

### Drunken sailors ...

what do you do with a drunken sailor,
What do you do with a drunken sailor,

Earl-aye in the morning.

This shanty was sung to accompany certain work tasks aboard sailing ships, especially those that required a bright walking pace. It is believed to originate in the early 19th century or before, during a period when ships' crews, especially those of military vessels, were sufficiently large to permit hauling a rope whilst simply marching along the deck. With the advent of merchant packet and clipper ships and their smaller crews, which required different working methods, use of the shanty appears to have declined or shifted to other, minor tasks.

"Drunken Sailor" was revived as a popular song among non-sailors in the 20th century, and grew to become one of the best-known songs of the shanty repertoire among mainstream audiences. It has been performed and recorded by many musical artists, such as The Irish Rovers, and has appeared in many popular media.

Although the song's lyrics vary widely, they usually contains some variant of the question, "What shall we do with a drunken sailor, early in the morning?" In some styles of performance, each successive verse suggests a method of sobering or punishing the drunken sailor.

Additional verses include:

- Sling him in the long boat till he's sober,
- Give 'im a taste of the bosun's rope-end.
- Shave his belly with a rusty razor.
- Turn him over and drive him windward.
- Put him in the scuppers with a hose-pipe on him.
- Put him in bed with the captain's daughter \*.
- Heave him by the leg and with a rung console him.
- That's what we'll do with the drunken sailor.

# Proposed change stirs concerns

The Birch Lake Homeowner's Association and the Water Quality
Committee request that all reading the article reprinted below email Mr.
Lossee (at loseet@michigan.gov) prior to June 21, expressing their strong objection to this proposed change eliminating requirements for notice and public hearing[s] for before installing docks at public landings.





#### ML&SA Opposes DEQ Issuance of Permits for Public Docks at Public Road Ends and on Publicly Owned Lands without Public Notification or Hearing

The Michigan DEQ is proposing to revise the criteria for the issuance of permits associated with certain lake and stream activities (read the above article). Proposed changes to Minor Permit categories would allow the DEQ to issue permits for the installation of "public docks at public road ends" and on publicly owned lands without first issuing a public notice and/or holding a public hearing within the affected lake community.

While Michigan Lake and Stream Associations does not oppose the installation of public docks under the limited criteria specified by Public Act 56, we nevertheless recognize that the very presence of these obtrusive physical structures at public road ends carry significant potential to adversely affect public safety, degrade natural shoreline structures and habitats, affect the riparian rights of those living near or adjacent to public road ends, diminish the overall navigability of inland lakes as well as the overall social ambiance and quality of life within affected inland lake neighborhoods. For these important reasons, Michigan Lake and Stream Associations is adamantly opposed to the issuance of DEQ permits to install "a single seasonal public dock or wharf that is authorized by the local unit of government..."or on public lands without first offering affected lakefront residents the right of due process fostered by timely public notification and/or the opportunity discuss the proposed public dock at an open public hearing.

Michigan Lake and Stream Associations strongly suggests that lakefront property owners send an e-mail to Mr. Todd Losee (e-mail: loseet@michigan.gov) of the DEQ Water Resources Division expressing their objection to the issuance of Minor Permits to allow installation of a public dock at a public road end or on public lands without first notifying members of the affected lake community and/or holding an open public hearing. Please note that the deadline for commenting on these proposed changes is June 21st.

### Stu's Star Stuff



### Summer solstice

dednesday next week is the summer solstice, which is the longest day of the year for us at Birch Lake and the start of the summer season. The solstice occurs at 7:09 pm EDT, when the Sun reaches its northernmost point for the year. And aren't you glad we no longer have to translate the time of day for those who simply couldn't grasp what time it happened to be wherever they were standing? I know I am. And since I've set foot down this road I may as well continue.

Celestial bodies — the Sun, Moon, planets, and stars — have provided us a reference for measuring the passage of time throughout our existence. Ancient civilizations relied upon the apparent motion of these bodies through the sky to determine seasons, months, and years.

Not until somewhat recently (that is, in terms of human history) did people find a need for knowing the time of day. As best we know, 5000 to 6000 years ago great civilizations in the Middle East and North Africa began to make clocks to augment their calendars. People needed to know how late the band played at Jabar's Oasis on Saturday night and at what time Jaquim's Family Restaurant opened on Sunday morning. Clocks were needed.

All clocks must have two basic components:

- 1. A regular process or action to mark off equal increments of time. Early examples of such processes included the movement of the sun across the sky, candles marked in increments, oil lamps with marked reservoirs and sand/hour glasses.
- 2. A means of keeping track of the increments of time and displaying the result. Our ways of keeping track of

the passage of time include the position of clock hands and digital time displays. (Cultural aside...Young folks today have no concept of clockwise and counter-clockwise because the numbers just magically appear on their timekeeping devices such as iPads and cell phones.)

Timekeeping devices evolved from obelisks/sundials, water clocks, and incense burning clocks to finally mechanical pendulum clocks in 1656. A Dutch scientist's early pendulum clock had an error of less than 1 minute a day, the first time such accuracy had been achieved. Christiaan Huygens's later refinements reduced his clock's error to less than 10 seconds a day.

Quartz clocks came into use as early as 1920 and greatly improved accuracy, although from one quartz crystal to another there was some variation. After the study of quartz crystals stimulated with electricity scientists realized that atoms (and molecules) have resonances; each chemical element and compound absorbs and emits electromagnetic radiation at its own characteristic frequencies. These resonances are inherently stable over time and space. An atom of hydrogen or cesium here today is (so far as we know) exactly like one a million years ago or in another galaxy. Thus atoms constitute a potential "pendulum" with a reproducible rate that can form the basis for more accurate clocks.

In the 1840s a railway standard time for all of England, Scotland, and Wales evolved, replacing several "local time" systems. The Royal Observatory in Greenwich began transmitting time telegraphically in 1852 and by 1855 most of Britain used Greenwich time. Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) subsequently evolved as an important and



well-recognized time reference for the world.

From GMT and the establishment of the prime meridian time zones were logically and methodically established in the US and around the globe. During WWI Daylight Saving Time came into use to save electricity. Its acceptance was widespread but there were isolated areas of resistance that ended up causing confusion to some. More on that another time.


Have you ever made your own homemade Guacamole? Here's an easy and yummy recipe to try.




