



### — Sailing on Birch Lake —

### The Sunfish

Alcort was founded in 1945 by two carpenters named Alex Byran and Cortlandt Heyniger who built ice-boats as a side-job. After settling on the Sailfish design, the two men originally produced the small boats as either blueprint line drawings for the DIY (do it yourself) market -or- as a finished boat from Alcort.

The Sunfish was Alcort's second generation sailboat, a "user friendly" dinghy class which appeared early 1950s to replace the Sailfish. Like the Sailfish, the Sunfish sports a single sail set on a lateen rig (triangular sail attached to twin booms) with just two lines: the halyard (to hoist) and mainsheet (to control). In 1960 Alcort began selling fiberglass hulls and soon discontinued the original wooden version. By 1995 an estimated



quarter million Sunfish were in the US market.

Once upon a time, on an ordinary Sunday, the Birch fleet numbered 20-30 boats (more for regattas). At last count there were 60-70 boats on our lake in various states of disrepair. If we could get just half those hulls down to the water and apply a few cable ties here, some duct tape there ...

### Songs from the Seas ...

t's the 19th century. You're a young man seeking adventure and a test of your manhood. You decide to sign up on a ship to see exotic foreign lands. You take the trip to the coast. You find a big coastal town and you walk through the docks admiring the ships. Finally, you spot one that you like. You walk on deck and a tall man dressed in black coat confronts you. It's the captain.

"What do you want lad?"

"I want to sign on board sir", you say.

He looks you up and down, and says, "Aye. But first I need to give you a test."

You're not worried. You were expecting this and, in fact, hoping for it. You want to show the captain what you can do. After all, you were always the strongest out of all your friends. You could climb up any rock or tree since you learned how to walk. And you also knew a bit about navigation from your grandfather. You were eager to show what a great addition to the crew you'd make.

"How well can you sing?" the captain asks.

As we've already learned, sea shanties were work songs sung on ships during the age of sail. They were used to keep rhythm during work and make it more pleasant. Because these songs were used to accomplish a goal, rather then for pure entertainment, the lyrics and melody were not very sophisticated. Still, the songs were usually meaningful and told of a sailor's life, which included backbreaking labor, abuse from captain and crew, alcohol, and longing for girls and dry land.

A typical shanty had a call-and-response format. One sailor (a shantyman) would call out a verse, to which the rest of the sailors would respond in unison. The work would occur usually on the last syllable of the response or some other cue.

Shanties were divided into several categories, named after the work they were used for. The categories weren't set in stone and sailors would often borrow songs and change the melody and rhythm to suit their work. It seems the only rules regarding sea shanties were that the songs talking about life at sea were sung on the outward part of the journey, and songs talking about coming home and dry land were sung while the ship was homeward bound.

Here's today's, an Irish song. As always, versions vary, some bawdy, some less so...

Haul Away Joe

Naow whin Oi wuz a little boy an' so me mother toll me,

'Way haul away, we'll haul away Joe!
That if Oi didn't kiss the gals me lips would all grow mouldy.
'Way haul away, we'll haul away Joe!

An' Oi sailed the seas for many a year not knowin' what Oi wuz missin',

Then Oi sets me sails afore the gales an' started in a-kissin'.

Oi got meself an Oirish gal an' her name wuz Flannigan, She stole me boots, she stole me clothes, she pinched me plate an' pannikin.

Oi courted then a Frenchie gal, she took things free an' aisy, But naow Oi've got an English gal an' sure she is a daisy.

Oh, King Louis wuz the King o' France, afore the revolution, But the people cut his big head orf an' spoiled his constitution.

Oh, once Oi wuz in Oireland a-diggin' turf an' taties, But naow Oi'm on a Limejuice ship an' a-haulin' on the braces.

Saint Patrick wuz a gintleman, an' he come of daycent paypul, He built a church in Dublin town an' on it set a staypul.

From Oireland thin he druv the snakes, then drank up all the whisky,

This made him dance an' sing an' jig, he felt so fine an' frisky.

#### RECIPE FEEDBACK: BACON CHEDDAR DEVILED EGGS

ummm, deviled eggs!
Believe it or not, in all my years (which are significantly less than the recipe contributor, aka Patti Russworm (who by the way happens have a very significant birthday soon, please wish her a happy birthday!) have NEVER had the courage to make them myself! So deviled eggs have always been a delicious treat only enjoyed through the efforts of others.

Brilliant idea, I will make the "Barker Recipe" for deviled eggs! I mean, how hard could it be?? Besides, I needed to take an appetizer to the Vice Commodore's party. (Added bonus, I have all the ingredients, no need to go to IGA.)

Ok, let's get started.

Eggs in a pot, check. Cover with water, check. I am very proud to say that I followed the directions exactly er, well this is where it gets tricky.

