

Homeowner's Association


The Birch Lake Homeowner's Association will host its annual meeting on Saturday, July 9 at 10 am (following the BLYC Board Meeting).


1989. Then, in the winter of 2008, the house endured extreme water damage from a pipe that burst. The interior of the house needed to be reconstructed. Many amenities inside and out were added during the reconstruction, including the custom paneling that Bud and Barb had

made to look like the "original cottage".

The Zesinger house was originally built in the 1940's by Dr. Fred Reed. The three stone fireplaces were hand built out of boulders collected from surrounding farm fields. Dr Reed's brother, Ralph, was an accomplished stone mason and spent 4 months building the fireplaces. These three fireplaces are still intact and are the centerpieces of the home.

A little Birch Lake trivia: During World War II, Dr. Reed, a surgeon, and his wife, a nurse, used their dining room in this house as a medical clinic, since he was the only available doctor in the area. In fact, the State Police had Dr. Reed's phone number to contact him for emergencies.

Bud and Barb's six grandchildren love Birch Lake and continue to spend as much time as possible at Gram ma and Gram pa's "Birch Lake House."

Solution Fleet Captain's Corner in the second secon

ast last Sunday. East winds are not very typical for this time of year. Harold and I were scratching our heads as to the best course layout given the shape of the lake and the 40 degree oscillations we were seeing. We eventually settled on a short course due east/west with marks to starboard. Short was good since the winds died several times during the races.

Finding pressure and clear air are key in these conditions. A brief wind shadow from another boat can be the difference in how you place. (For you landlubbers, a wind shadow is the area of disturbed air downwind created by the sail. It can extend up to 10 boat lengths and can be especially devastating in light winds.)

Thanks to Bob and Sue Waddle,

J.P. and Marlow Hoyer, and Claudia Phipps for running the committee boat. As I've said before, without volunteers we can't hold a race. We do appreciate their giving of their time on a Sunday morning for our benefit.

The schedule for Fourth of July Regatta is to sail on Saturday and Monday at our normal time of 11:00 AM. We will only sail on Sunday if we cannot sail on Saturday. The start time on Sunday would be pushed back to 12:00 Noon so as not to conflict with the Pancake breakfast.

The Fourth of July Regatta will be scored using the Low Point Scoring System. Winners will be announced in next week's Barker. As a reminder, all Fourth of July Regatta races will also be scored using the regular season Square of 40 System and included in the season totals. 

Summer Bacteria Testing

A few years ago, there was some concern expressed regarding potential bacterial contamination in the lake. Immediately your Yacht Club Board hired an independent testing agency to sample and test the lake water a number of times at a number of places. Simultaneously, the Water Quality Committee started gathering its own samples and running its own tests. All tests were negative. Since then, we have had a regular testing program through which we have been able to demonstrate that the lake has been safe to use.

The concern had been over potential E coli contamination. E coli is a bacteria found in the intestinal tract of most vertebrates and thus can be found in some waterways where one has ducks, geese, dogs, babies, and other assorted wildlife. The state sets levels for safe water usage and we have never been close to levels which could be used to close a beach. The usual reasons for beach closures have been sewage overflows following big rains due to combined storm and wastewater sewer lines or where huge infestations of geese have left pounds of


their grass fed waste on the shore line. The only location on our lake that has in the past demonstrated high levels of E coli is the little stream inlet on the northeast corner of the lake and we know that is not from the sewer, or any human source, based on testing. However, in sampling the lake water only a few feet away from the stream inlet, dilution led to only occasional findings.

This year we have just completed our first sampling of the Jake for E coli. Five sites were chosen and triplicate samples were taken at each site. The samples are plated out in a defined medium on petri dishes and incubated at 95 degrees for 24 hours. E coli will show up as blue colonies or spots on the plate. large numbers of colonies can indicate a problem. The three samples from the little stream all had colonies on the plates but not as many as we have




recorded in the past years. The remaining 12 samples from the body of the lake had either (8 samples) no evidence of E coli or (4 samples) levels that could be considered almost random or background, i.e. way below (less than 10% of) the State set standards.

