
You will receive your first card at Stuart's. Drinks and snacks will be available.





Wild Week follows wild week!

hank you to everyone who came to the Pancake Breakfast last weekend! It was an awesome turnout, and we were so excited to see so many new AND familiar faces! We are so grateful to the lake community for sponsoring and attending this event to benefit camp.

This week at camp was Where the Wild Things Are week! We had a lot of interesting things planned for the week, including a "Wild Carnival Night" with face painting, dancing, carnival games, and karaoke. We also played "Capture the Wild Animals" (AKA Capture the Flag), and had a Wild Animal Hunt (counselor hunt).

On Wednesday afternoon we had a presentation by the Lake Milton Raptor Education Center. They brought out 5 wild birds of prey, including a Golden Eagle! It was so neat to see these animals, and some campers even got to pet the birds!

The camper numbers this week were quite low (only 59 kids!), but next week we have a completely full camp with 104 campers coming! We're super excited for a big week, because it's always more fun with more campers. The theme for next week is Sports Extravaganza Week.

It's looking like our numbers this year are going to come in lower than they were last year overall. We're about 35 kids behind last year as of this date, and in order to get to 700 for the summer we would need to be completely full for all 4 of our remaining sessions. I think we'll be completely full for 2 of them, but the other two are still wide open. Right now we're at 575 total, and my best projection is that we'll end up somewhere around 650 by the end of the summer.

The best way that you can help us for the rest of the summer is to help recruit kids! We have lots of openings still for Buggin Out Week (July 21-27) and Holidays Week (July 28-August 3), and there are a few openings left for Gypsy Week (August 4-10).

Before I forget! The week of July 28-August 4 is Holidays Week, and we are planning to Trick or Treat around the north/northeast and cove/northwest sides of the lake on Thursday night (August 2). If you're home, our campers will stop at your house to sing you a camp song and Trick or Treat. Turn on your porch lights (we'll be there around 7:30-8:30pm) if you want us to stop by.

Also, don't forget about the annual Hog Roast here at camp on July 27. We will be dedicating the new waterfront stairs, inducting two new Legend Tree nominees, and there will be lots of food and live music. The festivities are scheduled to start at 5pm this year. The event is free, but we ask people to bring a dish

mirates Team New Zealand has long history with the America's Cup. Team New Zealand first challenged in the 1987 regatta off Fremantle, Australia (where Dennis Connor won the Cup back from the Defending Ozzies). In the 1995 Cup off San Diego the "Black Magic" boats became just the second foreign Challenger to win the Mug. TNZ ran two Defense campaigns in 2000 and 2003 from Auckland, New

In 2013 the Kiwis are the only team surviving on corporate funding, with no billionaire patron to fund their (reputed to be) \$100 million Challenge. For this reason the boat is covered with more sponsor logos than her rivals. Over the last

few months their design team continue to install aero features to the 72' long 130' tall flying catamaran.

Though still early times in the Louis Vuitton Cup (LVC), aficionados think New Zealand has the boat to beat. Odds are the Kiwis will win the LVC Challenger selection series and in doing so earn the right to sail against Defender Oracle Team USA in the 34th America's Cup Match.





Life in the solar system

n all the universe, we know of just one world that hosts life: our own Earth. Yet right here in the solar system, several worlds seem to have the right ingredients for life. But it's likely to take decades to find out if anything inhabits those worlds.

The world that's intrigued us the longest, of course, is Mars. There's abundant evidence that it was once much warmer and wetter than it is today. Some of its water likely escaped into space, but a good bit of it is still around. It's frozen in the polar ice caps or in permafrost, or it's locked up in underground reservoirs.

It would have taken a long time for Mars to cool off and for its water to freeze or escape into space, though. So if life did arise on the planet, it would have had time to adapt to the changing conditions - and it could still be around today. Microbes could live below the surface, away from the Sun's harmful rays. And larger organisms could live in the underground reservoirs.

No one knows what the odds of finding life on Mars really are. Most biologists are pessimistic. But here on Earth, life can exist just about anywhere from the Antarctic ice to scalding vents at the bottom of the oceans to fissures in the rocks deep below the surface. So until we've had a chance to explore Mars in greater detail, few scientists are quite ready to give up on the possibility of life

on the Red Planet.