The whole part about "cooling" and "peeling the eggs," perhaps was not explained in quite the detail it should have been. So, this is what I do ... I let them sit in a bath of cool tap water, even go as far as changing the water after 5 minutes, then decide, hmm, let me add some ice to hurry this little project along. Cooling in ice water this time, for about 10 more minutes. Ready to peel!

This is where it gets ugly. How can this be so hard?? There must be a trick! I go back to the recipe, did I miss something?? Nope, just says peel. Only 9 of the 12 eggs made it.



On to the filling! As I attempt to clear my mind of the whole egg peeling disappointment, I realize there is an obstacle; my cheddar cheese is not finely shredded. No problem, mini food processor to the rescue! I start to feel empowered and encouraged once again! (Hint: it also works to chop bacon! I am on my game!)



Continuing to relish my bright ideas and accomplishments, I think, what other rarely used kitchen gadget can I involve? Hand mixer. Ok, I am combining beautiful golden egg yolks, cheese, bacon, mayo and mustard. Wow, the hand mixer will blend it perfectly!

Yikes, not so brilliant. What a mess.



The bottom of the mixer selfishly refuses to release the mixture. There is a good amount hiding behind the blades. Yet another gadget is introduced, the rarely

used plastic spatula.

Yet I persevere! So with the



Food Network's "Barefoot Contessa" in mind, I decide to put this yolk mixture into a plastic baggy, clip the corner and very "prettily" fill the surviving eggs ... it only took me two baggies, what a mess! Such a shame to waste that golden deliciousness ... ok, some of it that oozed onto my hands was not wasted. (Note to self: buy name-brand baggies that the zip lock actually holds together.)

The finished product was a success!

In conclusion, I'd like to share a few things that I have learned:
1) Deviled Eggs are at their best when someone else makes them,
2) some kitchen gadgets are more pain than their worth,
3) just because you watch the Food

### Chocolate Chip Cheese Ball

"A sweet switch from the usual cheese ball. Serve with graham crackers or chocolate wafers

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 3/4 cup confectioners' sugar
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3/4 cup miniature semisweet

chocolate chips

■ 3/4 cup finely chopped pecans

#### **Directions**

- 1. In a medium bowl, beat together cream cheese and butter until smooth. Mix in confectioners' sugar, brown sugar and vanilla. Stir in chocolate chips. Cover, and chill in the refrigerator for 2 hours.
- 2. Shape chilled cream cheese




mixture into a ball. Wrap with plastic, and chill in the refrigerator for 1 hour.

### Solar storms flare in summer

he sun unleashed a huge flare on Thursday, launching a stream of electrically charged plasma in the direction of Earth at about three million miles per hour. When the solar storm struck our planet's magnetic field on Saturday last week, it produced a dazzling northern lights display that could be seen as far south as the northern United States.

Here are five key facts about solar storms:

- They start with an explosion equivalent to billions of nuclear bombs. A solar flare is a sudden explosion on the surface of the sun, releasing as much energy as a billion megatons of TNT, according to NASA. (By comparison, the atomic bomb dropped on Hiroshima was equivalent to, at most 0.017 megatons of TNT.) Most solar flares are accompanied by coronal mass ejections, huge streams of charged plasma that travel at millions of miles per hour.
- They can wreak havoc on elec-

tronics and power grids. These coronal mass ejections, when they strike the Earth, can cause moderate to serious geomagnetic storms, disrupting GPS satellites and knocking out power grids. The CME produced by a February 2011 X-class solar flare, the highest classification, disrupted radio communications in China. A 2008 report by the National Academy of Sciences found that a major solar storm could cause twenty times the economic damage of Hurricane Katrina.

- They make for dazzling northern lights displays. Geomagnetic storms can provoke intense displays of the northern and southern lights. Scientists say that the colorful, dancing auroras are seen at the poles of the Earth because the charged particles get trapped in the Earth's magnetic field and are then channeled along magnetic field lines.
- How dangerous they are depend on how fast they are moving. Studying the speed of high-energy

particles during powerful solar storms may help scientists determine their potential harm to people. Generally speaking, if they're slower, they'll deposit all of the energy into your body because they're not fast enough to fly right through.

■ They come and go in cycles. The frequency of occurrences of solar flares loosely follows an 11-year solar cycle. During periods of high solar activity, there could be several storms a day. When the Sun is less active, less than one flare a week could happen. The maximum Sun's activity cycle is expected to peak in late 2013.

Check out Venus and Jupiter in the eastern pre-dawn sky. The picture was stunning this week with the fingernail crescent moon right below. Venus is the lower, larger and brighter of the two planets. They both stand out well past 6:00am.

The show goes on day and night. And, as always, it's free. But donations are welcome.





may have seen Mr. Josh, our fishing instructor, wearing a beautiful blue and white bikini down at the waterfront!


