Birch Lake Memories ...

Hello, My name is Joanne Postema and I have a two-fold reason for sending you this message.

Are you aware that a long time Birch Lake native passed away recently? If you Google Nancy Harvey Waddell, you will find her obituary. It would be good if you could post that in a future issue of the Birch Barker as many residents will surely remember her and be saddened to hear of her passing.

I just recently (quite by accident) found your online addition of the Birch Barker and last night spent several hours reading through many of them. I was filled with nostalgia and sweet memories of growing up at Birch Lake!

I'll just relate a few...

It was 65 years ago in July that I


was delivered by a Dr. Fred Reed at Three Rivers Hospital and brought home to live in a tiny trailer home that my parents had parked on a lot they rented next to the home of Ruel and Margaret Harvey (the above-named Nancy's parents). Dr. Reed was their next door neighbor.

While I don't remember those first few years I have pictures of myself as a baby napping on a blanket in their yard, and sitting and splashing in the shallow water in front of their house. The first trip I ever took (as noted in my baby book) was a boat ride on Birch Lake !

My parents were Rhyner and Wilma Scholma. My dad worked for the Michigan DNR as a research biologist and Birch Lake was one of the lakes that was being researched by him. His job was to ride around the lake in his boat and to ask fishermen if he could take fish scale samples from their catches. There may be some old timers who remember him.

At some point in the fifties my folks bought a cottage up on the (Nun-u-Kumuk ??) hill where we lived yearround until he was transferred in 1962. I believe they sold the home to a John & Roma Went.

One of my not-so favorite memories is the 99 steps we had to go down and up each day during the school year to catch a school bus to Constantine. My dad helped build those first

steps, which I'm sure have been replaced many times in the 50+ years since then. My dad passed away two years ago at age 96, and to his dying day enjoyed telling of his years living and working at Birch Lake to anyone who was interested.

Some more of my favorite memories are:

■ Swimming from our pier all the way across Birch to the other side with Toni King following in a row boat. (When I see pictures of the lake now I can hardly believe I actually did that — I must have been crazy!)

■ Having relatives with speed boats visit so I could go skiing! (We were too poor to own one of our own.) And I'm not sure of the name of the wonderful lady who lived on the lake next door to our easement who would also invite me to ski- the daughter's name was Sue. (Glenton, maybe?)

Watching the sailboats racing from afar on week -ends.
 Riding bikes around as much of the lake as we could travel on with bikes.

Watching fireworks over the lake on the 4th of July!
Ice skating in the winter...
And I too, helped to gather news for and deliver the Birch Barker at some point; memory is kind of fuzzy as to who actually produced it back then.

I have only been back to Birch Lake a couple times since moving away but now think I might try to find a cottage to rent next summer so I could revisit some of those old memories and introduce my now adult children to Birch Lake. There still is no lake that I have found during the years to compare! Didn't realize how much I missed it. Thanks for reading this long e-mail.





hree royals can be found in the night sky and their story is like a soap opera. Cepheus, king of Ethiopia, was married to the beautiful Cassiopeia, and together they had a daughter, Andromeda. Although his name is most well-known in connection with his daughter, Cepheus was placed in the sky of his own right: He voyaged as an Argonaut with Jason on the quest for the Golden Fleece.

Cassiopeia was the beautiful wife of Cepheus, king of Ethiopia, and the mother of Andromeda. She is most famous in connection with the myth of her daughter, Andromeda. The queen made the mistake of bragging that she was more lovely than the Nereids, or even than Juno (Jupiter's wife - remember?) herself. The goddesses were, needless to say, rather insulted, and went to Neptune, god of the sea, to complain. Neptune promptly sent a sea monster (possibly Cetus?) to ravage the coast.

The horrified king consulted Ammon, the oracle of Jupiter, who said that Neptune could be appeased only by sacrificing Cassiopeia's beautiful virgin daughter, Andromeda, to the monster. Andromeda was duly chained to a rock on the coast, fully exposed to the monster. Fortunately for her, the hero Perseus happened to be flying by on his way back from killing the Gorgon Medusa. When Perseus saw the princess, her arms chained to the hard rock, he would have taken her for a marble statue, had not the light breeze stirred her hair, and warm tears streamed from her eyes. Without realizing it, he fell in love. Amazed at the sight of such rare beauty, he stood still in wonder, and almost forgot to keep his wings moving in the air. As he came to a halt, he called out: "You should not be wearing such chains as these--the proper bonds for you are those which bind the hearts of fond lovers! Tell me your name, I pray, and the name of your country, and why you are in chains."

At first she was silent; for, being a girl, she did not dare to speak to a man. She would have concealed her face modestly behind her hands, had they not been bound fast. What she could do, she did, filling her eyes with starting tears. When Perseus persisted, questioning her again and again, she became afraid lest her unwillingness to talk might seem due to guilt; so she told him the name of her country, and her own name, and she also told him how her mother, a beautiful woman, had been too confident in her beauty.

Before she had finished, the waters roared and from the ocean wastes there came a menacing monster, its breast covering the waves far and wide. The girl screamed. Her sorrowing father was close at hand, and her mother too.

> They were both in deep distress, though the mother had more cause to be so. Perseus tells

Andromeda's parents that he'll kill the monster if they agree to give him their daughter's hand in marriage. They of course give him their consent, and Perseus kills the monster. (His exact method of doing so varies in different versions of the myth. Ovid has Perseus stab the monster to death after a

drawn-out, bloody battle, while other versions have the hero simply hold up the head of Medusa, turning the monster to stone.) Andromeda is freed, and the two joyously marry.

By most accounts, Cassiopeia was quite happy with the match. In some versions of the myth, however, the queen objects to the marriage and is turned to stone when Perseus shows her the head of the Gorgon Medusa.

Although she was placed in the heavens by Neptune, the sea-god saw fit to humiliate her one final time (and for all eternity). He placed her so that she is seated on her throne, with her head pointing towards the North Star Polaris. In this position, she spends half of every night upside-down.

All three members of the family may be found in the northern sky; Cepheus and Cassiopeia are quite close to the northern celestial pole. Cepheus is generally represented as a robed king with a crown of stars, standing with his left foot planted over the pole and his scepter extended towards his queen. Andromeda is represented in the sky as the figure of a woman with her arms outstretched and chained at the wrists.

The stories continue and the show never ends. Let's get out there and enjoy it while it's still free.



Stuffed Jalapeno Firecrackers

Ingredients

- 1. 12 jalapeno peppers, halved lengthwise

- 4. 12 slices jalapeno bacon, cut in half
- 5. toothpicks

Directions

Preheat the oven's broiler and set the oven rack about 6 inches from the heat source. Fill the jalapeno peppers with cream cheese.

Sprinkle the Cajun seasoning on top, then wrap each stuffed jalapeno with a slice of bacon.



Secure with a toothpick.

Arrange the wrapped jalapeno peppers in a single layer, face down on a broiler rack.

Broil in the preheated oven until the bacon becomes crisp, 8 to 15 minutes on each side.


