NEW NONINVASIVE SPECIES FOUND IN BIRCH LAKE

A new species, tentatively identified as a Crook Necked Ladder Fish, was taken on Birch Lake Wednesday August 15, 2012 by Anne Magro, daughter of Bill and Sheryl Magro.

Magro said she was trolling with a 30 pound Fluke lure on 500 pound test line when the big guy hit. She stated that "I didn't know what it was! As I reeled it in, it was so heavy, I began to think, "Is this a body? What will I do? Call dad? Drag it to shore?"

When the Ladder Fish cleared the water she was much relieved. The catch was snagged in about 90 feet of water at the center of the lake. Anne is pictured at right with her catch.

The 5-½ foot trophy can be observed on the Magro's dock, North Shore between Rodriquez and Russwurm's. Some wag suggested that the catch previously resided on a swim platform or other floating device. On the off chance that Sheryl got it right, the Ladder Fish may be retrieved from the end of Magro's dock. If not retrieved it is likely that Magro will mount it, despite the diffi-



Mars and Saturn

Sout at nightfall all month long, gracing the southwest sky after sunset. Mars and Saturn, although nowhere as brilliant as the morning planets Venus and Jupiter, still shine on par with the first-magnitude stars. In early August these two planets were very noticeable in a triangle with the sparkling blue-white Spica. (Remember



Statistics for Aug 24 Sunrise: 7:02am Sunset: 8:29pm Moonrise: 4:04pm Moonset: 12:43am Day length: 13h 27m how to find Spica? Follow the curve of the handle of the Big Dipper to Arcturis then continue the arc to Spica. Arc to Arcturis then speed on to Spica.)

Unlike the morning planets Venus and Jupiter, which are drifting apart, the evening planets Mars and Saturn were coming closer together during the first half of August. In fact, from around August 8 to 21, the celestial threesome fit within a single binocular field of view. Shortly after the peak of the Perseid meteor shower Mars, Saturn and Spica to lined up together in the evening sky.

Because Earth in its orbit is traveling away from slower-moving Mars and Saturn, these planets will continue to sink lower in the evening sky. At midnorthern latitudes, like here at Birch Lake, 11 pm local time and Saturn sets around 11:30 pm. By the month's end, that'll change to 9:30 pm for both Mars and Saturn. By September 2012, Saturn will set before Mars does.

Mars, the fourth planet outward from the sun and the next planet outward from Earth, travels more rapidly in its orbit than does slow-plodding Saturn, the sixth planet outward from the sun and the most distant world that you can easily see with the unaided eye. Hence, Mars' angular distance changes from 8 degrees west of Saturn in early August to 9 degrees east of Saturn by late August. For reference, your fist at an arm length measures about 10 degrees of sky.

I hope you got to see the waxing crescent moon join up with Mars and Saturn this past week on the evenings of August 20, 21 and 22.

August presents all five visible planets, although the planet Mercury is only visible for a few weeks, centered on mid-August. The other four planets can be seen all month long. Two planets Mars and Saturn adorn the evening sky. As for the morning planets Jupiter and Venus, there's no way you can miss them in the predawn and dawn sky. Venus and Jupiter rank as the thirdbrightest and fourth-brightest celestial bodies after the sun and moon. The third morning planet, Mercury, presents its finest apparition in the morning sky until December 2012.

Check it out both morning and evening. It's free you know.



Egg Cupcakes

Pre-heat oven 350 degrees


Ingredients:

12 eggs
½ lb Sausage (Brown & Crumble)
1 Green Onion (Chopped)
9 oz Box Frozen Chopped Spinach
9 oz Box Frozen Asparagus Cuts
¼ cup chopped banana peppers

¹/₂ cup shredded Sharp Cheddar Cheese Salt and Pepper to taste

Directions:

Thaw and squeeze water out of spinach and asparagus. (You gardeners can cook fresh). Whisk all of your eggs along with your desired amount of



salt and black pepper in a large bowl. Add remaining ingredients. Mix well.

Using a lightly greased muffin pan measure ¹/₄ cup of the mixture into each cup. Yields 24.

Bake the egg cupcakes for 25 minutes in a pre-heated 350 degree oven.


