

A preview of fall sailing

ast Sunday we had a preview of fall with cooler temperatures and low hanging steel-gray clouds. If it was any cooler, lake effect rain would have been a possibility but thankfully we stayed dry. The wind was from the north, spilling over the Camp's cliff onto the water. It was fairly steady in pressure but was shifty throughout the course not just at the windward mark. It's been a long time since there hasn't been a day without drifter moments during the race.


committee boat and helped them for the rest of the day.

DNS (Did Not Sail) does not count against season score, however sailor must complete 2/3 of races to qualify for season. DNF (Did Not Finish)

DSQ (Disqualified) scores as one place worse than last place (if 5 boats finished, you would have finished 6th, will be scored as 7th place).

DNF, DSQ not counted toward minimum number of races needed.

CB - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total. Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.)

Water Quality Committee Report Chlorophyll graphs, Loosestrife

Last week the graphs for the chlorophyll concentrations from 1999-2010 and the corresponding Carlson Trophic Indexes were somehow transposed in the communications.

Terry Dugan produced the product based on a single lesson from his youngest son and thus was on the early slope of the learning curve.


The graphs on this page should more properly represent the data discussed. Again, although the chlorophyll concentrations bounce around a bit, they are still in a range indicating good lake health and fit into the oligotrophic boundary.


The key is they are not increasing yearly and the last two years were some of the lowest. The corresponding Carlson Trophic Index scores for the chlorophyll levels are also on the shoulder of oligotrophic to mesotrophic, and again without any indication of increasing.

Again, it will be interesting to follow both of these graphs when we have another ten years of data. Within the next couple of weeks we will provide information on dissolved oxygen in the lake and what that has and can tell us about the health and aging of the lake.

Purple Loosestrife Management Program

The Birch Lake Water Quality Committee started the Purple Loosestrife Management Program in 2000. The program has been very effective, in 2000 we had 10 sites located on all shores of the lake some of which were very dense. We continue to monitor for Purple Loosestrife each year and remove the plants that we find. The plants bloom toward the end of July and into September. If you see the plant or suspect it call a water quality member to check it out. So far this year Bruce





Wagner has removed about a dozen plants at 3 sites on the west shore.


Purple Loosestrife is a plant that was accidentally introduced to the United States and then distributed as an ornamental. It is most easily identified during the flowering season from July to September. This spiked purple flower can be seen in ditches, steams, rivers, wetlands, and other moist shallow water sites. This plant is an upright, hardy perennial, four to eight feet tall and most often found in a group. These plants form dense stands that quickly replace native wetland plants. Purple Loosestrife will grow from the roots of an established plant, however the plants spread mainly by seed. Having up to 300,000 seeds per stalk, these tiny seeds can live in the soil and water for many years and can be transported great distances by humans, animals and water.

eptune is brightest for the year and remains in the sky all night. But the fourth-largest planet is so far away you need a telescope to see it.

After the discovery of Uranus in 1781, astronomers had a difficult time accurately describing the planet's orbit. Uranus seemed to be pulled by the gravity of an unseen planet. Working independently, two mathematicians calculated the position of such a planet and passed it on to astronomers. When German astronomer Johan Galle aimed his telescope at that position in 1846, he quickly detected the new world.

Galle had discovered the solar system's fourth-largest planet. It is a soothing blue-green orb that looks like a giant marble spinning through space. Its color is the result of methane in its upper atmosphere, which absorbs red light, allowing us to see only the blue end of the spectrum.

Neptune probably has a rocky core wrapped in a layer of frozen water and other ices. The core is fairly large, so Neptune is actually the third most massive planet in the solar system. Traces of other elements form clouds at the top of its thick atmosphere. Neptune's rotation stretches the clouds into bands that completely encircle the planet.

We can't see a lot of features in Neptune's

atmosphere, but the features that astronomers can detect appear to come and go in a hurry. When the Voyager 2 spacecraft flew past Neptune in August 1989, for example, it discovered the Great Dark Spot -- a dark, ovalshaped storm system as big as Earth. But when Hubble Space Telescope looked at Neptune five years later, the Great Dark Spot had disappeared.

Voyager also found that Neptune produces more heat than it receives from the Sun. One theory says that a "rain" of liquid hydrogen falls onto the planet's core, releasing heat as it falls.

Several rings of rocky material that is darker than chimney soot encircle Neptune. The rings may have formed when a comet slammed into a small moon, destroying both the comet and the moon. The debris then spread out to form rings. Today, this material is merging to form larger clumps. Within about 10,000 years, the ring material may coalesce to form a moon -- a moon reborn from the ashes of its own demise.

Some other interesting facts include -Distance from Sun - 2.8 billion miles, diameter - 30,776 miles, length of day - 16 hours 7 minutes, length of year - 164.8 Earth years, known moons - 13.

Look for Neptune (with your telescope) to

the lower left of Jupiter this evening. Jupiter rises in the east not long after night fall and is the brightest object in that part of the sky. Saturn is currently fading in the western evening twilight but next week the Moon, Mercury, and Saturn line up left to right very low in the west about 30 minutes after sunset. You may need binoculars to see the planets. Until next week, enjoy the show. It's free, and one of the many reasons I love Birch Lake. *-Stu Spratt*

Grilled Salmon

Original Recipe Yield 4 servings

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- \cdot 1/4 cup soy sauce
- 2 teaspoons lemon pepper
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 1 teaspoon dried parsley
 1/2 teaspoon garlic powd
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
 4 (6 ounce) salmon fillets

Directions

1. Whisk together the brown sugar,

olive oil, soy sauce, lemon pepper, thyme, basil, parsley, and garlic powder in a bowl, and pour into a resealable plastic bag. Add the salmon fillets, coat with the marinade, squeeze out excess air, and seal the bag. Marinate in the refrigerator for at least 1 hour, turning occasionally. 2. Preheat an outdoor grill for medium heat, and lightly oil the grate. Remove the salmon from the marinade,

and shake off excess. Discard the remaining marinade.



3. Grill the salmon on the preheated grill until browned and the fish flakes easily with a fork, about 5 minutes on each side.
