Your Help is Needed!

The Sewer Department & Porter Township need your help! Please do not flush any type of wipes, diapers or feminine hygiene products into the sewer system. These items get tangled in the grinder pumps and in lift stations causing maintenance problems that could be avoided. Problems like this may cause replacing pumps or other mechanical parts which may necessitate increasing the maintenance rate. If problem causing items are not flushed into the system the cost of maintenance and thus the sewer maintenance rate may be maintained.

Safe tick removal

pring is here and the ticks will soon be showing their heads. Here is a good way to get them off you, your children, or your pets. Give it a try.

A School Nurse has written the info below — good enough to share — and it really works!

"I had a pediatrician tell me what she believes is the best way to remove a tick. This is great because it works in those places where it's sometimes difficult to get to with tweezers: between toes, in the middle of a head full of dark hair, etc."

"Apply a glob of liquid soap to a cotton ball. Cover the tick









with the soap-soaked cotton ball and swab it for a few seconds (15-20); the tick will come out on its own and be stuck to the cotton ball when you lift it away.

This technique has worked every time I've used it (and that was frequently), and it's much less traumatic for the patient and easier for me.."

Also, if you just pull a tick off, their heads sometimes break off and are left under the skin so this is much safer. Be aware also that a tick with a white speck on its back is a Deer Tick, these can cause Tick Fever so check yourself and your family good if you see any of these!

"Unless someone is allergic to soap, I can't see that this would be damaging in any way.

It's duck itch season

wimmer's itch, also known as lake itch, duck itch, cercarial dermatitis, and Schistosome cercarial dermatitis, is a short-term, immune reaction occurring in the skin of humans that have been infected by water-borne schistosomatidae. Symptoms, which include itchy, raised papules, commonly occur within hours of infection and do not generally last more than a week.

A number of different flatworm parasites in the family Schistosomatidae are what cause swimmer's itch. These parasites use both freshwater snails and vertebrates as hosts in their parasitic life cycles. Mostly waterfowl are used as the vertebrate host. During one of their life stages, the larvae of the parasite, cercaria, leave the water snails and swim freely in the freshwater, attempting to encounter water birds. These larvae can accidentally come into contact with the skin of a swimmer. The cercaria penetrates the skin and dies in the skin immediately. The cercaria larvae cannot infect humans, but they cause an inflammatory immune reaction. This reaction causes initially mildly itchy spots on the skin. Within hours, these spots become raised papules which are intensely itchy. Each papule corresponds to the penetration site of a single parasite.

The schistosomatidae that give rise to swimmer's itch should not to be confused with those of the genus Schistosoma, which infect humans and cause the serious human disease schistosomiasis, or with larval stages of thimble jellyfish (Linuche unguiculata), which give rise to seabather's eruption. Seabather's eruption mostly occurs in salt water, on skin covered by clothing or hair, whereas swimmer's itch mostly occurs in freshwater, on uncovered skin.

Since it was first described in Michigan in 1928, swimmer's itch has been reported from around the world. Some suggest incidence may be on the rise, although this may also be attributed to better monitoring.

Children may become infected more frequently and more intensely than adults but this probably reflects their tendency to swim for longer periods inshore, where cercariae also concentrate.

To prevent it, don't stand around in shallow, warm lake water. Staying out in somewhat deeper water and/or keeping moving such as when swimming, will usually prevent the parasites from getting you. When you or the kids get out of the water, towel off immediately



with a strong rubbing motion and then shower with soap and hot water.

Swimmer's itch typically clears up on its own within a few days, though in some cases the rash can last up to a week. In the meantime, you can control itching with over-the-counter antihistamines or anti-itch creams, such as those that contain calamine lotion. If the itching is severe, your doctor may recommend a prescription medication.

Orally administered hydroxyzine, an antihistamine, is sometimes prescribed to treat swimmer's itch and similar dermal allergic reactions.



1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper


1 teaspoon garlic powder

Camp Tannadoonah

Campers here this weekend

amp is nearly here! Our first group of campers arrive at camp on Sunday afternoon. This first week of camp is All Star Sports Week, and we have 74 campers registered for the session. We plan to have lots of different sports activities for the campers to try. Our current total number of campers (as of Tuesday) is exactly 500! That puts us a little bit behind last year at this time, but we are starting to see an uptick in sign ups this week, so I am confident we will keep pace pretty well.

This past week we have been training our staff and preparing camp for the first group of campers. I think that this year's staff is going to be one of our best ever! We've had a great week filled with lots of learning, and tons of fun.

I tried to mix it up with staff training this year, and we turned the entire week into The Amazing Race, Camp Tannadoonah style. On Sunday afternoon when the staff arrived, we divided them into teams and started off with a race around camp. They had to solve puzzles, create a team name and cheer, follow clues to various locations throughout camp, take photos, and learn a camp song and chant that we perform each week.

On Monday, we taught them the rules, procedures, and policies in the staff manual by playing Staff Manual Jeopardy! In the afternoon they worked on setting up activities in camp, and making plans and goals for their activities. Monday night the entire staff got certified in first aid and CPR.

On Tuesday we had another race around camp, during which they got to experience a variety of daily activities at camp, including crafts, low ropes, nature, Gaga Ball, drama, and dance. At each location, they had to perform a task similar to something that campers might do at that activity during camp. Tuesday afternoon we practiced waterfront emergency procedures. After dinner we played lots of games that we typically do during our evening activities, such as Capture the Flag, Ball Wars, Big Base, Ride that Pony, Honey I Love You, and Pterodactyl.


