



Slicks, Scums, Bacteria and Blue -Green Algae

t the recent Yacht Club board meeting, there was some discussion / concern as to what all the warm rainless weather might mean regarding the lake. In the past, these conditions have resulted in some instances of perhaps unsightly and worrisome, but generally harmless, floating substances. So we thought we might talk a bit about the matter that is in the lake and how it may manifest itself with all the sun, heat, and lack of rain.

First, as we know from past years we will see material on the lake, especially on those early quiet summer mornings. Most of this consists of carcasses from insect hatches, tree pollens and other items that have blown onto the lake from the surrounding trees and fields, and bubbles that have been captured by plant oils and organics from decaying vegetation on the bottom that gets stirred up with boat traffic. Monday morning (7-9-12) was a good example of that with a string of little bubble mats with all the aforementioned components included. With sun and a little wave action this breaks up and either finds its way to shore or sinks in the depths.

However, in random shoreline locations, and only on very spotty occasions we may find little localized blooms of blue green algae. Blue green algae are ubiquitous in the environment, i.e. fresh water, marine, terrestrial, etc. and serve an enormous role in providing oxygen to

the atmosphere and converting gaseous nitrogen into forms that plants can use. In reality, they are not algae at all but bacteria that have pigments that can capture sunlight and do photosynthesis, thereby producing oxygen and using carbon dioxide. Although found everywhere, stagnant nutrient laden waters (farm ponds) and waters that receive lots of nutrient laden runoff, can provide an environment for massive reproduction and the creation of a bloom which is usually seen as a true surface scum (not the little slick or bubble mats we see commonly and described above), with a color that is usually tinted bluish green or may be reddish depending on the pigments in the cells. If they occur on our lake, this is an uncommon event but should be noticeable and quite different from the summer morning material on the lake. The ones we have seen are commonly restricted to a small area, visible only in the early morning, seem to follow a previous day's wind and wave action onto that shore line, and disperse quickly with sun and wave action in the lake.

Is there a safety issue with blue green algae blooms? Possibly, and in order to be safe, do not let your pets drink from a bloom or children swim in a bloom. Blooms are not normally an issue at Birch Lake, as we are a low nutrient lake, and have only been seen randomly and usually in late summer. With the unexpected heat, lack of



rain, and abundant sunshine, will this summer be different? Time will tell. Additionally, there is some evidence that the presence of zebra mussels has been associated with increased abundance of blue green algae, perhaps because they absorb other competing algae. We have zebra mussels, but they do not seem to be in the numbers as in years past.

So, with all that should we have concerns? Probably not, as these are rare random events at Birch Lake. However, should you see a real scum near your shoreline (not bubble mats, insect carcass mats, or foam), follow precautions until it is dispersed.



Sailing on Birch Lake -

MC Scows follow 400 year old Dutch tradition

Birch has a long and proud sailing tradition dating to the populating of the lake for recreational purposes. Our two sailing fleets are the Sunfish and MC Scow.

Scow comes from "schouw" ... flat bottomed boats that have sailed in Dutch waters for over 400 years. The schouw was popular due to shallow draft (depth required) with adjustable depth dual "leeboards" (daggerboards). This characteristic allowed the schouw to navigate the winding shallow waterways of Holland.

In the late 1890s a shallow-draft racing boat was introduced to England called the Half-Rater. Interest in racing small dinghies also began in the US and before long the two groups began racing



to test their boat building and sailing skills. The Massachusetts Bay Yacht Racing Association established classes ranging from 15 to 21 feet. The scow also found strong supporters in the inland lakes area of Wisconsin and Minnesota.

The Johnson Boat Works at White Bear Lake (MN) was one of the first to build scows, among others. The many builders were eventually eclipsed by Melges Boat Works, which remains the class builder today. The Inland Lake Yachting Association (ILYA), circa 1897, is the guiding force of modern development of the scow class.

Popeye the Sailor is a cartoon fictional character created by Elzie Crisler Segar and who has appeared in comic strips and animated cartoons in the cinema as well as on television. He first appeared in the daily King Features comic strip Thimble Theatre on January 17, 1929. Popeye also became the strip's title in later years.

Differences in Popeye's story and characterization show up depending upon which medium he is presented in. While Swee'Pea is definitively the ward of Popeye in the comic strips, he is often depicted as belonging to Olive Oyl in cartoons. The cartoons also occasionally feature family members of Popeye that have never appeared in the strip, notably his look-alike nephews Peepeye, Pupeye, Pipeye and Poopeye.

Even though there is no absolute sense of continuity in the stories, certain plot and presentation elements remain



mostly constant, including purposeful contradictions in Popeye's capabilities.

Though at times he seems bereft of manners or uneducated, Popeye is often depicted as capable of coming up with solutions to problems that (to the police, or, most importantly, the scientific community) seem insurmountable. Popeye has for example, alternatively, displayed Sherlock Holmes-like investigative prowess (determining for instance that his beloved Olive was abducted by estimating the depth of the villains' footprints in the sand), as well as scientific ingenuity (as his construction, within a few hours, of a "spinach-drive" spaceship).

