Safety Note: It's West Nile Season!

Mosquitoes in Elkhart County have tested positive for West Nile Virus, a potentially serious or even deadly infection that can be transmitted to humans.

Though the Health Department has confirmed that no local residents have reported infections this year, the virus has been detected in the area.

Symptoms of West Nile usually surface between three and 14 days after being bitten by an infected mosquito, which are more active around dusk and dawn. Most people who are infected don't show signs of illness, but up to 20 percent can have fever, headaches, body aches, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. About one in every 150 people infected will have a serious illness including coma, convulsions or paralysis. Recovery can last a few days to weeks. People over 50 years old are at a higher risk of severe illness, but protecting young children is just as important.

Anyone with severe symptoms should seek medical attention immediately.

Some ways to avoid West Nile:
• Use an insect repellent registered by the Environmental Protection Agency

- Wear long sleeves and pants when outdoors
- Install or repair window screens
- Eliminate places where mosquitoes breed by emptying standing water from flower pots and buckets
- Change water in pet dishes daily and replace the water in bird baths weekly
- Get rid of old tires or drill holes in tire swings so that water drains out





 $1/\overline{2}$ cup brandy

1/4 cup lemon juice

1/3 cup frozen lemonade concentrate

1/3 cup orange juice

1 (750 milliliter) bottle dry red wine

1/2 cup triple sec

1 lemon, sliced into rounds

1 orange, sliced into rounds

1 lime, sliced into rounds

1/4 cup white sugar (optional)

8 maraschino cherries 2 cups carbonated water (optional)

Directions

1. In a large pitcher or bowl, mix together the brandy, lemon juice, lemonade concentrate, orange juice, red wine, triple sec, and sugar. Float slices of lemon, orange and lime, and maraschino cherries in the mixture. Refrigerate overnight for best flavor. For a fizzy sangria, add club soda just before serving.

In the south, enjoy the Tea Pot formation of Sagitarius. Above and a little left look for the Tea Spoon. To the west of Sagitarius look for the great scorpion, Scorpius. (not Scorpio or Serpico)

As always keep a sharp eye out for meteors and flying

saucers. The Persied meteor shower will peak on Aug. 12, 13. Best viewing hours are after midnight when our portion of Earth is traveling headlong into the path of the comet debris that brings us the show. As for the flying saucers, the Vogon space parade is week after next, but there's always a few that get started early. Get out there and have some fun. Oops, sorry. I meant the show is free.

Olmpics Week at Camp T