You don't really expect to find anything living inside a giant ice cube unless the ice cube is a moon of one of the giant planets. In fact, two ice moons one of Jupiter and one of Saturn are considered among the best candidates for life in the solar system.

The Jovian moon is Europa. It's bigger than our own Moon, and a lot more interesting. There's abundant evidence that an ocean of liquid water lies below its icv crust — the result of a tug-of-war between Jupiter and some of its other big moons.

Jupiter's gravity "locks in" Europa so that the same side of the moon always faces Jupiter. As Jupiter's other big moons pass by Europa though, they try to turn it away from Jupiter. That heats the moon's interior, melting some of its ice. The heat could also power geothermal vents like those at the bottom of Earth's oceans. These vents would pump out warm water and chemicals - providing a cozy environment for life.

The Saturnian moon is Enceladus. It's a lot smaller than Europa, but scientists don't have to wonder if it has liquid water — they know it does. Water squirts into space from hot spots around the south pole.

We don't know what the prospects of finding life on these worlds really are. But we do know that Europa and Enceladus appear to have the right





ingredients for life: water, an energy source, and the right chemistry. Now all we have to do is go and look for it.

Mars and Jupiter are deep in the glow of dawn this weekend. But look for Saturn in the southwest after dusk. The rest of the show is up there too. And yes, it's still free.



large onions ground meat (I prefer turkey!!) seasonings to taste (mine were like meatloaf tasting!!) tin foil


Directions:

Water Quality Annual E coli report

Those who have been following this subject during the past 5-6 years are aware that we have been testing the lake for E coli each year to ascertain the safety of our waters from a microbiological perspective. The decision to perform the testing was made in response to some initial concerns following the installation of the sewer system around the lake. This testing program was at first contracted out to a third party to ensure transparency and accuracy. However, for the past few years we have conducted the testing in house as it can be done more economically.

This test is only a screen to see if a problem exists that warrant further analysis. As with the original third party testing, our own testing since, and inclusive of this year's testing, we have identified no issue with E coli contamination of Birch Lake. We will further elaborate on this in the ensuing paragraphs, but for now enjoy the lake.

E coli is a natural part of the intestinal flora of warm blooded vertebrates and is extremely important to our intestinal health. Testing for E coli is an indirect way to test for fecal contamination in both drinking water and recreational bodies of water. One cannot test for all the possible bacterial species that may be present but E coli has proven to

be a good indicator species. High levels of E coli may be indicative of the presence of other potential pathogenic species that could cause illness should they be ingested while swimming etc. No body of untreated water, (i.e. Birch Lake), would be expected to have no E coli. Gulls, geese, ducks, swans, and runoff from dog, raccoon, and rabbit droppings will inevitably lead to some E coli, but very low levels that would not be a concern. We do not have cow or pig fields directly adjacent to the lake, we do not have septic tanks anymore, and our sewer system is intact. Hopefully folks are picking up their dog oob oob

The sampling this year was at the same locations as the last few years. Triplicate samples were collected from a kayak in about 2-3 feet of water. 5 ml from each sample was mixed with a nutrient medium (agar) containing foodstuffs that would cause E coli colonies to become purple/blue. The agar was plated out on petri dishes and incubated for 48 hours at 95 degrees F, and then examined for colony numbers. The samples from the only location which has contained objectionable levels of e-coli, the small stream leading into the lake at the NE corner, had it's usual high number of colonies which was well beyond



safety limits for swimming. This result, no different from past years, comes from the location where we have previously demonstrated genetically that this E coli is not of human origin (i.e. sewer etc). However, from the 12 other samples (3 each from four other sites), seven plates had no colonies and colony counts for the other 5 were way below safety limits. This included a site about 30 feet from the stream outlet and no colonies were demonstrated in all three of these samples, illustrating the dramatic dilution of the stream's e-coli upon contact with the lake. Thus, the data this year is consistent with past years and we do not have an E coli problem in the lake.