Popeye's pipe also proves to be highly versatile. Among other things, it has served as a cutting torch, jet engine, propeller, periscope, and, of course, a whistle with which he produces his trademark toot. Popeye also on occasion eats spinach through his pipe, sometimes sucking in the can itself along with the contents. He seldom appears to use it to smoke tobacco or illegal substances.

Popeye's vastly versatile exploits are deemed even more amusing by a few standard plot elements. One is the love triangle between Popeye, Olive and Bluto (sometimes Brutus, or "Brutisk" as Popeye would say), and the latter's endless machinations to claim Olive at Popeye's expense. Another is his (nearsaintly) perseverance to overcome any obstacle to please Olive who, quite often, renounces Popeye for Bluto's dime-store advances. Finally, in terms of the endless array of villain plots, Popeye mostly comes to the truth by "accidentally" sneaking up on the villains, the moment they are bragging about their schemes' ingenuity, thus revealing everything to an enraged Popeye, who uses his "fisks" in the name of justice.



Mars, Saturn and Spica

This month is all about triplets. In the evening sky it's Mars, Saturn, and Spica, which are roughly the same brightness this month. They are in the southwest at nightfall and drop from view around midnight. The grouping is tightest at the end of the month. And in the morning sky it's Venus and Jupiter, the two brightest objects in the night sky after the Moon and Aldebaran, the brightest star of Taurus. They are bunched most tightly in the first half of the month, and are in the east at first light.

As twilight drains from the eastern sky this evening, a pyramid of bright stars fades into view: the Summer Triangle. The apex of the pyramid is Vega, the leading light of Lyra, the harp, about halfway up the eastern sky. Deneb is to its lower left, with Altair farther to its lower right. (I remember this by using the phrase "Altair is out there")

What else? Cepheus, the king, climbs into view in the northeast as darkness falls. The constellation looks like a child's drawing of a house, with a square of stars topped by a triangle. None of its stars is all that bright, so you need fairly dark skies to find it. But here at the lake we have that.

Lyra, the harp, stands halfway up the eastern sky as night falls summer evenings and climbs directly overhead around midnight. The little constellation contains one of the brightest stars visible from most of the northern hemisphere, Vega, at the northwest corner of the constellation.

Altair is the brightest star of Aquila, the eagle. In fact, the name means the flying eagle. The star is in the east at nightfall, at the lower right corner of the bright, widespread Summer Triangle.

The planet Venus is at its brightest for its current morning star appearance. It is well up in the east at first light, with the slightly fainter planet Jupiter directly above it.

At first light tomorrow, the Moon is well up in the east, with the small Pleiades star cluster a little to its upper left. The brilliant planets Venus and Jupiter stand below the Moon.



- 12 eggs
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 4 slices bacon
- 2 tablespoons finely shredded Cheddar cheese
- 1 tablespoon mustard

Directions

1. Place eggs in a saucepan, and cover with cold water. Bring water to a boil and immediately remove from heat. Cover, and let eggs stand in hot water for 10 to 12 minutes. Remove from hot water, and cool. To cool more quickly, rinse eggs under cold running water.

2. Meanwhile, place bacon in a large, deep skillet. Cook over medium-high heat until evenly brown. Alternatively, wrap bacon in paper towels and cook in the microwave for abo



microwave for about 1 minute per slice. Crumble and set aside.





Camp Tannadoonah

Surviving 100-degree heat!

AY for the cooler weather! We survived the 100+ degree weather up here at camp last week by doing lots of stuff in the lake, having water stations at all the sunny activities in camp, and encouraging everyone to drink a lot of water and Gatorade. We made it through the week without any campers having heat-related problems, and boy were we glad when that cooler breeze came in on Saturday evening!

This week at camp is International Week and we're pretty close to completely full, with 104 campers (capacity is 111). This week is also part of Super Week. This week for International Week, each cabin chose a country to represent on Sunday night. Most cabins chose real countries, but some came up with their own fictional nation. Then they all got to create a flag for their cabin to display in the dining hall all week. My personal favorite fictional country this week is Birchlandia, whose flag depicts a sailboat on the lake! That cabin is represented by none other than Miss Katie Luecht.

On Sunday evening the campers played Capture the Flag, and on Tuesday night we held an international fair, with booths from each of the cabins countries. Wednesday night was a camp "war" - the campers were divided into three teams, and played different games at each station: Water Balloon Battleship, Ball Wars, and Tug of War.


Thursday night every week we have something called Camper Council. Each cabin elects a representative, and they go to a meeting to determine a list of potential evening activities. Then they go back to their cabin and take a vote. The next day the Camper Council meets again to collect the votes and decide what the all-camp activity will be.
