Now we only have our Labor Day Regatta which will be Saturday and Sunday, with Monday as a rainout date!! Hope to see everyone out there!





et's part company on a whimsical note. He hoped and prayed that there wasn't an afterlife. Then he realized there was a contradiction involved here and merely hoped that there wasn't an afterlife.


■ (My favorite) — That young girl is one of the least benightedly unintelligent organic life forms it has been my pro-





1.Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C).


2.In a shallow bowl combine crushed crackers, garlic salt and pepper; mix well. In a separate bowl beat eggs.

camper referral program.


