



Venus, earth's twin sister?

Going to work each day I'm treated to a stunning pair of planets in the predawn sky. Venus and Jupiter have been very prominent low in the eastern sky the past several weeks. It has been fun to watch as they closed in on each other and are now beginning to noticeably separate.

Venus is known as Earths' twin sister because of its similar size and proximity to each other.

Its atmosphere is made up mostly of carbon dioxide, thus trapping green-house gases that make the surface incredibly hot and dense.

Venus rotates so slowly that it orbits the sun faster than it can make one whole rotation on its axis. In other words, Venus has a longer day than year.

It takes 243 days for Venus to make a rotation.

And it takes 224 days for Venus to orbit around the sun.

Venus is the most widely explored planet aside from our own Earth. Numerous space probes have been sent to Venus to gather data and some have landed on the surface.

However, Venus is a hell-hole. Because its atmosphere is mostly made up of carbon dioxide and is hundreds of times more dense than Earth's, an Earthly pedestrian on the streets of Venus would be quickly suffocated by the lack of oxygen. His body would summarily be crushed by the extreme pressure that the atmosphere exerts. Anyway, it's cool to look at. Check out Venus in the eastern sky any morning this month. Jupiter is to the upper right and separating from Venus as we read. Get out there and enjoy the show.

Beer Burgers!!!

This recipe really calls for 4 beers. ½ cup for the burgers and 3 ½ to drink while preparing. Enjoy!

Ingredients

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/4 cup beer

Directions

1. Preheat an outdoor grill for medium-high heat

and lightly oil the grate.

2. Mix the ground beef, onion, garlic, Worcestershire sauce, salt, and pepper in a bowl.

Mix in the beer until absorbed by the meat

mixture. Form into patties.

3. Cook on the preheated grill until the burgers are cooked to your desired degree of doneness, about 5 minutes per side for well done. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read 160 degrees F (70 degrees C).

Birch Lake E. coli Testing - 2012

Before any details are provided, let us start out with the bottom line: There is no E. coli problem in Birch Lake as revealed by the latest testing. No, nada, nyet.

On Sunday (7/22/12) AM we collected triplicate samples from the same five sampling stations we have used the past few years. These stations are:

- 1. The public park, on the south side, just west of the boat launch that is used for swimming by a number of families without direct lake access.
- 2. In front of the Weesner cottage on the east side which is also near the sewer pumping station.
- 3. Adjacent to the Klappauf pier, on the east side, which is also about 40 feet from the stream entrance draining the wetlands.
- 4. The stream itself, also on the east side, that runs alongside of Klappauf's home and drains the wetlands. It should be noted at the time of sampling that the stream was not flowing into the lake and thus was a stagnant pool of water.
- 5. Adjacent to the swim crib at the camp (north side) since lots of bodies are swimming there daily. While all these bodies provide some opportunity for contamination, we also wanted to demonstrate safety and determine if there was a potential problem there for any reason.


E. coli counts are expressed as colonies per 100 ml of sample that form on a defined nutrient on a glass plate or slide at 48 hours at a defined temperature. The average for a single time testing on one site that would be the cutoff for swimming safety is 300 colonies per 100 ml of sample.

If 5 tests were done over a month's time at the same site that safety standard drops to an average of 130 colonies per 100 ml of sample. The standards are set not so much that the E. coli itself might be harmful, but that E. coli is used as a marker of other potentially coincident similar bacteria that could be disease causing or pathogenic. Thus, low E. coli counts are indicative of a low potential for other harmful bacteria.

Sources of the E. coli and thus of other potentially harmful bacteria are human or animal intestines which could enter our lake via illicit waste connections to storm sewers or roadside ditches, poor septic systems, sanitary sewer overflows, wild and domestic animal waste, and agriculture runoff.

In all past testing performed by your Yacht Club and/or it's Water Quality Committee, it has been demonstrated that the only defined potential source of high E. coli levels is the stream by Klappauf's from the wetlands. Subsequent specific testing of that E.Coli established that it was from non human animal.

Now for the numbers regarding this single time testing.

Average number of colonies for all lake sampling stations = 3.3

Thus, you might want to refrain from swimming in the couple of inches of stagnant water in the stream, but all other stations are either 0 or less than 5% (13/300) of the safe standard for swimming when the geometric mean is applied per the standard.

Camp Tannadoonah

Ahoy, Matey!

hoy, Matey! It's Pirate Week at Camp Tannadoonah this week, and also the last week of camp for the summer.

We kicked off the week on Sunday by making Pirate Flags, and playing "Cannonball Wars" on the Sports & Games field. Tuesday night we had cardboard boat races and canoe races. Wednesday night was a Treasure Chest hunt. And Thursday night we plan to serenade along the north and west shores of the lake.

In 2006 we finished the summer with 11 cabin counselors, and 7 other staff.

Our biggest camper week in 2006 had 68 kids; in 2012 we had 2 weeks over 100, and another 4 with over 90. In 2006, our smallest week had 31 campers; in 2012 our smallest week




had 64 campers (mini week).

We've added many activities over the past 7 years as well. These additions include: digital photo, bejeweled, low ropes, iron chefs, waterskiing, diving, science, volleyball, Japanese, lacrosse, basketball, Spanish, Latin Dance, archaeology, advanced sailing, soccer, guitar, art, fishing, and others!
