





Dealing with a 'stuffy' nose

ast week, I discussed runny noses, the treatment for which is antihistamines. This week, I will discuss stuffy noses, which require a different remedy – decongestants.

A nose becomes congested or stuffy when the blood vessels lining your nose become inflamed and swollen after being exposed to triggers like allergies and infections.

To stop this problem, you can go to the pharmacy and buy a decongestant. Decongestants work to reduce swelling of the blood vessels inside your nose allowing you to breathe easier.

The first way to unclog your nose is to buy an oral decongestant, like Sudafed® (pseudoephedrine) or Sudafed PE® (phenylephrine). Sudafed® is available behind the pharmacy counter and you must have your driver's license or state identification card to purchase it. Since people use Sudafed® as a starting material for methamphetamine production ("meth"), there are quantity limits for how much you can purchase in a time period set by state law (this is why we have to scan your ID). Due to Sudafed's use in the illicit manufacture of meth-

amphetamine, Sudafed PE® was developed. Sudafed PE® cannot be used to manufacture methamphetamine so you will find it in the regular pharmacy aisles with no quantity limits.

NOTE: There is a huge meth problem in Elkhart and Cass County. My pharmacy will not even sell plain Sudafed® because it has gotten so out of hand. We will only sell combination products like Zyrtec-D®, Claritin-D®, Allegra-D, Mucinex-D®, Alka-Seltzer Plus D®, and Advil Cold & Sinus®. These combination products contain the pseudoephedrine decongestant found in Sudafed® plus another medication.

A second way to treat a clogged nose is to buy an over the counter nasal spray like Afrin® (oxymetazoline). Afrin® is a great decongestant, but you can only use it for 3 days or else it will cause rebound congestion and make your congestion worse. Afrin® works great for short term congestion that will likely only last for a few days. If you have congestion that lasts for a week or longer stick to the oral options like Sudafed®, or Sudafed PE®.

The kicker to these oral and nasal decongestants is that they raise blood pressure. For those who already have high blood pressure, you should avoid taking these decongestants as they could raise your blood pressure even more! However, you're not completely out of luck—there are still options available for those with high blood pressure that will not further raise your blood pressure.

So, what do you for that stuffy nose if you have high blood pressure? You buy nasal saline like Ocean®/Neti Pot®, or use a humidifier. The biggest mistake I see people with congestion and high blood pressure making is buying Coricidin®. Coricidin® is a brand that never uses a decongestant in ANY of their products, so they can easily claim to be blood pressure safe (and they are!). Instead of decongestants, Coricidin® uses antihistamines and cough products. Since there is no decongestant in any of their products, none of their products will work effectively to unclog your nose.

In summary, decongestants are the medications that work to unclog a stuffy nose. If you have any questions or need further clarification please send me an email at dncarter8@gmail.com. STAR STUFF

ast week we talked about telescopes researchers use to study stars, planets, galaxies and neighbors. But are there telescopes that are used to study the Earth? We've all seen stunning photographs of Earth taken from space. So, where did they come from?

The Hubble perhaps? Probably not. The surface of the Earth is whizzing by as Hubble orbits, and the pointing system, designed to track the distant stars. cannot track an object on the Earth. The shortest exposure time on any of the Hubble instruments is 0.1 seconds, and in this time Hubble moves about 700 meters, or almost half a mile. So a picture Hubble took of Earth would be all streaks.

But there are tons of "spy satellites" orbiting earth in controlled orbits and they can provide some beautiful pictures of earth. Most recently I studied some shots of the Great Lakes and I felt compelled to do some research on the one most near us here at Birch Lake - Lake Michigan.

Did vou know...

Lake Michigan is the fourth largest freshwater lake in the world based on surface area. Only Lakes Superior, Victoria (in Africa), and Huron (but just slightly) are larger. Lake Michigan covers 22,278 square miles. It is 307 miles long and 118 miles wide at Petoskey, the widest point. Including islands, Lake Michigan's shoreline is 1,659 miles

Another way to measure lake size is volume. Lake Michigan has the fifth largest volume of any freshwater lake. Only Lakes Baikal (which is in Russia, is the world's deepest at one mile, and by itself contains a fifth of the earth's freshwater), Tanganyika (Africa), Superior, and Nyassa (Africa) are bigger. Lake Michigan contains about 1,180 cubic miles of water.

