



A few years later, another summer at Birch Lake brought them back together to date, get engaged by Halloween and married the next February.


They spent many years



### **Water Quality Committee Report**

#### **EURASIAN MILFOIL**

Some four years ago, a few pockets of eurasion milfoil were witnessed blooming in our lake. Eurasion Milfoil is a particularly troublesome invasive species that has wreaked havoc on scores of lakes in Michigan alone. Fortunately, your Yacht Club and its' Water Quality Committee responded immediately, had the lake surveyed and treated, and have monitored and managed the situation since. Many lake residents made, and continue to make, special donations to offset these costs, for which the rest of us are most grateful.


For good reason then, our regular survey program continues. Progressive AE surveyed the entire lake for invasive aquatic plants on May 31st. They inspected last year's Milfoil sites and determined we will have to treat them again this year. The areas are slightly smaller than last year and there are signs of native plants growing in areas where the Milfoil once was. Good news! No new areas were found. Progressive did also find a small amount of Curly Leaf Pond Weed which is invasive species, but it is not presently a concern. The opinion was that it is unlikely that it can thrive in our lake. On June 6th Professional Lake Management treated the two Eurasian Milfoil sites.

Progressive AE will come back to reinspect and determine if a second treatment will be needed. By having an annual program we are able to keep the Milfoil under control. We may never get rid of it but our program seems to be preventing its' spread.


Eurasian Milfoil is an aggressive, tall growing exotic aquatic plant from Europe and Asia. It is capable of growing to the surface in 10 to 15 feet of water. At the surface it forms a dense canopy of vegetation over other plants. Many native plants may be reduced in abundance by the Milfoil canopy. It also conflicts with many recreational activities. In dense conditions it is a serious localized and lake wide problem. It is not



a significant food crop for waterfowl, other birds or aquatic mammals. It readily regenerates from detached fragments and spreads rapidly. Consequently this plant can form dense colonies covering much of a lake's littoral (or near shore) zone. Being an exotic it has few natural biological control agents.

couple of my favorites sail across the southern sky during the summer -Sagittarius and Scorpius. I understand that those of you on the south shore probably can't see them at all but we can all still enjoy some interesting stories.

The constellation Sagittarius represents the centaur Chiron. Most of the centaurs were regarded in myth as bestial--they were, after all, half horse. However, the ancient Greeks had a great deal of respect for the horse, and so were reluctant to make the centaurs entirely bad. In fact, Chiron was renowned for his gentleness. He was an excellent archer, musician, and physician, and tutored the likes of Achilles, Jason, and Hercules.

Chiron, however, was accidentally shot and wounded by Hercules. The arrow, which had been dipped in the poison of the Hydra, inflicted great suffering on Chiron--so great, in fact, that even the talented physician could not cure himself. In agony, but as an immortal unable to find release in death, Chiron instead offered himself as a substitute for Prometheus. The gods had punished Prometheus for giving fire to man by chaining him to a rock. Each day an eagle would devour his liver, and each night it would grow back. Jupiter, however, had at the request of Hercules agreed to release Prometheus if a suitable substitute could be found. Chiron gave up his immortality and went to Tartarus in place of Prometheus; in recognition of his goodness, Jupiter placed him in the stars.

Scorpius, the scorpion leads the way ahead of Sagittarius across the night sky. The scorpion is generally believed to be responsible for the death of the great hunter Orion. According to some myths, the scorpion stung Orion in response to his boast that he could defeat any beast. According to others, it was sent by Apollo, who was concerned for his sister Debra's continued chastity.

In either case, Scorpius was placed in the opposite side of the sky from Orion so as to avoid any further conflict. It is to the southeast of Libra, and is marked by the bright red star Antares, which is Greek for "Rival of Ares," the Greek war-god. The star is so named because of of its brightness and color, which are approximately the same as of the planet Mars. Mars, of course, is the Roman name for Ares.

Look for Sagittarius in the southeast most any night this summer after 10:30pm or so. It's most recognizable part is the stars that form the shape of a teapot, the archer part actually, and on really clear nights the Milky Way seems to steam from the teapot's spout. Scorpius, just to the west, is also quite recognizable with it's wide claws, swooping, curling tail and bright red heart. Also look for the cat's eyes at the end of the tail.

We'll share some additional interesting tales in weeks to come, including "The End". Think Jim Morrison. Get out there and enjoy the show. The price is right you know.

- · 2 tablespoons sherry
- · 1 tablespoon sesame oil

- · 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- $\cdot \quad 8$  skinless, boneless chicken breast halves cut into 2 inch pieces
- 1 (20 ounce) can pineapple chunks, drained
- skewers

#### **Directions**

1. In a shallow glass dish, mix the soy sauce, brown sugar, sherry, sesame oil, ginger, and garlic powder. Stir the chicken pieces and pineapple into the marinade until well coated. Cover, and marinate in the refrigerator at least 2 hours.

2. Preheat grill to medium-high heat.

3. Lightly oil the grill grate. Thread chicken and pineapple alternately onto skewers. Grill 15 to 20 minutes, turning occasionally, or until chicken juices run clear.




