Of course a remodel project is a bit of a puzzle and one piece generally leads to another. Although not initially






### **Basic rules of sailboat racing**

In sailboat racing there are no out-of-bounds lines on the floor or referees to call fouls. The rules are self enforced and administered within the fleet. A basic understanding of just a few important rules will help ensure that everyone has fun and gets home safe.

The specifics of the sailboat racing rules are mind-numbingly detailed and written to cover all potential incidents. DON'T WORRY -You do not need to know everything about the rules to go out and have fun and be safe. By reading and understanding the following rules and terms, you should be able to get around the course without fouling another boat or causing an accident.

These rules should only be thought of as a beginning!

For a plain language discussion of the rules, look into purchasing Dave Perry's book entitled "Understanding the Racing Rules of Sailing" at the same site.

ummer officially arrives in three days, on June 21, the date of the summer solstice. That is the longest day of the year. But the date of earliest sunrise is about a week before the solstice, while the latest sunset occurs about a week after the solstice. The summer solstice marks the moment when the sun is in it's northernmost point in our sky, overhead at about 23.5 degrees north latitude.

We had a beautiful full moon earlier this week. It lined up opposite the Sun, so sunlight bathed the entire lunar hemisphere that faces Earth. June's full Moon is known as the Flower, Strawberry, Rose, or Honey Moon. It is nice to see but sometimes the brightness overpowers other objects in the night sky, such as meteors. The Lyonid meteor shower peaked this past week but because of the moon not many were likely visible. The Lyonid shower is not particularly prolific in the first place, but on any given night during the summer it is possible to see a shooting star here at the lake.

The planet Saturn is in the southwest at nightfall and looks like a bright golden star. A true star of the constellation Virgo is just a whisker away from it, so it looks like you're seeing double. Look up and to the right of Spica to find the pair. (Remember from last week...Arc to Arcturus and drive a spike down to Spica?) Saturn is much brighter than the star next to it but the pair is unmistakable.

Vega is the brightest star of the Summer Triangle, which is in view all night. Vega is well up in the east-northeast at nightfall and is nearly directly overhead all night long. It is the brightest star in that region of the sky, so it is easy to spot. The other two stars of the summer triangle are Deneb and Altair. Each of the three are a part of their own identifiable group of stars. Vega is the brightest star in Lyra, the harp. Vega is only about 25 light-years away, making it one of our closest neighbors. It shines pure white, which tells us that its surface is thousands of degrees hotter than the surface of the Sun.

Deneb, the white super-giant star is part of Cygnus, the swan. Deneb is an Arabic word meaning tail of the swan. At about 1500 light years from earth it still shines brightly because it is so massive. An airliner traveling at it's normal speed would take about a decade to circle Deneb's equator.

Altair, the Arabic word for eagle, is the third point in the summer triangle. It is the brightest star in the constellation Aquila, the eagle and is about 17 light years from home. Like the other two stars in the triangle Altair is a white, super hot star, much hotter than our sun. It can be found in the south or south east a good distance from Deneb and Vega. I remind myself that Altair is out there ... away from Vega and Deneb, but still an anchor of the triangle.

Look for Saturn and the summer triangle tonight and throughout the summer. The triangle will be visible until Christmas and beyond. Saturn too will be in the night sky for months to come. Track it's motion against the background of stars. Next week we'll cover some new ground and maybe tell some stories. Until then, the show's free, get out there and enjoy it. *-Stu Spratt*

# ~Birch Lake Recipes~

### **Burgundy Pork Tenderloin**

Looking for something different? Try this Pork Tenderloin. I served it with mashed potatoes. Yum!

#### What to Drink? Pinot Noir

Yield 4 servings

- *Ingredients* 2 pounds pork tenderloin
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- $\blacksquare$  1/2 onion, thinly sliced
- 1 stalk celery, chopped
- 2 cups red wine
- 1 (.75 ounce) packet dry brown gravy mix

#### **Directions**

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). 2. Place pork in a 9x13 inch baking dish, and sprinkle meat with salt, pepper and garlic powder. Top with onion and celery, and pour wine over all.



3. Bake in the preheated oven for 45 minutes.

4. When done baking, remove meat from baking dish, and place on a serving platter. Pour gravy mix into baking dish with wine and cooking juices, and stir until thickened. Slice meat, and cover with the gravy.

# **Camp is here!**

We've been getting everything set up and cleaned and organized all week, and we are so ready for campers to arrive on Sunday!

The first week of camp this year is Holidaze Week, and we'll be celebrating a different holiday every day! Sunday is Valentine's Day, Monday is St. Patrick's Day, Tuesday is Easter, Wednesday is the 4th of July, Thursday is Halloween, Friday is Thanksgiving, and Saturday is Christmas. We have an Easter Egg Hunt, Thanksgiving Dinner, and many other festive events planned for the week.

On Thursday night, for Halloween, we'll be taking the kids Trick-or-Treating around the lake! We have about 80 kids registered for camp, and we'll split them into two groups of around 40 kids and 10 or so counselors. If you're home, come on out to check out their costumes and hear them sing some camp songs. Candy is certainly not a requirement, but the kids would sure enjoy it! We'll probably make it about half way down the west side (approx Niezgodski's), and a little way down the east side (approx Vitale's) with our groups.

Debbie Bolinger will be teaching a day of painting, and Carol Dugan will be teaching a day on photography. We also have a counselor on our staff, Mr. J.P., who has a degree in sculpture, and he will be teaching two days of ceramics - one day to form their creations, and a second day to paint them. On the final art day of the week, Miss Sue Felix, our assistant director, will be helping our artists design and paint a mural here at camp!

Finally, Miss Kelsey will be teaching a week of German. She plans to teach the kids all about holiday traditions in Germany, some German holiday songs, and some conversational German to impress their friends when they go home. She'll also be offering German during All Ball week, and will teach two weeks of Arabic at the end of the summer as well!