Lake Michigan has a maximum depth of 924 feet, with an average depth of 279 feet. Interestingly, this puts the deepest spot, located mid-lake near the Michigan coastal cities of Frankfort and Manistee, about 350 feet below sea level. This may seem quite deep, but actually Lake Michigan ranks far down on the list of the world's deepest lakes.

Winds blowing across a hundred or more miles of water can create large ocean-like waves, especially during fall or winter storms. Waves 20 or more feet in height on the open waters of the Lake have been recorded. These waves can create strong long-shore currents, stir up near shore bottom sediments, erode shorelines, and sink freighters. Petosky and most any east shore waterfront such as St. Joe, Muskeegan or Ludington are good places to watch huge storm waves overrun the breakwall and light beacon.

And finally, the question I most wanted an answer for: Is Lake Michigan tidal?

Strong winds or sudden changes in barometric pressure over different sections of the Lake can cause the surface of the Lake to literally tilt, piling up water against one shore and causing a corresponding drop on the opposite shore. This storm-induced tilting can be up to three feet high on Lake Michigan. When the storm abates, the tilt oscillates back and forth across the Lake for a long time before it is dampened by friction. This back and forth oscillation. kind of like water sloshing in a bathtub, is called a seiche. The time for a seiche to complete one back and forth oscillation can be from 30 minutes to several hours. Usually there is some kind of seiche action happening on the Lake,


although it is usually only about several inches in amplitude. Sometimes, people confuse seiche action with tides. Although lunar forces act on Lake Michigan's waters the same as they do on the oceans, because of its relatively small size, tides are almost imperceptible--only a fraction of an inch.

Now we know. Please allow me to reconstruct this tangential cul-



Michigan is barely tidal but can be seen from telescopic cameras on satellites orbiting Earth in space. Some satellites such as the Hubble, have powerful telescopes that can photograph stars and planets that we can see and a bunch of other stuff that we can't see. So there you go. Get up, look up and pay up. Oh, sorry. I forgot that the show is free. Next week - readers's choice.

<u>Ingredients</u>


- 1 large clove garlic
- 1 tablespoon coarse salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- 2 pounds large shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 8 wedges lemon, for garnish


Directions

Preheat grill for medium heat.

In a small bowl, crush the garlic with the salt. Mix in cayenne pepper and paprika, and then stir in olive oil and lemon juice to form a paste. In a large bowl, toss shrimp with garlic paste until evenly coated.

Lightly oil grill grate. Cook shrimp for 2 to 3 minutes per side, or until opaque. Transfer to a serving dish, garnish with lemon wedges, and serve.







Camp Tannadoonah

Just two weeks until campers arrive at camp for the first week of camp! Waterfront staff will be arriving at camp on June 4th for lifeguard training, and the rest of the staff arrive on June 8th for staff training. We'll spend the week going over policies, procedures, training exercises, and getting to know one another.

This year's staff is very experienced. Out of 24 cabin counselors, 17 are returning from last year's staff, 2 are returning from previous years' staffs, and just 5 are new to Camp T. So 80% of the cabin counselors have been on our staff before! It should make staff training much more productive!

This year, we also have a rental group staying at camp during staff training week. A group of high school students from the St. Joe South Bend Parish will be staying at camp at night, and going out to do community service during the day. One of the service groups will be staying at camp to do service for us, as well. We're excited to work with this new group of young people this year!

Our camp numbers are continuing to look great. As of Tuesday (May 27), we have 671 official registrations, which is a new record (at least as far back as I have data, which is about 22 years)! Four sessions are over 90 campers, and one session has a waitlist for girls. It's going to be exciting to see where we end up by the end of the

year!

Our construction projects are coming along. The shower house is nearly finished, and work is starting on the renovations of the adventure cabins. And the pier went in early, and the landscaping and drainage work at the waterfront is looking great! I can hardly wait for campers and parents and visitors to camp to see how nice everything is going to look when it's all finished!

The grounds at camp are starting to look really nice as well. Mr. Cullen, our facilities manager who started at camp last summer, has been working hard on mowing, trimming, adding mulch, and cleaning up sticks and branches all around camp.

If anyone is interested in helping to weed and maintain flower beds at camp, we could really use some extra hands! We've worked on beautifying various areas around camp over the past few years, and there are more and more flowers to keep track of now. Last year we had two wonderful lake volunteers who helped keep the beds cleaned up and free of weeds (Thank you, Judy and Marty!). If we can get a couple more people to help out, it would be much appreciated!






