



Stu's Star Stuff



Are you smarter than a 5th grader?

n July 4th Earth was at aphelion, which means it was at its farthest point from the Sun for the year. We are more than 94 million miles from the Sun, which is about three million miles farther than when Earth was closest to the Sun in January.

So how can it be so much hotter now than when we were closer?

If you are smarter than a fifth grader, or if you have followed this subject before, you know. For newbies though, the answer is that the angle of Earth's rotational axis in relation to Earth's path around the sun is tilted approximately 23 degrees from vertical relevant to our celestial orbit.

Coincidently, as we approach in our orbit what we call Summer, our part of Earth, the northern hemisphere, is tilted more toward the sun, thus receiving the sun's energy more directly.

In Winter at Birch Lake the southern hemisphere receives the most direct sunlight and as a result the warmest temperatures, even though we are much closer to the sun than we are now.

Going to work each morning this week, heading east on Douglas Road I've recently been able to spot two planets. Venus, the now "morning star," is fairly

low in the east around 5:45am.

The slightly fainter planet
Jupiter is directly above it and both are very easy to find on a clear morning at that hour as the brightening dawn skies begin to overpower all but the brightest objects in the sky.

The true star Aldebaran, the orange eye of Taurus, the bull, is a bit below Venus. It doesn't look as impressive as the two



planets, but that's only because of its great distance.

In the evening, as twilight drains from the eastern sky, a pyramid of bright stars fades into view: the Summer Triangle. The apex of the pyramid is Vega, the leading light of Lyra, the harp, about halfway up the eastern sky. Deneb is to its lower left, with Altair farther to its lower right. More later

The show starts at dusk and continues until dawn. One ticket will get you into the early show or the late show. And it's all free. ~Stu Spratt





Raptors come to Camp T

appy 4th of July Week! This week we had a 4-day break between camp sessions to accommodate the holiday. It was nice to have some time to spend at home, and to enjoy the air conditioning!

Last week at camp was Survivor Week, and oh, what a week it was! With 100+ degree temperatures, storms, a counselor and several campers getting sick, our cook having to take some time off, and the ice machine breaking down, it was surely an adventure. But everyone survived Survivor Week, and it was a fun and exciting week despite it all!

On Tuesday afternoon, some ladies from the Lake Milton Raptor Center came out to give a presentation on Birds of Prey for Survivor Week! It was amazing - they brought 3 owls (a barn owl, a screech owl, and a barred owl), plus a peregrine falcon, and a golden eagle! The kids were thrilled by the birds and had a great time learning more about them. The Eagle was beautiful!

This week we start our Outer Space Mini Week on Thursday afternoon, and go straight into Super Week and International Week on Sunday. Campers can attend both Mini Week and International Week for a 10-day "Super Week" session. For the 3-day mini portion, we have 61 campers, which will be a nice break for our staff. Then on Sunday, about half of those 61 go home, and another group comes in in the afternoon for International Week. We have a total of 106 attending for International Week!

Each cabin will be a country, and they get to design a flag and create a "cheer" for their country. For special activities, we will have a Japanese program that they can sign up for this week, taught my Melissa Raffelock, the Mishawaka High School Japanese teacher.

Also this week, we have Rich Mullin teaching Lacrosse, and Terry Dugan and Tory Troeger teaching Science! Plus Celia Fallon will be driving our waterskiing boat for the next few weeks, so be sure to wave when you see her out on the lake with our skiers!



Our total camper number is up to 556 "regular" campers - which is 31 ahead of last year on this date, and just 69 away from our goal of 625 for the summer. Last year we finished with 585 campers, and picked up 61 between this point and the end of the summer. And this year we go a week longer, so we have an extra 7 days to gain those 69 campers to get to our goal.

If you have kids, grandkids, nieces, nephews, neighbors or anyone else that you know between the ages of 6 and 16, make sure you tell them about Camp Tannadoonah! We still have openings for all of our remaining sessions, and would love to fill them up!

A big thank you to the Pancake Breakfast crew and everyone who attended on Sunday morning! I always love seeing all the different faces at the breakfast, including many people whom I don't see any other time of the year. As always, the crew did a wonderful job preparing the breakfast, and cleaning up afterwards. Also many thanks to the yacht club for the beautiful fireworks show, and for the group that helped clean up the shells and debris on our waterfront afterwards. Thank you!!
