
Your Help is Needed!

Turn your eyes to the southern sky

he Big Dipper hangs by its handle on summer evenings as though it were about to scoop up

a dipper-ful of stars. The handle is anchored by Alkaid, a star that's far more impressive than our own star, the Sun. It's bigger, heavier, brighter, and a lot hotter.

The key to all of those traits is the heavier business. Alkaid is about six times as massive as the Sun, which puts it in the top one percent of all the stars in the galaxy.

Like our Sun, Alkaid is in the prime of life, steadily fusing the hydrogen in its core to make helium, and releasing energy in the process. But heavier stars have stronger gravity, which squeezes them more tightly. That makes their cores much hotter, which in turn revs up the pace of nuclear reactions.

Energy from the core radiates outward through the star, pushing the layers of gas around it. A hotter core generates more energy, hence a stronger push, which causes the surrounding layers of hot gas to puff up. So Alkaid is more than three times wider than the Sun.

All that energy also heats the star's surface in the case of Alkaid, to about three times the temperature of the Sun. That makes the star shine blue-white.

And the combination of the star's hot surface and its great size makes

Alkaid extremely bright, hundreds of times brighter than the Sun. So even though Alkaid is a hundred light-years away, HDTV signals from it's solar system are difficult to receive yet it still shines brightly in our night sky at the tip of the Big Dipper's handle.

Look for the Big Dipper any night this summer high in the northern sky. Follow the handle down to the outer two stars of the bowl to draw a line north to the tip of the handle of the Little Dipper, the North Star (like Stan, not particularly bright). Here at the lake, away from the city lights, it's easy to find. Continue the line to find a lazy W shape, Cassiopeia, one of my favorites. To find our sun look low on the eastern horizon at daybreak or near twilight in the west.

Sorry about last week. But don't get used to this. With or without me the show is always free.


Watch for Perseids meteor shower


The Perseids are a prolific meteor shower associated with the comet Swift-Tuttle. The Perseids are so-called because the point from which they appear to come, called the radiant, lies in the constellation Perseus.

The shower is visible from mid-July


each year, with the peak in activity being between August 11–12. During the peak, the rate of meteors reaches 60 or more per hour. They can be seen all across the sky. As with all meteor showers, the rate is greatest in the pre-dawn hours.

This week is Holidays Week at camp, and it's a whirlwind through the calendar year. On Sunday night it was Valentine's Day, and we played "Capture my Heart" (aka Capture the Flag). Monday was St. Patrick's Day, and Tuesday was Easter. Tuesday morning we had Easter Eggs for breakfast, and an Easter Egg Hunt for evening activity.

Wednesday was the 4th of July, and we celebrated with a picnic on the dining hall lawn, followed by a 4th of July Carnival. Thursday we celebrated Halloween with a dinner-time costume party and trick-or-treating around the lake. Thanks to everyone who provided candy and treats for us! Friday we had Thanksgiving dinner, and then a Christmas Eve movie with cookies and milk in the dining hall. Finally, on Saturday morning we had Christmas morning.

Next week at camp is a really special week for Camp Tannadoonah. Every 5 years we have a special tradition called the Patteran. During Patteran years the theme for the last week of camp is always Gypsy Week. Throughout the week our campers and staff work on writing songs for each of the Gypsy Bands, they tie-dye bandanas to represent the colors of their Gypsy Band, and on Thursday night we all gather to search for the Patteran.

The Patteran is a time capsule that dates back to the late 1930s. Every five years we have a Patteran week, and we search for the location of the Patteran, then dig it up and examine all of the scrolls inside. On each scroll are the signatures of all the campers and staff who were present that year at camp, a log of what happened at camp throughout the week, and strips of cloth dyed in the colors of the Gypsy Bands.

Since it's also the last week of camp, we have our traditional end-of-the-summer Council Fire on Friday night. If you get your Barker before 8 pm on Friday, come on up to camp and join us for this last ceremony. We will have 15 candidates for the Order of Birch Award,



which is the highest honor that a camper can receive at Camp Tannadoonah. At the end of the Council Fire, these Order of the Birch candidates will read or sing an original poem or song, and they will then proceed through an Honor Guard of staff who have been a part of Camp for five or more year.

Following the Council Fire, we will all proceed to the Waterfront Stairs, where the campers will receive candles to carry to the waterfront. If you come out on your boats and wait near camp, you will see and hear us coming down the stairs. Once we are at the waterfront, we'll place our candles in the water and serenade all of the residents in their boats on the lake.

It's looking like we're going to finish the season with about 635 campers for the summer, approximately 70 short of last year's numbers (and well short of our goal). However, I think it was still a very successful season, and we provided a great camp experience for all of the kids!
