion I think. You can imagine his outstretched front paws, his hind quarters and especially his head and mane, which is marked by a backward question mark, at the bottom of which you'll find blood red Regulus.

Once more back to the dipper. Starting where the handle connects to the bowl follow the arc of the handle through the sky to the first bright star, Arcturus, the brightest star in the constellation Bootes, the Herdsman. From Arcturus a line dropping straight down to the horizon will take you to Spica, a part of Virgo. To clarify this last bit remember this..."Arc to Arcturus and drive a spike down to Spica".

Now, not only do you have enough to get started enjoying the night sky but you also now know everything I know. Well, I may have held back a little. Get out there and enjoy the show. You know it's free.

Camp Tannadoonah

How we market Camp 1

ne of the questions I get a lot is how we go about marketing our camp program to potential campers and families. Here's what we've done the past few years:

In 2006, we had a tri-fold brochure that included our registration card right in the brochure. These were mailed to all of the previous year's campers. We also used some newspaper ads, but other than that we had very little in the way of advertising for our program. We didn't launch our registration for the season until the beginning of April.

In 2007, we built a new website and introduced online registration, but also continued to use the tri-fold brochure with a paper registration card included. We also offered an early bird discount for signing up by the end of April. We placed a few newspaper ads again.

In 2008, we had a combined brochure for Camp Tannadoonah and Camp Tawanchi, which no longer contained the registration cards. Parents could sign up online, or request a paper registration from the office. We had an early bird discount again, and this year pushed that back to March 1st.


In 2009, we produced a Tannadoonah-specific post card. We printed 20,000 of these post cards and distributed them to schools all over the Michiana area. We also started making use of monthly newsletters and emails to parents, and offered a referral bonus to campers who recruited a new camper to come with them to camp. We also offered a new early bird special with a bigger incentive (Feb 15 deadline).

In 2010 we introduced the yellow Camp Tannadoonah signs that you have probably seen around the community. We also started a "Friends of Tannadoonah" word of mouth group. This group consists of approximately 50 camper parents who are passionate supporters of camp. We send monthly emails to the group, with ideas on how they can help us spread the word about camp. We had our post cards, the early bird discount (Feb 1 deadline), yellow signs, referral bonuses, and used Google Ad Words to advertise online.

This year we added 5 billboards in the South Bend, Granger, and Mishawaka areas to help build awareness about camp, in addition to the post cards, referral bonuses, yellow signs, early bird discount (Feb 1 deadline), and Friends of Tannadoonah group. Plus we sent single-page fliers to parents in the Friends of Tannadoonah group that they could share with their friends and fami-

lies. Finally, we built a Tannadoonah FaceBook page to share news and information about Camp.

So what have we learned? Word of mouth is by far the best way to get new campers. Parents are much more likely to send their kids to a camp that they've heard about from friends. Newspaper ads and online ads weren't really getting us any campers. The yellow signs and post cards generate a few



campers each year - enough to justify the cost of making them. The billboards may have led to greater awareness about camp, but they didn't really lead to any camper sign ups. The early bird discounts get people thinking about camp earlier, and give a "jump start" on registrations early in the year. It also allows us to know which weeks are likely to be lower in camper numbers.

So knowing that word of mouth is the best way to get campers, I have a challenge for all of our lake residents: Recruit a camper to attend camp this year! Tell your friends about camp, talk about what we offer, and see if you can identify a child who would like to attend. Our camper numbers are looking great (450 campers registered already!), but we'd love to see that number go even higher. If every family up here convinced a camper to come to camp, we'd be completely full for the summer! 