We will continue to test the lake during the summer season and report this information to you through the Barker.

asn't Monday an awesome day? I felt the Earth move under my feet. I saw the sky come tumbling down. I was going to make a song about that but Deb just told me that someone else already did. Darn. Anyway, so what happened? An asteroid the size of a house missed Earth by a mere 7600 miles. Thankfully it missed the near side by that much because if it missed China by 7600 miles it would have splashed Birch Lake dry. The upside is that at least we'd find the covered wagons.

And now back to our stories...Most ancient cultures saw pictures in the stars of the night sky. The earliest known efforts to catalogue the stars date to cuneiform texts and artifacts dating back roughly 6000 years. These remnants, found in the valley of the Euphrates River, suggest that the ancients observing the heavens saw the lion, the bull and the scorpion in the stars. The constellations as we know them today are undoubtedly very different from those first few. Our night sky is a compendium of images from a number of different societies, both ancient and modern. By far, though, we owe the greatest debt to the mythology of the ancient Greeks and Romans.

Despite the many mentions of the stars in Greek and early Roman texts, clearly the most thorough star catalogue from ancient times belongs to the Roman Ptolemy of Alexandria, who grouped 1022 stars into 48 constellations during the 2nd century A.D. Although Ptolemy's Almagest does not include the constellations which may only be seen from the southern hemisphere, it forms the basis for the modern list of 88 constellations officially designated by the International Astronomical Union. The influence of both the Greek and Roman cultures may be plainly seen; the myths behind the constellations date back to ancient Greece, but we use their Latin names.

And now our story - The Great Bear

The wood-nymph Callisto was a maiden in the wild region


Arcadia. She was a huntress, not one who spent her time in spinning soft fibers of wool, or in arranging her hair in different styles. No, she was one of Diana's warriors, wearing her tunic pinned together with a brooch, her tresses carelessly caught back by a white ribbon, and carrying in her hand a light javelin or her bow.

Jupiter caught sight of her and immediately desired her. He took on the shape of the goddess Diana and spoke to Callisto, who was delighted to see the form of her mistress. She began to tell him of her hunting exploits, and he responded by raping her. She resisted him as far as a woman could--had Juno seen her she would have been less cruel--but how could a girl overcome a man, and who could defeat Jupiter? He had his way with her, and returned to the upper air.

Unfortunate Callisto bore a son to Jupiter, Arcas, infuriating Juno, wife of Jupiter. Out of jealousy, she transformed the girl into a bear. She lived for a time in the wild, until Arcas came across her one day while hunting. Unknowingly, he was about to kill his mother in her bear form, but Jupiter took mercy on Callisto, stayed Arcas's hand, and transformed him into a lesser bear. The king of gods then placed both mother and son into the heavens as neighboring constellations.

The constellation Ursa Major, representing Callisto, is one of our most familiar. It includes the Big Dipper, perhaps the most-recognized feature of a constellation in the heavens. Look for it in the norther part of the sky any time after dark. Follow the pointer stars to the end of the handle on the Little Dipper.

Who thinks up this stuff? We'll have more next week. Until then, put on your bug spray and get out there and enjoy the show. It's free. -Stu Spratt

Juicy marinated steaks

Vera CAS Sear Cloudy Control C

Oh Mighty Grill Master, please make this for me! I would recommend a bold Merlot.

"Tender, marinated steaks with a taste that will enhance and not overpower the flavor of a good steak." Original Recipe Yield 4 servings

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup canola oil
- 1/4 cup high-quality root beer
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 2 tablespoons teriyaki sauce
- 2 tablespoons steak sauce (such as Heinz 57®)
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1/2 teaspoon onion salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil
- 1/2 teaspoon ground thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon dried rosemary
- 4 (6 ounce) rib-eye steaks

Directions

1. Stir the canola oil, root beer, Worcestershire sauce, teriyaki sauce,

steak sauce, garlic salt, onion salt, black pepper, basil, thyme, and rosemary together in a bowl.

2. Pierce the steaks in several places on both sides; arrange in a single layer in a shallow non-reactive dish. Pour the marinade over the steaks, flipping the meat to coat both sides. Allow to marinate in refrigerator 3 to 4 hours, flipping meat once halfway through.

3. Preheat an outdoor grill for medium-high heat, and lightly oil the grate.

4. Remove the steaks from the marinade and shake off excess moisture; discard the remaining marinade.

5. Cook the steaks until they are beginning to firm, and are hot and slightly pink in the center, 5 to 7 minutes per side. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read 140 degrees F (60 degrees C) for medium




